Sir: It affords me much satisfaction  
and pleasure to observe a letter by Dr.  
Isiah Ryder referring to the evil effects  
of alcoholic liquors upon the human  
economy, even if taken in moderate  
"moderation." Having for many years  
given a great deal of attention to the study  
of the " liquor question," chiefly from the  
physiological, chemical and social stand-  
points, I feel the more and more convinced  
that it is my duty to oppose the use of al-  
coholic drinks in every form and quantity.  
I have not a particle of confidence in them,  
and am pleased to see that there are medi-  
cal men in this country who are manly  
enough to take the side of total abstinence  
and follow in the footsteps of the famous  
physician of London, Dr. B. W. Richard-  
son, and of other eminent British  
and American physiologists and practition-  
ers, who have drawn direct attention to  
the fact that physiologists have scarcely  
ever had a dispute about the effects of  
alcohol upon the human system. They are  
unanimous as to the injury alcohol  
does to the human system, and the injury  
upon the tissues of the normally healthy  
individual who may have partaken of it.  
The dispute, whatever it may amount to,  
is with reference to its utility in certain  
forms of disease. Dr. Ryder says that  
not one of the ministers, so far as I am able  
to learn, referred to the medicinal use of  
this vile poison. With regard to this I  
have to state that of the numerous lectures  
on this subject heard by me, apart from the  
scientific and medical ones, the only  
one I ever knew to treat of the medicinal  
use of alcohol was that by the late  
Rev. M. Stafford of Lindsay. That gen-  
tleman by his masterly treatment of that  
point in the discussion showed clearly that  
he had an intelligent idea of the matter.  
His loss to the total abstinence cause is  
greatly to be regretted.
