Drastic Penalties Sought by Rails Minister at Ottawa.

BUSINESS IS BRISK

House Puts in Useful Day While Others Are On Holiday.

By E. C. BUCHANAN, Special to The Advertiser. Ottawa, May 25.—During the course of a quiet but useful day in the House of Commons many items of government business were advanced a stage.

Other measures toward the enactment of which the initial step was taken included one in the name of the minister of railways to provide drastic penalties for persons attempting to ship liquor into the Canadian train.

The House finally passed the bill authorizing the execution of a trade agreement with the Netherlands, under which Canada grants and receives certain tariff advantages.

Having required the House to ignore the national holiday, the rest of the country was observing the government got a rebuke from Leon Lader, of South Vancouver, in connection with the other phase of its neglect of the significance of Empire Day.

GERMAN DECISION PLEASES NATIONS

Declaration of Readiness To Ban Chemical Warfare Is Eagerly Discussed.

Associated Press Despatch. Geneva, May 26.—No announcement affecting the future of world peace has created more satisfaction and more eager discussion than Germany's official declaration yesterday of her readiness to subscribe to an international agreement that chemical warfare be banned.

German circles emphasize the importance of the announcement in view of the charges that Germany's vast industrial equipment would make her a formidable adversary in any future war.

Herr von Eckhardt, in making the announcement, declared Germany is solemnly desirous of eliminating the use of chemicals in warfare and will join an international conference for that purpose.

RIFFS REDOUBLING FOR NEW BATTLE

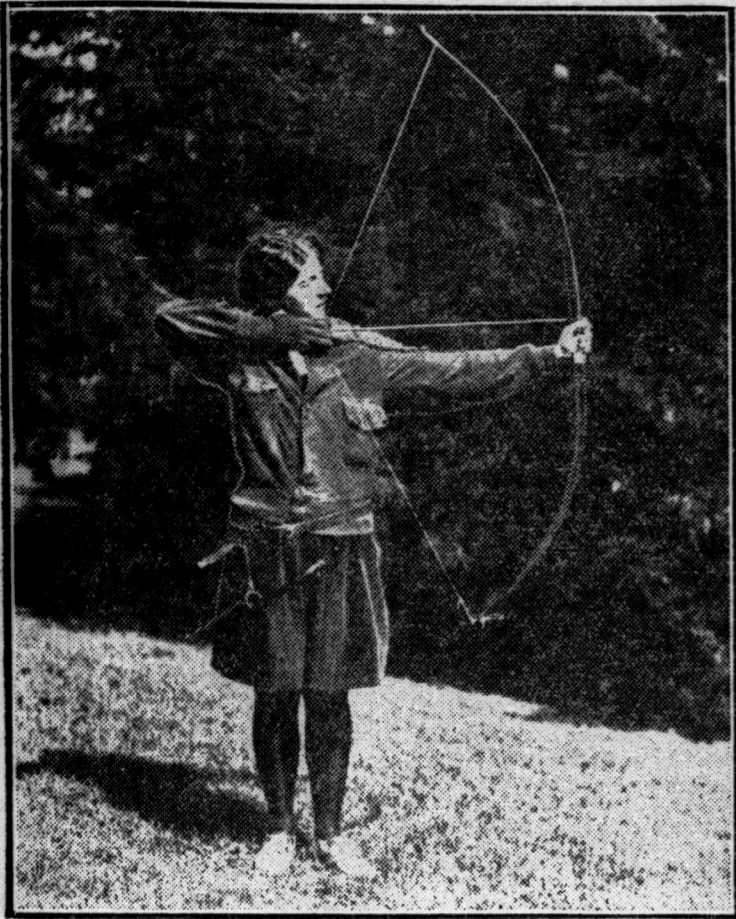

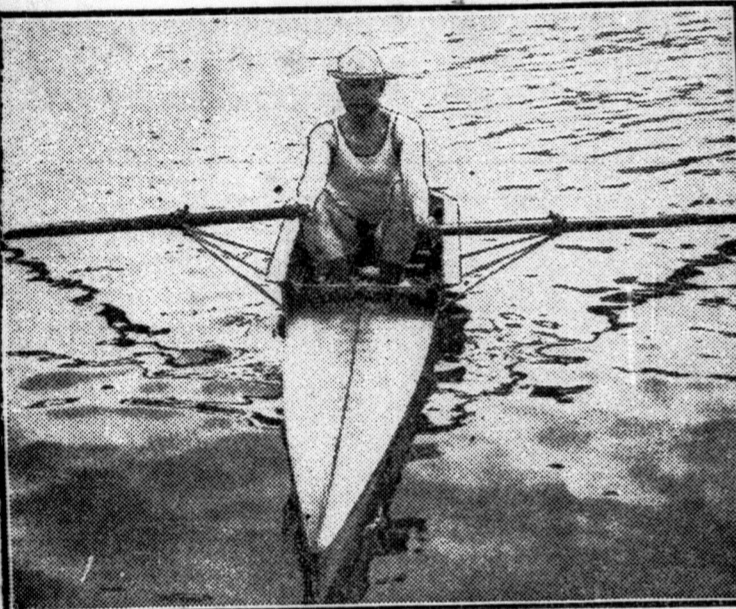

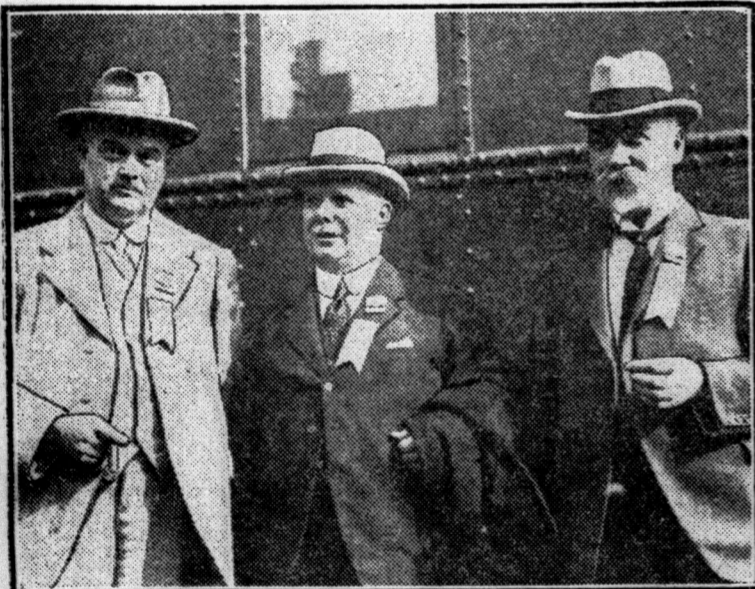

CLERGY TO CHANGE PULPITS JUNE 28

Methodist Conference Changes Date From June 7—Committees Are Chosen.

Devotional exercises at which the preacher was Rev. Dr. C. L. Goodell of New York, the hearing of many reports, the appointment of important committees, a public service for retired pastors and a public rally of young people made Monday a very busy day for the London Methodist conference.

One important decision reached was when a former ruling was reconsidered and the moving pastors were directed to be responsible for their new charges on Sunday, June 28. The previous ruling was for June 7, but the later date was approved by a large majority on Monday.

Of the many reports heard three were especially enlightening. Rev. S. R. McVittie was given high praise for the work being done at the Mount Elgin Institute.

Reports Received.
Rev. W. E. Donnelly of Stratford, gave the Sunday school report. The 650 Sabbath schools in the conference have an enrollment of 41,613 and an average attendance of 26,440. 1,626 scholars were received into church membership last year, and \$18,432 was contributed by the pupils to missions.

A resolution presented by Mr. Donnelly called upon all ministers and religious leaders of the church to cooperate with other churches in giving Bible instruction in the public schools. Another report which was much discussed was from the department of evangelism and social service.

A recommendation adopted was that the United church fix the boundaries of presbyteries as near as possible according to county lines.

Several Hundred Dollars Loss at Home of F. T. Cromarty.

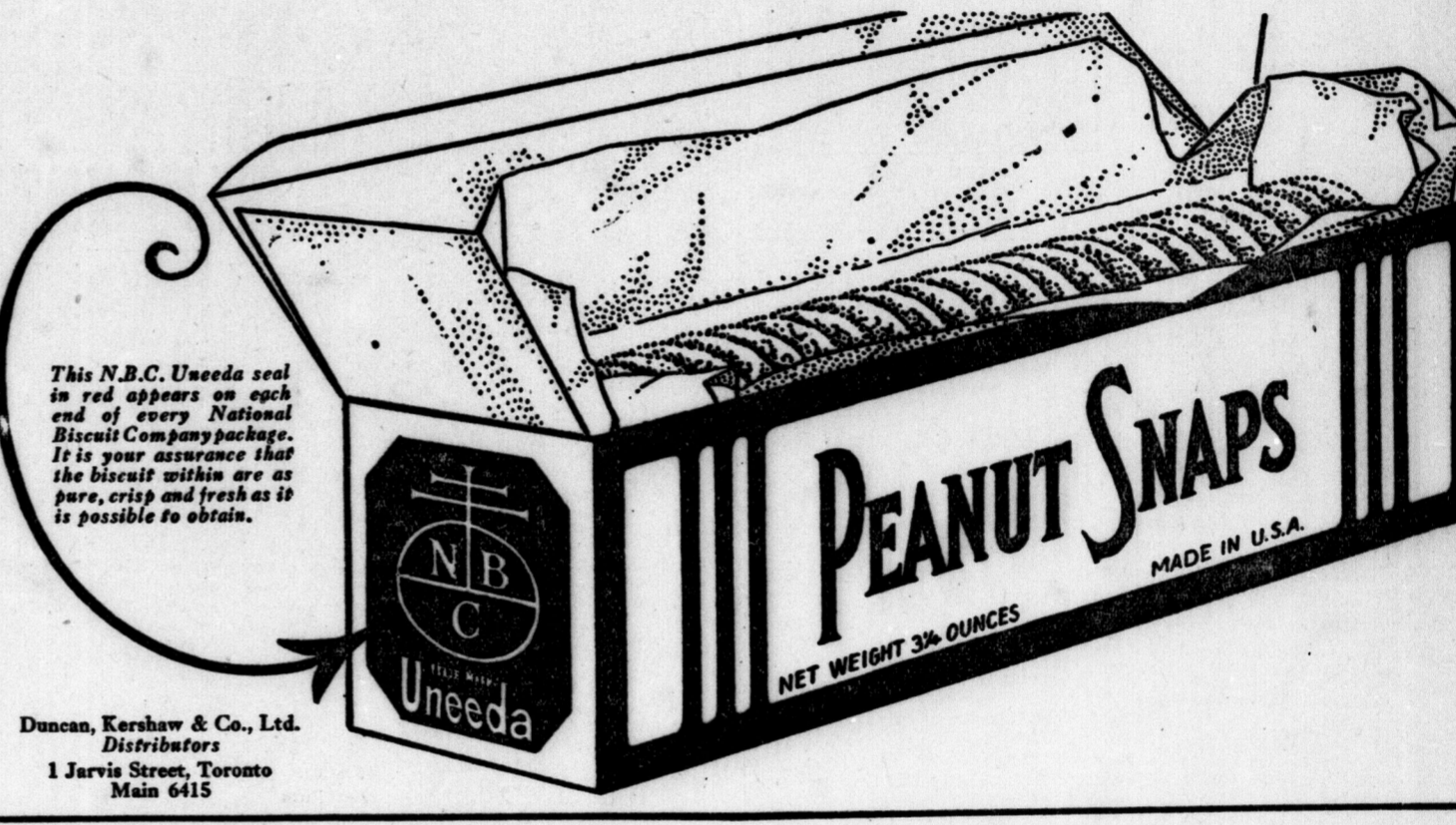
