#### NOTICE TO SUBSCRIBERS.

As already notified we have decided to publish fortnightly. For very many reasons, which will readily be understood, it will be quite impossible to produce at regular intervals. There are difficulties which cannot be overcome and delays which it is not in our power to avoid. As an example, we sent out the "Western Scot" of August 23 to the Front so soon as it was issued. Up to going to print with this issue, the parcel containing the former number had not been received. Moreover, ten days ago we heard from the Editor that copy for this issue was on its way to us via "The Censor"—this has not yet arrived.

However, we anticipate that when this comes to hand there will be sufficient material for another edition, which will be published before the end of the month.

Owing to these facts this number contains practically no news of the battalion, but must be looked upon as a supplement to the nominal roll number.

#### ITEMS OF INTEREST.

The official title of the 67th Pioneer Battalion is now the 4th Canadian Pioneers, B.E.F., France.

Our sympathies are with Capt. S. H. Okell and Lieut. M. M. Marsden, who through sickness were unable to proceed overseas with the Battalion. It was a bitter pill for these two very efficient officers to swallow. We wish them a speedy recovery and the early fulfilment of their keen desire to "get overseas."

Lieut. A. J. Bell was appointed Assistant Transport Officer to Lieut. W. F. Cooke, August 8, 1916.

We congratulate the undermentioned N.C.O.'s and man on their accession to the rank of Lieutenant:—102287, Sergt. E. J. Norwood; 28671, Sergt. W. Shawyer; 103161, Actg.-Sergt. I. A. E. Daniels; 102859, Pte. W. H. Hutchinson. Once again has our gallant Colonel fulfilled his promise made a year ago to grant commissions to efficient men in the ranks.

Lieut. S. D. Terry was promoted to the rank of Captain on the eve of departure overseas. This was a well-earned reward, and was exceedingly popular both with officers and men.

No. 102001, O.R.S.M. Nicholls, E.F., has been attached to Canadian Section, 3rd Echelon, General Headquarters, France.

A number of N.C.O.'s were promoted and confirmed in their rank. Their names appear in the complete list of N.C.O.'s that proceeded overseas which will be found in this issue.

#### EXTRACTS FROM NEWS CABLE FROM CANADA.

British Columbia election returns indicate the election of 40 Liberals and seven Conservatives.

All Cabinet Ministers are beaten, but Premier Bowser may get in when soldiers' votes are announced.

Prohibition from July 1 next is adopted, but the final count depends on soldiers' votes.

Woman suffrage carried in every riding.

An anonymous writer threatens to blow up the Parliament Buildings and City of Ottawa.

Two cases of leprosy have been discovered among Chinamen in Victoria.

The Pacific Great Eastern Company's locomotive started on the 16th inst., on its first run to Whytecliffe from North Vancouver.

August 31, 1916.—Spokare leads the North West Baseball League. Vancouver holds sixth place with percentage of .416.

The Vancouver Golf Club House on Shaughnessy Heights has been destroyed by fire.

"Newsy" Lalande is the highest goal-getter in the National Lacrosse Union.

Inspector Lanauze, of the Mounted Police, reports the capture of the two Eskimo murderers of Father Lerouk and Vaurier, who were killed in the Capper Mine District in 1913. He also reports important information concerning the Radford case.

Brig.-General R. G. E. Leckie, C.M.G., and Col. W. O. H. Dodds, C.M.G., have taken over training division and infantry brigade commands respectively at Bramshott.

In Victoria nearly \$500,000 was subscribed for war purposes in the first two years of the conflict; the local Patriotic Aid Society receive \$256,306; this branch of the Canadian Red Cross Society, \$85,978; Belgian Relief Committee, \$30,720; and the local branch of the Canadian Patriotic Fund, \$27,812.

Up to July 31 over half a million dollars had been disbursed by the Vancouver Patriotic Fund since September, 1914, and the monthly expenditure has risen from \$5,442 to \$64,670. The average monthly assistance per family is \$20.62.

Major-General Sir Sam Hughes, with the concurrence of the Imperial authorities, has arranged for permission to be given to Sir Richard McBride, Agent-General for British Columbia, that the votes of the British Columbian soldiers should be taken in the trenches. The day of the elections in British Columbia is not until September 14, but the voting in the trenches will take place in the meantime. A number of polling officers are being sent to the Front to take the votes of the soldiers,

#### LONDON NOTES.

The casualty lists which come in daily have already borne unwelcome news to us of deaths in action and from wounds amongst the ranks of the Western Scots. We knew that this had to come, but none the less it has a very depressing effect, and we realise more than ever that it is up to us who are left behind to do all in our power in the interests of the Battalion.

We are endeavouring to keep track of the hospitals in England to which our wounded men are sent, and we will try to see that they get some solid proof of the anxiety of this paper to look after their interests in a personal and individual manner.

We hear that Pte. Hopwood is seriously ill in France, but that subsequently his condition has slightly improved.

Sgt. Crossthwaite, in answer to our query, states that he has everything he needs, and is receiving the very best attention at the Guildford War Hospital. We asked a nurse friend of ours to keep her eye on him, and no doubt she will!

We have written to Pte. S. D. McDermid and A/Cpl. F. Paul, who are in hospital at Wandsworth and Birmingham respectively.

In the same way we will send The Western Scot, and endeavour to write to casualties as they arrive, so that they will know that their friends in the 67th are not forgetting them.

Numerous letters and parcels have been addressed to the offices of this magazine for men in France. We have forwarded these, and will be glad at any time to do so, but for the information of relatives and friends concerned we might state that the most direct means of reaching men is to address all envelopes and parcels to:—No.——, Pte.————, "A," "B," "C" or "D" Co., 4th Canadian Pioneers, B.E.F., France.

We sent forward the number of The Western Scot published August 23, as soon as it was issued, by a route which we had reason to believe was the quickest. There has evidently been a long delay somewhere, and we will endeavour to avoid this in future.

The Business Manager has been transferred to the Staff of the Canadian War Records Office at 3, Lombard Street, London, E.C., and special facilities are now given him, so that production and delivery of The Western Scot in future will be as little delayed as possible. But if delays occur, please remember that the mailing list has now reached rather huge dimensions. It takes quite a time to address and wrap six hundred magazines.

The lists published in this issue will place permanently on record the ranks attained by N.C.O.'s in the old 67th on proceeding overseas. Also by combining Lists of Increase and Decrease in Strength with the Lists given in the Nominal Roll Number, the whereabouts of every man can be ascertained.

Those of us in London had our little glimpse of "War" in the early hours of Sunday morning, September 3. The marvellous network of searchlights, and the eerie appearance of the apparently innocuous silver cigar in the sky, was a sight not soon to be forgotten. Of course, it was impossible to ascertain at such a great height exactly how close the shells were going to the Zepp., but they seemed to be bursting above, below and all around it; and must have been far too close to be pleasant to the occupants of the air-ship.

The red signal which fell from "something" in the clouds above the Zepp., and the almost instantaneous cessation of firing, caused a thrill even though we who were watching did not know the meaning. A few minutes afterwards a tongue of flame shot up—this rapidly became a huge ball of fire which illuminated the whole of London with a bright white light, as the burning Zepp. dropped like a fallen star to earth. Lieut. W. L. Robinson, R.F.C., had splendidly finished the work so well begun by the anti-aircraft guns, and had nobly earned the V.C. subsequently conferred on him by His Majesty.
