8. The Executive Committee may allow a mistake in an entry to be corrected, when satisfied that no fraud was intended.

9. Where foreign-breds are not penalized as such, 5 lbs. will be allowed to horses bred in Canada, except in races exclusively for those horses.

10. Mares allowed 5 lbs.; geldings, 3 lbs.

11. Horses whose numbers are up and who are not at the post for a race at the time indicated

on the card, will be sent for and the trainer fined \$5. After a lapse of five minutes, and the horse not then being in the starter's hands, the Committee at their discretion may rule off the horse and all connected with him ; in which case fifteen minutes interval will be allowed.

12. First bugle, for saddling and to clear the course, will sound at the Judge's stand fifteen minutes before the time appointed for the start. Second bugle will sound in the paddock five minutes before the start, which will take place punctually at the time fixed.

13. If a jockey dismounts before obtaining permission he shall be fined, and his horse may be disqualified.

14. After a race, the first three horses, each accompanied by owner, trainer and one attendant, will be ridden into the Judge's paddock, and there unsaddled, and the gate will be kept closed till "all right" is declared by the clerk of the

15. For any protest made after a race, which may be adjudged by the Committee to be frivolous or wilfully misleading, a fine of \$5 will be levied on complainant.

American Rule 51. "Every Jockey must be weighed for a specified horse not less than twenty minutes before the time fixed for the race, and the number of the horse shall be exhibited as soon as possible." Any jockey guilty of an infraction of this rule will be fined.

N.B.—The Committee will take no cognizance of bets made with a bookmaker or otherwise before the completed official list of starters

is hoisted, and visitors are cautioned against such bets. Should a horse be withdrawn or added after the numbers are up, new books will be ordered, and the race will be postponed fifteen minutes, of which notice will be given by a crier, and by the hoisting of a bulletin board in the enclosure. Provided, however, that if the Committee are of the opinion that the horse added or withdrawn does not affect the betting, bets stand, and no delay shall be authorized.

In the case of a race, for which entry was made during the meeting, a horse must start unless struck out thirty minutes before the time appointed for the race. And in all other races (American Rule 49) the intention to start a horse and his jockey's name, must be signified to the clerk of the scales not less than thirty minutes before the time appointed for the race.



10. A jockey dismounting without permission shall be fined, and his horse may be disqualified.

11. Any rider appearing in wrong colours will be fined \$5.

12. Jockeys after mounting in the paddock must pass the grand stand in the preiiminary canter in their correct colours and numbers before each race.

13. Only half of first money for a walk over.

14. In selling races half of the surplus over the entered price shall go to the owner of second horse and half to the Club. Beaten horses are not claimable.

15. A qualified hunter is a horse certified by the M. F. H. to have been regularly hunted in 1894 or 1895 with some established pack of hounds.

16. Schooling over the steeplechase course is strictly forbidden. Suitable jumps are provided on Club grounds for such purpose.

17. The Executive Committee may allow a mistake in an entry to be corrected, when satisfied that no fraud was intended.


