London, May 29.—The first week of London's "season" opened today in a blaze of sunshine when King George held his first levee at Buckingham Palace with all the pomp and ceremony of the days before the war. Ambassadors and envoys accredited to the court of St. James were present, together with a galaxy of society people.

King George and Queen Mary later attended a matinee by the Comedie Francaise performers, which is one of the big fashionable functions.

Dublin, May 29.—The postponement until Friday of the Dail Efreaum meeting, fixed for Wednesday, is incerpreted as indicating an un-aspected hitch in the London negotiations. The delegates on leaving he a locked for a speedy return, but, see-alingly, they have had some difficulty in secuting acceptance by the British Cabinet of their view that the De Valera-Collins agreement does not materially modify the situation.

The body to be returned at the coming elections, whether contested or not, will have the same power to legislate as the Free State Parliament when constituted, and the Provincia Government will be responsible to it. This body also will represent only twenty-six counties. All this differentiates it from any Dail Eireann, as the Dail at present is for all Ireland and has no control over the Provisional Government and no power of legislation recognized by British law.

Berlin, May 39.—Chancellor Wirth reviewed the Gence Conference in the Reichstag today. It was Great Britain, he said, who took the initiative in convoking the Conference for the purpose of bringing the peoples of Europe together to discuss and remove the differences existing among the people of the world. It was a bold, great and substantial idea, perhaps too great to be realized under present conditions.

The absence of the United States, and the attitude of France ultimately so restricted the agenda, declared the Chancellor, that the European orisis, in its full extent, could not be included in the discussions, but, though the program was restricted, they must be thankful to those who despite all attempts at sabotage, had sustained the original idea of bringing the nations of the earth together.



Alberta Organizes

Farm Products Pool For Handling Crops Each Member Binds Himself

to Sell Products to the Pool for Five Years.

Pincher Creek, Alta, May 27—The formation of a general farm products pool is now under way by the local association of the winted Farmers of Alberta for the handling of the 1923 crop. The provincial board of directors have been instructed to proceed with arrangements for incorporation under the provincial co-operative association act. Under the proposed plan each member must bind himself to sell his produce to the pool for a period of five years. Shares in the pool will sell for \$5 and one percent of the gross sales will be set aside for extension purposes. No decision has been reached yet as to whether or not the membership will be restricted to members of the U.F. A.

All farm produce will be handled under the pool system according to grade. Farmers in this district are said to be very much in favor of the scheme.


