

FARM PUPIL INDUSTRY.

8000 PREMIUM FOR A YEAR'S WORK AT \$4 A MONTH.

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TWO COLONIAL DEMOCRATS.

An English View of Sir Oliver Mowat and the Hon. John Dwyer. A Trial Statement.

From The London Sketch. If you happened to pass Sir Oliver Mowat in the street during his recent visit to England, you would not have turned to look at him a second time. There is nothing in his short, thick-set build and impassive Scotch face to attract attention. A student who would certainly take him to be, and probably a professor or a well-to-do family doctor. Yet this man has a record in statesmanship second only to that of Mr. Gladstone among living public men. Where else will you find one who has held the reins of power in a democratic state for 23 years without a single break, the supreme ruler of a British province, for nearly a quarter of a century, and now left, in his 75th year, without a rival in the field? That is the record of Sir Oliver Mowat in Ontario, the most British and the most progressive of the Canadian provinces. The New South Wales and the West Indies have hardly a political figure that has been so long in the saddle during the quarter of a century in which he has been ruling.

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APPLES FOR AUSTRALIA.

Ontario Fruit Growers Have Despatched a Trial Shipment.

Hon. John Dwyer, Minister of Agriculture, yesterday received from Mr. I. Wolverson of Grimsby, on behalf of the Ontario Fruit Growers' Association, a case of beautiful Canadian apples, being a sample from 115 cases of fruit which, on Saturday were shipped to New South Wales by the steamer "Kaituma," on making the experiment in the hope that a market for Canadian apples may be established in Australia, seeing that at this season the markets of that country are bare of fruit. The consignment will leave Vancouver on the November steamer and is expected to reach Sydney in December. Four varieties—the Grey Crabapple, Baldwin and greening—have been despatched and the Dominion agent at Sydney will take charge of the shipment on its arrival.

WHO WILL START THE BELLING? While everyone admits that something should be done to secure a better system of government for the city of Toronto, no one seems to take upon himself the responsibility of starting a movement to secure that object. The experience of the past twenty years proves conclusively that the present system has been an utter failure. If we ever expect to secure a better system, some one must make a move towards that end immediately. The present agitation should not be allowed to dwindle away, as it will do in the course of a few weeks unless immediate action is taken. The opportunity may not arrive again for a long time to come. It is to be hoped that some of our leading citizens will deem the matter of sufficient importance to urge them to action, with a view of securing a change. Any new system that is devised ought to give to the ratepayers and voters the right of deciding on the general policy upon which the city is to be governed, while to a small and executive board should be entrusted the carrying out of that policy. Certain it is in none of our prominent citizens become interested in the movement nothing will come out of the present agitation.

A BOOM IN CANADIAN IRON. The outlook for Canadian iron is very promising at present. According to "Hardware and Metal," American pig iron has been displaced almost entirely in Canada by the domestic product. The reason assigned for this is, first, because of the activity in the markets of the United States, and secondly, because the price of Canadian pig iron has not advanced as rapidly as that of the United States. Nova Scotia iron No. 2 can be laid down in Toronto at about \$17.50 per ton, while a similar iron is quoted at from \$14.25 to \$14.50 in Pittsburgh. To lay this down in Toronto would entail an addition of from \$1 to \$3 per ton on the coast, duty and freight to the city. Canadian pig is the only iron that is being used in Eastern Canada and in Ontario as far west as the city of London. The outlook is very favorable and the success of this industry cannot but have a beneficial effect on business generally in the Dominion. The prospects of the iron industry in Canada never were better or more hopeful than they are today.

AN IMMEDIATE ENQUIRY IN ORDER. It should not require a long time to ascertain the facts in connection with the premature disclosure of Mr. Blake's opinion in the bond case. UGLY RUMORS IN CHINA.

The Lives and Property of Foreigners Everywhere Endangered in the Empire—The Mohammedan Rebellion—Trial of the Kuehchung Murderers—Apathy of Native Magistrates Has a Bad Effect.

San Francisco, Oct. 15.—The following letter comes from Tokio, dated Sept. 26: Ugly rumors are circulated in China as to the probability of fresh anti-foreign outrages.

The probable effect of these measures was to induce the removal (September 12) of all foreign ladies and children, as well as of the girls in the American mission boarding houses from Wu-chang to the concession.

In truth there is no avoiding the conviction that foreign life and property are everywhere menaced in China to-day, and that the conciliatory policy pursued by the western powers in their dealings with the middle kingdom has been entirely misconstrued by the Chinese.

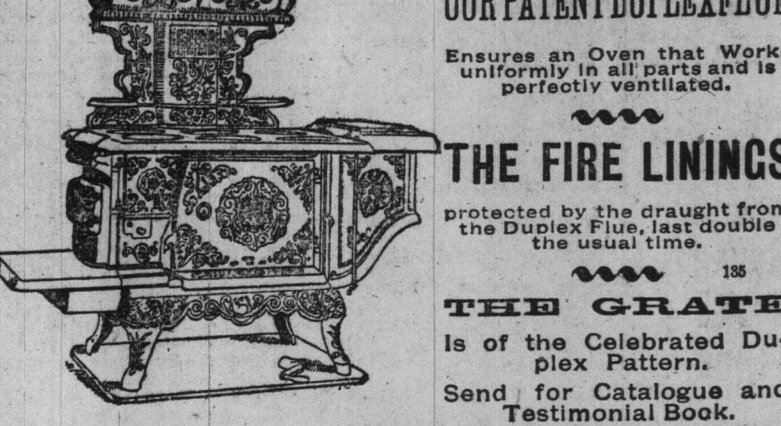
