The following is a "floater." In Siberia the milk freezes naturally during the severe frost experienced in that country, but in France the freezing is done artifically. The Siberian winter lasts so long and the cold is so intense that milk is there bought in solid form, the people buying it in chunks instead of quarts. For convenience it is sometimes allowed to freeze round a stick which is then used as a handle to carry it by, and the milkman leaves handle to carry it by, and the milkman leaves a chunk or two chunks, as the case may be, at the homes of his customers. An important industry in France has arisen for selling milk in a solid form it having been ascertained that milk can be kept perfectly fresh in a frozen cendition for more than a month.
