

Cettinje Montenegro. Oct. 8-Montenegro declared war on Furkey this morning. The declaration of war was delivered to the Porte by the Montenegrin charge d'affairs early today. Heavy fighting is in progress along the frontier.

Montenegro, which, this morning's cable-grams say has declared war on Turkey, has a population considerably less than that of the city of Toronto. Its people's main occupation is agriculture. The capital, Cettinje, has a population of less than 10,000 and a garrison of about 600 men. Nearly every man is a trained soldier, but although they are stout fighters, and although their heroism in defence of their even country has on former occasions exeited the admiration of the world, Montenegro alone is not big enough to acceptable much.
