THOUSANDS ARRIVED BY BOAT AND RAIL LAST NIGHT.

Parliament Street Church was organized as a mission-Jarvis-street church in 1872. Situated in a thickly settled, artisan neighborhood its work has been largely evangelistic. Not a few from this church have become pastors and missionaries. Membership 292.

College-street church had its origin in a mission started by Immanuel Church in 1872. The Rev. S. S. Bates is an indefatigable worker. The present membership is 393.

First-avenue Church was organized in 1874. The present membership is 305. The Dovercourt-road Church was organized in 1881. The present membership is 358.

Beverly-street Church was organized in 1891. The Sunday morning service is held at 11 o'clock. The church is situated on a corner in a thickly settled neighborhood. The present membership is 333.

In 1888 Ontario Wesleyan Church was organized as a mission of the Brook-street Church. It now numbers 58. The headquarters of the Ontario Wesleyan Church is in 1888. Membership 137.

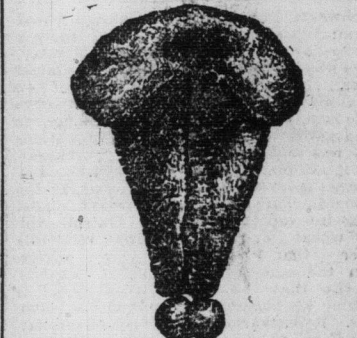
