SUICIDE OF FRANK NEWSOME

A Much Respected Toronto Family Plunged Into Deep Distress—The Act Was Committed in Detroit.

Detroit, Mich., June 28.—Frank Newsome, a traveling man for Newsome & Co., law and commercial stationer, going business at 37 Adelaide-street, Toronto, committed suicide by shooting himself in the head in the Hotel St. Claire last night. He was about 25 years old. He registered at the St. Claire Sunday evening. He appeared to be under the influence of liquor then. He was not seen around the hotel much yesterday. The body was found by James Campbell, a porter of the hotel, at 11.30 P.M. He was lying on the floor, clad in a night shirt. The revolver had been held very close to the right temple. The bullet had passed through the brain and out at the top of the head. No note, letter or anything was discovered in the room or among the effects which could throw any light upon the motive of the suicide.

HOIST IN THE BRICKBOX

Architect Lennox, Alderman McMurrich, Mr. Brown and the M.P. for East York went the upward journey of two hundred feet on the outside of the tower of the new municipal buildings yesterday afternoon. The aerial voyage, as the reporter would term it, was made in a box used for elevating brick, at the end of a wire rope, and occupied nine minutes. The sensation was at first somewhat creepy, but gradually became a matter of course as they began to creep over the edge of the box, like kittens in a nest, to admire the stone walls, the carvings, the tiles of the roof, the tower, the gargoyles, and then the clock opening of 22 feet. When the box is up ten feet above the top it takes a minute to swing the arm of the crane in over the wall and to lower the box on to the platform of most anxiety to the uninitiated.
