Had a Talk With Mr. Tarte About the Harbor. MR. MULOCK ALSO PRESENT

DEPTH OF FOURTEEN FEET NECESSARY ALL ALONG THE FRONT.

Mayor Shaw, Mr. A. B. Lee, Mr. Fullerton, Mr. Kemp, Mr. Barlow, Cumberland and Messrs. Clarke, Bertram and Maclean, M.P.'s, placed the matter strongly before the Ministers and got satisfactory promises.

THE POLICY HOLDERS MET

It is Proposed to Keep Down the One-Man Power in the Canada Life.

MR. RAMSAY SETTLES ONE POINT

An Organization Elected for Wentworth County-General News of the City.

Hamilton, Feb. 21.—(Special.)—A well-attended meeting of Canada Life policy-holders was held this evening in Association Hall. Samuel Barker occupied the chair, and in opening the meeting explained again that the policy-holders were not concerned about the headquarters of the company, or the annual meeting being held in Hamilton.

They sought protection by depositing any one-man power on the board, by the re-negotiation of the clause limiting the voting power of one holder to 40 shares.

Mr. Barker asked that he write to President Ramsay to ask him about the truth or falsity of rumors that a friend of one of the directors had received a loan of \$800,000 and that a director was indebted to the company for \$200,000.

Mr. Ramsay's reply was that no director of the company was, or had been, indebted for the sum of \$200,000.

The meeting adopted the constitution, forming a Policy-Holders' Association for Wentworth County, and elected the following officers:

Samuel Barker, chairman; John Knox, vice-chairman; George E. Bristol, W. E. Cillard, A. Turner, Dr. A. B. Osborne, J. J. Scott, S. C. Mewburn, P. D. Cramer, H. Wright, W. A. Wood and J. J. Cramer, executive committee. The committee will appoint the secretary-treasurer. The meeting also resolved to apply to the company for a complete list of policy-holders, to amend the Dominion Parliament for an act to amend the Companies Act, in a number of important particulars, and to proceed with the organization of policy-holders all over the county.

LOUBET'S FIRST MESSAGE.

The Fidelity of France to the Republic Proved by the Transmission of the Message of Power.

CHAMBER OF DEPUTIES CROWDED. The Message Was Greeted With Bravas and the Senate Also Gave Approval.

Paris, Feb. 21.—President Loubet, in his message, submitted to both Houses of the afternoon, said the regular transmission of power to the President proved France's fidelity to the Republic, at a time when certain misguided persons were seeking to shake the confidence of the country in its institutions. The President dwelt upon the necessity of appesment, union and respect for the essential organs of society, Parliament, the magistracy, government and the national army. He concluded with a ringing appeal for the Republic, which he asserted, assured liberty and peace had founded a great colonial empire and had conducted alliances and precious friendships.

The Chamber of Deputies was crowded when M. Loubet's message was read. It was greeted with bravos. The House adjourned until Friday.

The Senate received the message with similar approval, and passed the credits demanded to defray the expenses of the funeral of the late President Faure.
