
Presbyterian Synod of Montreal and Ottawa Passes Important Resolution -- Should Not Subordinate Civil to Ecclesiastical Tribunals--Labor Unions and Religion, Cards, Dancing and Picture Shows.

Perth, Ont., May 11.—That marri-age should be made a purely civil con-truct was the most important clause in a resolution passed almost unani-mously by the Présbyterian synod of Montreal and Otiawa here today. It protests strongly against the admis-ison by Quebec of the claims of the Roman Catholic church to have the right to call on the judiciary of the province to its ecclesinstical deliver-ances in this connection.
