



Russian Aggression in Asia.

Khelat, on the north-eastern border of Persia, has peacefully passed into the hands of Russia, which by this latest acquisition has made a very decided advance towards the frontiers of British India. Now the easier and more direct approach by way of Khelat will place Herat and its tributaries completely under the influence of Russia. The Russophobists, however have no need for alarm. The policy of conquest adopted by Russia in Eastern Asia is a natural one, especially as Great Britain curbs her at the Dardanelles. The Russian advance toward the Indies may of course some day furnish. Dardanelles. 


