## NOTICE.

It is the intention of the Directors to hold two meetings during the Exhibition for the discussion of subjects relating to Fruit Growing. The time and place of meetings will be announced through the press previous to the 6th of August.

The success attending the Exhibition last August, and the importance which the Association has obtained, has led thie Directors to somewhat extend their prize list hoping thereby to increase the interest in this important industry, and make this, their second Exhibition, superior to anything of the same description ever before held in the Province.

The co-operation of all is cordially invited.

## RULES AND REGULATIONS,

1. All specinens plecerl in rompr sition for preminmamust be boma fide arows BY the combetiros; and if proved not to be such, he to be disqualified from receiving any premium whatever at the Exhihition.
2. All plants, flowers, fruits and vegetables must he carefully labelled with their proper names. Botanical names to bo mded as far as possible.
3. In awarding premiums on plants in pots, speeial reference will be hal to the beanty of the specimens, profusion of hom and evidence of superior cultivation.
4. The term "Dissimila"" slall in every instance be held to mean distinet varieties of any plant.
5. Any deviation, more or less, from the exact gutatities or numbers specified in the schedule may disualify a empetitor the the diseretion of the Judges.
6. All exhibitors in the elasses for bonguets must have them of such a size that they ean be shown in vases provided by the Association.
7. Dot-plants must have been grown in pots at least two montlis previons to the Fixhibition, and have also been the property of the exhihitor for a similar period. If proved not to be such they will be disqualified.
8. Cards eorresponding with the entries will be furnished the exhibitors, who alone will leresponsible for the placing of them, und are requested to satisfy themselves that the cards correetly describe the objects exhilited. The Assocation camot be responsible for any mistake arising from the nomobservance of this or any other rule.
9. In order to allot the space required in eaelt section, all entries must be made in writing und subseriptions paid not later than the saturday previous to the opening of the Exhibition, after which date no entries will be reeeised.
10. The Secretary shall not be obliyed to receive any entries not made in writing, hank forms for which will be furnished on applieation. l'arties at a distanee may send their entries hiy mail.
11. All articles to be exhibited for preminms mast he in the lanilding by three o'clock, p.m., on the day of the opening of the Exhibition, at which hour the door will be elosed, and no further exhibits almitted. One hour will be given thereafter for exhibitors to finish placing ate? icketing their articles, at the close of which time they must be prepared to lave the buiding, in order that the Judges may make their awards. Fxhibitors are requested to second the efforts of the Association in enforeing this rule.
12. The Julges shall have the discretionary power of withholding premlums; if, in their opinion, the artiches exhibited do not merit them; and they are particularly rednested to kepp this rule in mind.
13. (iratuities may be awarded by the Judges for any new or rare fiuts, flowers, plants or other oljeets of particular interest, for which no special preminm has been offered.
14. The Julges shall not be competitors in that class for which they are to
ad premiums. award premiuns.
15. On recommendation of the Julges, or of a committee appointed by the Association, the lirectors may award a diploma for exceptlomal excellence, if in their ophion it is deemed indvisalide.
16. The decision of the Julges, as regards the preminms, must he considered timal, and no protest will he entertained, except when the awards are not made in conformity with the rules of the Association.
17. No individual, except the Julges, will be allowed to touch or handie any fruit, flower or other articie exhibited, and any exhibitor proved guilty of having tampered with ony article on exhihition, or section cards, will be liable to he deprived of all premimms he may have been awarded, at the option of the committee.
18. While the Indges are making their awords, no person shall he present except partles not in any way interestel.
19. Committees may be appointed by the Association to assist in numing fruits and plants about which exhibitors may be cloubtful, but the Association dees not assume any responsibility in the matter.
20. The Association will not be responsibie for damage done to plunts during or after the Exhihition, but all orlinary eare will be taken of them.
21. Parties will not be nllowed to compete for more than one prize in the same section, and no article that has ahready been awarded a prize will be entitled to another.
22. The Association, vill under no circumstances, pay charges on plants sent for competition. Nor can they assume the responsibility of looking after such until placed in the building.
23. All articles exhibited shall remain in the building until the close of the Exhibition, when they will he delivered to the contributors, unless otherwise directed.
24. Any person residing in the Provinee may become a member of the Association on payment of an annual membership fee of Two Dollars, for which payment he will receive a Ticket of Admiasion to the Exhlblthons for his own use, and be entitled to the privilege of competing at all Exhibitions of the Association.
25. Any person residing outside the Province, on phyment of an entrance fee of One Dollar, will be entitled to a Ticket of Admission to the Exhibitions for his own use.
26. Prize lists and all other information may be obtained by applying to the Secretary; and all persons interested in Horticulture are invited to contribute articles for Exhibition.
