In point of fitness of workmanship, delicacy and beauty of finish and accuracy of counterfeiting, says the Washington Critic, the bank note engraving turned out by the American engravers is not equaled by the work of any engravers in the world.

The denominations of silver certificates are \$1, \$2 and \$10. The \$10 certificate is adorned with the portrait of the late Thomas A. Hendricks, set in a square panel, an entirely new design in bank note printing.

All the notes are profuse with lath work consisting of designs composed of curved lines of geometrical precision made on a machine. A lath costs \$5.00 and upward, and cannot be bought by irresponsible parties.

THE PAPER USED. The paper upon which the bank notes are printed is of a peculiar texture. It is made in a mill at Dalton, Mass., prepared over by government officials.
