HAMILTONIANS WILL DECIDE

Whether the City Shall Purchase the Street Railway

Or Extend the Franchise for Fifteen Years—Vote to Be Taken on July 27—An Ancaster Man Suggests to Receive the Cat-of-Nine Tails—Hamilton News.

Hamilton, Ont., June 28.—The city fathers at tonight's adjourned meeting of the City Council succeeded in coming to a conclusion in regard to the question of submitting the Street Railway proposal to the people. Last evening at the adjourned meeting the aldermen had under consideration the three-pley question prepared by Ald. Montague to night. Nothing more was heard of his proposition. Evidently Ald. Carscallen had profited by it for he submitted the following amendment to the questions recommended by the Finance Committee: 1. Shall the city purchase and operate the Hamilton Street Railway? 2. If the city does not now purchase the Hamilton Street Railway, should the council extend the franchise of the company for 15 years, that is until 1953? Ald. McAndrew moved his amendment to provide that those who voted the municipal elections should be eligible to vote on the second question. Such a plan was thought inoperative, and the amendment was defeated by a vote of 12 to 10. Ald. MacLeod then moved to refer the clause back to the committee. It was lost by 8 to 11. Eventually the committee's report was agreed to by a vote of 12 to 7.

Granted Free Water. There was a long discussion over the proposal to grant the stock yards protectors free water. Ald. Stewart and Montague moved that the company be given free water for three years, from July 1. The proposal was agreed to by a vote of 11 to 8. The supply will be under the control of the city engineers. The water will be kept in a 15,000-gallon tank, which will be filled only at night. Those who favored free water were: Ald. McDonald, Lester, Hobson, Montague, Findlay, Messer, Hill, Nelligan, Fearside, Peterson and Stewart.

The bylaw for raising \$60,000 by debentures to build four trunk sewers was given two readings. It will be submitted to the ratepayers on July 27. On motion of Ald. Fearside, the resolution passed on April 12 removing the Victoria-avenue scales to the corner of Cannon-street and Ferguson-avenue will be reconsidered at the next council meeting. Ald. Lester gave notice that he would move the next meeting a resolution to the effect that in employing any foreman or workman on the public works in the city, no distinction be made between union and non-union men, but that all competent workmen permanent residents of the city be eligible for employment.

THAT MURDEROUS TRAMP.

County Crown Attorney Mages Wants a Big Reward Offered.

Suggests Also That the City Should Make a Substantial Grant to the Dead Policeman's Family—The Fugitive Seen Near Alvinston—Shot at Two Constables—Is He Near Oil Springs?

London, Ont., June 28.—There is considerable talk on the street to-day regarding a reward for the man who captures the murderer of Police Constable Tooby. I think a reward should be offered, \$500 at the very least. There are many county constables in Middlesex who might be induced to aid in the search provided there were prospects of some remuneration, but as they have no guarantee that they will receive anything they hesitate.
