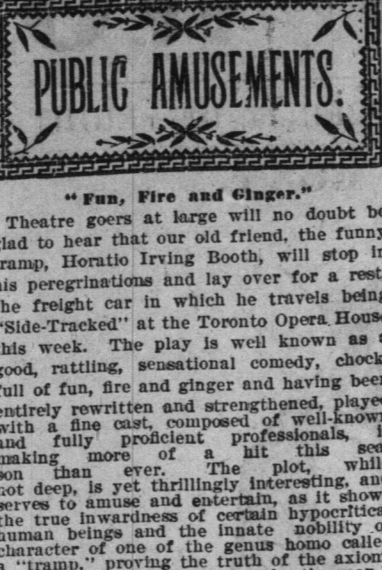

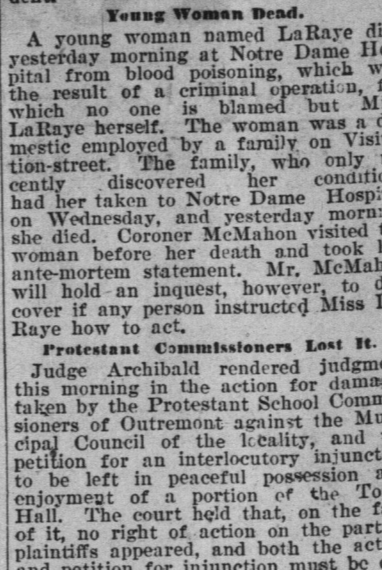

CANADA AND THE WEST INDIES.
The total annual exports of the Dominion of Canada to the West India Islands and British Guiana amount to \$3,900,000, of which the Province of Nova Scotia contributes \$3,400,000. The United States sells annually to the same islands about thirty million worth of their natural productions, and two or three millions of the natural productions of Canada, which we supply them cheaper than they can produce. The bigger part of the exports from the United States consists of products which Canada is able to supply in abundance. For instance, the United States exports to the West India Islands over \$15,000,000. And so it is with regard to a score of other leading Canadian productions. Canada ought to do a much larger trade with the West India Islands than a paltry four millions. Our goods are only a competitor in this market in the United States. We are glad to note that an effort is being made by various parties interested to increase the Canadian trade with the Islands. The Government, the Canadian Pacific Railway and the producers and manufacturers are just now turning their attention to this promising territory. There are several reasons why Canada should be able to make a big cut in the thirty million dollar trade that is done by the United States. In the first place Canada produces much of the stuff that is sent to the West Indies cheaper than the United States can produce it. If we can beat the United States in the English market why can't we beat them in the West India market? Business men who are conversant with these markets state that the exports from Quebec and Ontario may be increased by one million dollars within two years if the trade is cultivated and raised to its normal level. The millions which are now sent to the United States in the West Indies consist of breadstuffs and mill feeds, hams, bread and biscuits, beans, peas, canned vegetables, onions, butter, cheese, lard, pickled pork, beef, bacon, hams, mutton, carriages, boots and shoes, oil-cakes, woodware and other articles too numerous to mention.

THE BEET SUGAR INDUSTRY.
The first sugar ever manufactured in the State of New York was produced last week at Rome. There were about four tons of clear white granulated sugar in the run, and it was made from beets grown in the vicinity of that town. The factory is now in operation and it is expected about ten tons of granulated sugar will be turned out from it daily. The product is declared to be good, and the factory management feel very proud of the success attained. About twenty thousand tons of beets will be used at the Rome factory this season. An analytical examination of the sugar beets grown in Genesee county, New York, shows that they contain from seventeen to nineteen per cent. of sugar, which is four or five per cent. more than that contained in the beets raised in California, Nebraska and other Western States. A company is now being formed to establish a beet-sugar factory at its site. The farmers of the district are being canvassed to sign contracts to raise 3000 acres of beets for a period of five years. The factory will

cost \$500,000, and will have a capacity of eight hundred tons of beets every twenty-four hours, and will run about seventy days each year. A Canadian business man who is engaged in Buffalo promoting a pulp and paper enterprise for Ontario sends The World the above particulars. He states that if he were not occupied in the pulp business he would undertake to introduce the beet-sugar industry in Ontario. He believes there is room for many beet-sugar factories in this country. The Province of Ontario is especially well favored for the production of the sugar beet. It is the best soil for making sugar in this country were begun in earnest.

ROX AND JAFF, AGAIN.
The proposal that the city should put in its own plant for the lighting of the new city buildings is being opposed in the House of Commons.
