BOYS' HOME.

TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL REPORT.

The annual meeting of the lady managers and patrons of the Boys' Home took place on Tuesday, the 6th February, 1883, at the Home on George Street. Among those present were the Hon. G. W. Allan, Professor Daniel Wilson, Mr. S. H. Blake, Col Gzowski, Rev. Mr. King, Rev. Mr. Sweeny, Mr. Robert Walker.

Mayor Boswell occupied the chair, and the Rev. Canon Dumoulin opened the meeting with prayer.

Professor Wilson then read the Twenty-third Annual Report, as follows :

The Lady Managers of the Boys' Home beg to lay before their friends and the public, a report of the work done in the institution during the year just ended.

The total number of inmates during the past year, including those in residence on the 1st January, 1882, was 154. Of these 41 were removed by their parents, 30 were sent to situations, 10 absconded, 2 were sent to the hospital and 1 died, leaving the large balance of 70 boys still resident in the Home.

Of the 30 boys sent out to situations, 20 have proved satisfactory and have been bound to their employers till they are 18 years of age, 5 were returned to the Home, not being found suitable, and 5 are still on probation.

There are, therefore, now no less than 55 boys in different parts of the country serving their terms of apprenticeship with farmers, and the Managers endeavour by regular and careful enquiry to assure themselves that these absent children are being well brought up and kindly treated. During the last year three of these lads fulfilled their terms of service to the satisfaction of their employers, and are receiving the money which the Managers have in trust for them, as they require it. A short

time since one young fellow who had been given out for adoption six years ago, came to town and called to see the Managers. His bright, healthy and respectable appearance spoke more plainly than words of the careful training and kind treatment he had received since he left the Home.

The health of the children has been wonderfully good during the past year, notwithstanding the many drawbacks in the way of defective drainage, bad ventilation, and imperfect heating of the building. The Managers are, however, much rejoiced to be able to state that they trust these complaints in regard to the condition of the Home are being made for the last time. For the last four years the necessity for thorough repairs and additions to the present house, or, better still, a completely new building, has pressed heavily upon the committee, but the work of raising from \$22,000 to \$25,000 (the sum required) seemed so formidable that it was deemed expedient to let the matter rest until the way was made clearer for the commencement of so arduous an undertaking. The Managers are truly thankful to report that, having received from Mr. William Gooderham the very munificent and voluntary contribution of \$5,000, as a start to their Building Fund, they took courage to open their subscription books. Other large voluntary donations rapidly followed, as will be seen in detail annexed to the Treasurer's statement, and the additional sums which have since then been solicited and promised, quite warrant the Managers in making all arrangements for the commencement of the new building in the spring. They do not, however, contemplate beginning active building operations until subscriptions for the full amount that will be required to complete the work have been secured. The present intention of the Committee is to build the new Home at the north end of their present property, in a thoroughly plain, but substantial manner, well drained, well appointed, and with all such modern improvements as are suitable to institutions of a like character in large cities.

In referring to the many disadvantages under which they have laboured during the past year, on account of the imperfect machinery of the Home, the Managers desire to state that it

is to the constant and untiring efforts of their excellent Matron, Mrs. Munro, that they are entirely indebted for the cleanly and healthy condition in which the premises have been kept, especially during the trying summer months. They would also, in this connection, gratefully acknowledge the many pleasant trips by water afforded to the children, by the Captains of the local steamers, during the summer, to the parks in the neighbourhood of the city. These excursions were a source of unfailing delight to the boys, as well as a most health-giving recreation. Mrs. Arthurs still has charge of the school, which is conducted in the Home, and under her careful and efficient teaching the boys continue to make good progress.

The Managers acknowledge their indebtedness to Messrs. Kilgour and Bruce, who, with several ladies, kindly undertake the religious instruction of the children on Sundays, and they feel particularly grateful to Mr. Brush, who not only conducts the singing in the Sunday School, but also gives the boys further instruction one evening every week.

The Treasurer's statement of account will be found as usual annexed, and in thanking the public generally for the liberal support they have accorded to the Institution during the past year, the Managers would especially acknowledge the handsome bequest of \$500 under the will of the late Mr. S. B. Smith, \$100 from Col. Gzowski, \$50 from Mr. S. Alcorn, and \$50 from Mr. J. Leslie.

To Dr. Thorburn, who has been the faithful friend and physician of the Home ever since its foundation, and still continues to attend the inmates gratuitously, the Managers feel they owe a large debt of gratitude. They would also offer many thanks for the constant supply of provisions which they have received weekly from the butchers and other dealers in the city, and for the very bountiful supply of good things that poured in at Christmas time from the public generally. Grateful acknowledgments are also due to those ladies and gentlemen who so kindly provided the Christmas tree and assisted at the delightful entertainment given to the children on Christmas night.

The Managers feel they cannot close this their twenty-third

annual report without referring with deep and heart-felt sorrow to the great loss which this Institution has sustained in the death of Mr. James Michie, its warm friend and supporter through all these twenty-four years. His last kind act to the Home was the generous donation of \$1,000 towards the new building fund. His ready, substantial assistance and warm sympathy with this work of charity will be sorely missed by the Managers, whose hands he thus strengthened in their labor of love. He was at the Home for the last time on Christmas day, helping at the children's dinner. Christmas will hardly seem like Christmas at the Boys' Home without their good friend.

In conclusion, the Managers can only pray that the blessing of God may be with them in the coming year, and that He will prosper the work which they have in hand.

MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT.

Dr. Thorburn then read his annual report.

In presenting this my twenty-third annual report of the health of the inmates and sanitary condition of the Home, it affords me much pleasure to inform our friends that there have been only two severe cases of sickness among the boys during the past year, one of which I regret to say, proved fatal within a few days after his admission. Prior to his entrance he had suffered much from cold, hunger and fatigue, and notwithstanding every care and attention was given him he succumbed to his disease. The other boy was afflicted with congenital heart deficiency and his general health impaired, and his mother removed him contrary to my advice. There were a few other cases of slight ailments, all of which yielded to treatment, and are now enjoying good health.

I cannot too earnestly entreat our friends to exert themselves to procure a more suitable building for the boys—the present one is wanting in many respects—badly drained, badly ventilated—difficult to heat and without proper accommodation to separate the sick children from those who are well.

In conclusion I wish to express my thanks to the lady manager, matron and all others connected with the Home, for their unceasing kindness and attention at all times.

This resolution was adopted.

It was moved by Professor Wilson and seconded by the Rev'd. Dr. King, That this meeting recognizes the necessity of a new building for the Home, congratulates the Managers

upon the progress they have made in obtaining subscriptions, specially recommends the object to the benevolence of the public, and hopes that the money required may soon be collected, and that the next Annual Meeting may be held in the new "Home." This resolution was carried.

It was then moved by Mr. S. H. Blake and seconded by the Rev. Mr. Sweeney, That the Lady Managers of the Boys' Home desire to express their heartfelt gratitude to Almighty God for the blessings that have attended their work through the past year, and their earnest and prayerful expectation that as God has in the past lovingly guided, so He will in the future bless abundantly their efforts to draw in the little wanderers from the paths of sin and sorrow, and make their lives brighter, better and more hopeful.

Mayor Boswell, in bringing the proceedings to a close, made a few remarks congratulating the Managers of the Home on the success which had attended their efforts, after which Rev. Mr. Baldwin pronounced the benediction.

OBJECT OF THE BOYS' HOME.

Duties of the Board of Management and Officers.

The Institution is open to the boys of the ages mentioned in second Rule of the Regulations, the claims of admission being the utter friendlessness of the applicant, or being a child of drunken and dissolute parents ; the object of this Institution being the prevention of juvenile crime, by training these poor outcasts in the nurture and the admonition of the Lord.

The management is vested in a Committee of Ladies, chosen from the subscribers, at the Annual General Meeting in February of each year ; the said Committee to consist of thirty-three members, from among whom eight shall be chosen as Directresses ; and among them there shall be a first and second Directress, Treasurer and Secretary.

The first Directress, or in her absence one other Directress, shall preside at the monthly meetings, audit and sign the accounts presented for that purpose by the Treasurer, propose and declare the resolutions, and sign the minutes of each preceding meeting.

The Treasurer shall receive and keep an account of all moneys belonging to the Institution, as also the earnings of all the boys, a separate account of which must be kept with each. All the accounts must be presented each month, at the meeting of the Managers, for the signature of the first Directress, or in her absence, the lady presiding.

The Secretary shall conduct all the correspondence of the Society ; keep a list of the names, ages, and peculiar circumstances, as far as practicable, of all the boys, in a book provided for that purpose ; attend at each monthly meeting, take the names of those present, and minute the proceedings in a book, which must be read at each ensuing meeting, and be signed by the presiding Lady.

Two members of the Committee in rotation, shall visit the "Home" daily, each week ; inspect the house ; ascertain from the Matron the conduct of the boys, and enter a report at the weekly meeting on the Monday.

The weekly or Finance Committee shall consist of the Directress, Treasurer, Secretary, and two of the Committee, who shall have been appointed to purchase or otherwise obtain the necessary clothing for the boys. Five shall form a quorum, and their order shall be sufficient authority to the Treasurer to advance the money requisite for the above purpose, or supply such things as may be considered necessary for the "Home."

The general Committee shall meet on the second Monday of the month, at eleven o'clock, a.m. Each meeting shall be opened with prayer. The minutes of the proceeding meeting having been read and signed, the vouchers of the Treasurer produced and signed, the Secretary shall inform the meeting of any correspondence that has taken place during the last month, and the first Directress shall put before the meeting such resolutions as may be put into her hands, take the votes,

and declare the decision. Seven shall form a quorum, and when a tie arises, the presiding Lady shall give the casting vote. All admissions that have taken place during the past month shall either be ratified or disallowed, at the discretion of the meeting.

As soon as the meeting is opened, all conversation not addressed to the presiding Lady, shall be pronounced by her to be out of order and stopped.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE BOYS' HOME.

I. The Matron shall be competent to take charge of all the boys ; to conduct the household affairs generally ; to admit applicants with the doctor's certificate, subject to the approval of the Weekly Committee ; and she shall daily see to the personal cleanliness of each boy, and every morning and evening conduct family prayer.

II. Boys from the ages of 5 to 14 are admitted as inmates, and none shall be placed in a permanent situation until he has been one year in the Institution. This rule may be suspended under peculiar circumstances, at the discretion of the Managers.

III. The boys shall rise at 6 a.m. from 30th April to 30th September, and at 7 a.m. from 1st October to 1st May ; the time for going to rest being from 6 to 8 p.m. Their meals to be at regular hours—Breakfast at 8 a.m., Dinner at 12, and Tea at 5:30 p.m. Grace to be said before and after meals by one of the elder boys ; and all hours not occupied by such meals, or by instruction, to be employed, under the supervision of the Matron, in bodily exercise, house cleaning or in play.

IV. All the boys shall regularly attend Sunday School, and Divine Service in a Protestant Church, every Sunday, in charge of the Matron ; and in the afternoon receive such religious instruction as can be given by the Matron, or any visiting friend to the Institution.

V. The charge for each boy, of parents or friends who are able to pay, shall be \$4 per month, unless an exceptional case shall occur. If more than one boy of the same parents or friend gains admittance, a reduction shall be made, as approved of by the ladies of the Weekly Committee.

VI. Prompt and implicit obedience must be given to the orders of the Matron.
