

HEAVY DEMANDS

London, Aug. 1-The allies in their emands presented to the peace conference today, proposed the establishment of a frontier standing east from the Struma river, running midway through

Struma river, running midway through Rumelia, and reaching the Aegean Sea. sixteen miles west of Dedeagatch.

This would leave Bulgaria a coast line on the Aegean Sea of less than thirty miles. If these drastic terms are accepted Bulgaria will issue from two wars a little larger than when she entered into them, but she will have to abandon a large amount of territory to Roumania. In addition, the allies maintain their demand for an indemnity.

It is probable that the negotiations will be protracted and that the armistice of five days will be renewed. No objection is likely to be raised to its renewal, for it seems evident that both the Servians and the Greeks have fought themselves to a standstill.

A despatch to the Daily Telegraph from Belgrade asserts that the casualties of the Servian army in the past month of fighting aggregate nearly 35,000.



Thousands of nests of the brown-tail have been allowed to develop in the state, and they are found in elm trees as well as in apple trees.

The conditions which exist in Bangor this summer may exist in St. John a year or two hence. It is therefore of the utmost importance that every effort should be made to discover and destroy the nests of the brown tails wherever the local point in the state, and they are found in elm trees as well as in apple trees.



NEW MUSEUM FOR LONDON

Medical Science From the Earliest Times To the Present

An historical medical museum of ex aordinary completeness and range o subjects, and officially connected with the forthcoming international medical congress, has been organized by Henry S. Weilcome at 54A, Wigmore street, W. London.

On the occasion of the opening ceremony an interesting historical address, outlining the evolution of medical science from the earliest times, was delivered by Dr. Norman Moore, president of the section history of medicine of the congress, who acted as chairman of the proceedings and formally opened the museum.

of the proceedings and formally opened he museum.

Doctor Moore reviewed the growth of museums and drew attention to the fact that in England their inception had been always the work of private individuals maided by government grants. To this excellent precedent the historical medical museum was no exception. It was a fresh example of the same spirit, but novel, in that a museum illustrating the nistory of medicine had never before each attempted in England. Dr. Moore lescribed some of the principal exhibits, which, ranged on the three floors of the museum, include illustrations of medical and surgical treatment by the same grant of the museum, include illustrations of medical and surgical treatment by the savage races of today up to the latest developments based on scientific research into causes and prevention and cause of, for example, sleeping-sickness, malaria and other scourges of mancind.

A vote of thanks to the chairman for his address was proposed by Sir Thomas Barlow, Bart, who fulfills the double role of president of the Royal College of Physicians and also president of the congress, and who expressed appreciation of the high educational value and importance of the collection. It was seconded by Sir Frederick Treves, Bart., who referred in eloquent terms to the progress of medicine, and said that it would be hard to exaggerate the service this museum will render to that great rause.
