For More Than 20 Years in Lonely Egg Rock Lighthouse off Lynn, Mass. — Stories of Her Vigilance, Resourcefulness and Brav-

The Her Credit, Many Unrecorded—Some Stirring Scenes Witnessed."

"Miss Ada M. Foster, the Grace Darling of Massachusetts, who spent twenty-two years of her life as an assistant guardian of beacons on the coast of Massachusetts bay, during her life devoted to noble work in the service of Uncle Sam, performed many acts and was perhaps responsible for the saving of many lives.

"Many of her bravest deeds will never be known. Her life was given up from the age of fifteen years to the warning of travellers on the sea highways of perils on the coast.

"It is barely a fortnight since she died in the Massachusetts General Hospital, at the age of thirty-six. 





Constantinople, Jan. 19—Bulgaria has sold to Turkey, according to an authoritative report, 200,000 Mauser rifles which the Bulgars captured from the Turks during the war.

A Story of the Boer War

Brigadier-General J. E. Gough, in a lecture at the London University, on "Counter Attacks,' 'emphasized the value of suddenness and flerceness in a counter-attack, and the danger of pushing it too far. He quoted, as a good example, in British history of a successful counter-attack, a charge at Wagon Hill in the Boer War. For about ten hours the opposing sides were entrenched within a distance of from fifteen to fifty yards of each other, and fierce firing took place. No successful charge could be made, for only a small party could hear the officer give the order, and in every case they were shot down as soon as they got to their feet. It was facing certain death. But 230 men of the Devon Regiment came up unobserved by the enemy, and were deployed quietly. Everything was explained to them, and when the order was given they suddenly topped the rise, raced across the few score yards, and the Boers vanished.

STARVATION WAGES Some very interesting facts have been brought out by what is called the "sweated trades exhibition" in London. with the introduction of stronger li-The Trades Boards Act was enacted to quors came conditions which have caus-The Trades Boards Act was enacted to enable the authorities to deal with sweated industries, and ensure a measure of relief for those working under bad conditions at miserably paid handicrafts. At the exhibition in Caxton Hall, London, the conditions were illustrated by the conditions were illustrated by the conditions which have caused the beginning of a vigorous crusade. Some considerable time ago the French government assumed the expense of having posters distributed through the country telling of the evils resulting from the use of alcoholic liquors. More trated by women seated at tables around vigorous efforts are now being used to the room, engaged in the work in which they ordinarily engaged and for which they received a mere pittance in wages. For example, one woman making a garment for boys got ninepence for each dozen pair, and by working ten hours a day she could earn from nine and sixpence to eleven shillings a week. twelve hours a day, earned eight shillings a week. A match box maker could earn ten shillings by a very hard week's work. Women workers in the sugar, confectionery and food preserving trade received about seven shillings and sixpence per week, and those in the teapacking trade from seven shillings and sixpence to sixteen shillings. Many women in Lancashire made umbrella tassels, thereby earning seven shillings per week.
