The Union Station. The people of the Town have come to believe that the necessity for an Union Station grows stronger every day if of view. This was demonstrated on Monday night by the presentation to the Council of a petition signed by sixty-three of the heaviest ratepayers in Town, urging the immediate and earnest consideration of the subject, and such action as would be likely to accomplish most promptly the desired end. Hitherto the people have held aloof, and all the efforts that have been put forth for securing an Union Station have been made by the Council with but an imperfect known to fight. Union Station have been made by the Council with but an imperfect knowledge of the ratepayers' opinions on the subject. It would not be asserting too much to say that time and reflection have made converts, and that many of those who saw nothing good or useful in the project a few months ago hold a different belief now. The names of some influential proselytes were on the list to which we have referred. Thus seconded the Council may take up the subject with earnestness and prosecute it with vigour to one conclusion or the other. Their negotiations have been hitherto fruitless further than that they have put Messrs Swinyard and Brydges in possession of the knowledge that a station in Guelph at which the Great Western and Grand Trunk trains should meet would be very

One thing is certain, that if an agree. ment for the erection of this station is to be accomplished there is but little time to MONEY LOST—\$10 REWARD. doubt that the contractor of the W. G. & B. Railway will begin work early in spring, and unless the Council can previ-ously perfect arrangements between the Grand Trunk and Great Western, then farewell forever to all hopes of an Union farewell forever to all hopes of an Union Station. The station of the latter will certainly remain where it is, but it is not equally certain that the passenger station of the former will not be moved for the better accommodation of the traffic from the north. Every consideration of local and personal interest urges the Council and the citizens to take prompt and affin.
