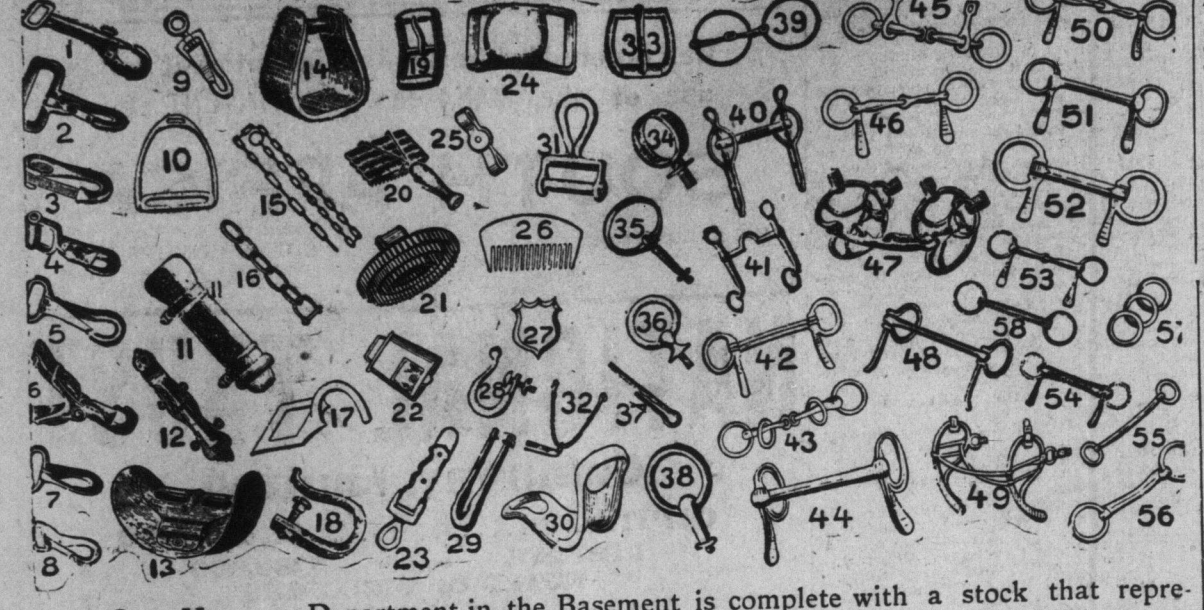

Powers Exchanging Despatches.

London, June 6.—The Berlin correspondent of The Daily Chronicle says: "An official circular is believed to be in the hands of the British and American governments regarding the appointment of a single commander for the united European and American squadrons.

French and Belgians Suffered.

The Daily Mail has the following despatch, dated yesterday, from Shanghai: "Later reports from the front show that no British or American missionaries were among the refugees who escaped from Pao Ting Fu district.

The Action of the Cosacks.

According to a special despatch from Shanghai the Cosacks were dispatched to the rescue of the Belgians after a stormy interview between the Belgian Minister, Baron de Vinck de Deux Orp, and the members of the Tung Hsi Yamen. The despatch says also:
