KAID HARRY MACLEAN IS AN-
NOUNCED TO MARRY AGAIN.

Scotman Who Rose to Fame as Head of the Bodyguard of the Sultan of Morocco Was a British Soldier, But Bought Fortune Elsewhere—Was Held For Ransom But No One Would Pay.

Reports presented at the annual meeting.

MONEY LENT FREE

Funds for Helping Tradesmen.
Clergymen and Students.
It is generally supposed that money-lenders are avaricious and unscrupulous. Some of them are, but many are not, and some are even generous. Money is lent free of all interest and charges.

A total sum of \$25,000 is available this year for loans in Leicester. To people under thirty-five years of age who fulfil certain specified conditions. They must be of good name, good fame, and of good character. This large amount, available for Leicester residents to borrow, comes from three old charities bequeathed to the Leicester Town Council. The money is lent for nine years in sums of \$125, \$150 or \$200.
