THE REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

OF THE

DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION,

1891.

The Council has the honour to submit the Twenty-fourth Annual Report of the proceedings of the Association, and again to congratulate the members on a very successful season.

The attendance of competitors at the annual prize meeting, which commenced on Monday morning, the 21st August, was 426, the largest since the inaugural meeting at Laprairie in 1868. The weather during the four days which the match lasted was all that could be desired, and enabled the Committee to get through the matches in the prescribed time. There was, however, a feeling among the competitors that the time was too short for the large amount of shooting to be done, and it will be a subject for consideration with the new Council as to whether it would not be well to extend the meeting over another day.

The firing throughout the meeting was exceptionally good, as will be seen by the following :

Many competitors regretted the loss of the 900 yards range, and consider that it would be well to have the shooting at both 800 and 900 yards added to the competition for Bisley.

A new feature in the programme of the matches this year was the competition between members of the Senate and House of Commons (six a side), which was won after a close contest by the Upper House, as the following score will show :—

The Senate team was captained by Lt.-Col. Hon. C. H. Boulton and the Commons by Lt.-Col. R. Tyrwhitt, M.P. Much interest was taken in the match, and it is to be hoped that it will become one of the regular competitions at the meetings of the Association.

The Regular Army was again represented by a goodly contingent from the 1st Battalion Leicestershire Regiment, consisting of 3 officers and 12 N.C.O's and men, under command of Capt. Burnett, and although they were not fortunate enough to carry off any large prizes, they proved to have some good shots amongst them, especially with the Martini-Henry rifle. Their presence amongst the militia was thoroughly appreciated.

All the Provinces were represented at the annual meeting, and much credit is due to the Province of British Columbia for sending so large a team, considering the great distance they have to travel.

The thanks of the Association are again due to His Excellency the Governor General for the continued interest he takes in the welfare of the Association, and for his liberal contribution to its funds.

And to the Government and members of Parliament the thanks of the Association should also be given for the liberal grant voted to the Association, as well as for the grants to the several Provincial Rifle Associations.

To the Hon. Sir Adolphe P. Caron, K.C.M.G., late Minister of Militia and Defence, the thanks of the Association are also due for the continued interest he has evinced in its affairs.

The Canada Club of London again presented a handsome silver cup for competition amongst the members of the Bisley Team of 1891, and the thanks of the Association are due to the Club for the handsome prize.

The Council, whilst on the subject of thanks, would be neglecting a duty were they to omit thanking the Staff of the Association for their successful efforts in carrying out the annual matches. No meeting ever passed off more smoothly, and very great credit is due to the executive officer, Lt.-Col. Maunsell, and all under him, for that happy result. The camp was beautifully laid out under the orders of Lt.-Col. Macpherson, and contributed largely to the comfort of competitors residing therein.

The Association has to deplore the loss of one of its oldest and most respected members in the death of Lieut. E. A. Macnachten. No face was more familiar on the Rideau Range than that of the gallant

artilleryman from Cobourg no member of Council worked harder in its interests, and no place at its Board will be harder to fill than his.

The report of the Commandant of the Bisley team will be found most interesting, not only for the account it gives of the admirable shooting displayed by many of its members, but also for several very valuable suggestions made by Major Weston for the conduct and comfort of future teams.

The Canadian Gazette of 30th July, sums up the shooting of the team so concisely that the following extract therefrom will not be out of place :

“THE CANADIAN TEAM AT BISLEY.

“The members of the Dominion team will return to the Dominion next week with ample laurels. Their successes are indeed believed to be unprecedented in the whole record of Canadian participation in the meetings of the National Rifle Association. They have won five first, four second, and two second team prizes, and a total of nearly £600 in money prizes. The Prince of Wales' prize, which is next to the Queen's in importance, was won by Captain McMicking. In the Heath, which is open to all the meeting, the only possibles made were by Sergt. Armstrong and Captain Milligan, and the only possible made in the Carrington was by Sergt. Marris. Lieut. Davidson was higher in the Queen's than any Canadian has before been, and Sergt. Ogg won the second prize in the Graphic. The team was second in the Mac-kinnon rapid firing; while the amount taken out of the bi-diurnals was much larger than usual. With such a record to their credit, Major Weston and his fellow-Canadians can bear with equanimity their disappointment at the failure to regain possession of the Kolapore Cups. It is only just to add that no small part of the success of the Canadian team is due to the kindly and intelligent interest and encouragement with which the efforts of one and all were supported by the Commandant and Adjutant, whose courtesy and hospitality to all visitors to the camp also deserves a word of recognition.”

FINANCE.

The Treasurer's Statement of the Finances of the Association, duly audited, is submitted herewith :

The receipts for the year amounted to \$18,329.23, which with the balance of \$1,086.32, brought forward from last year, shows a total of \$19,415.55 to the credit of the account.

The expenditure amounted to \$18,469.60, leaving a balance of \$945 95 in favour of the Association at the end of the year.

Affiliation fees from Rifle Associations, including \$60 for 20 bronze medals issued, amounted to \$704, as against \$869 received in 1890.

The number of Affiliating Associations were 8 Provincial and 37 Local and other Rifle Associations, showing a decrease of 13 Local Associations as compared with 1890.

The annual subscriptions received for the year amounted to \$256 90.

The Associate Members' fees for the Annual Matches amounted to \$351, the same as last year.

The receipts from special donations amounted to \$640, as against \$700 received in 1890.

The special donations from Banks amounted to \$825, the same as last year.

The net receipts from entry fees, including sighting shots, post entries and fines, exclusive of the charge for Ammunition, amounted to \$4,424.67, as against \$4,323.03 received in 1890, an increase of \$101 64.

The receipts from the sale of Ammunition this year amounted to \$1,101.46, as against \$1,226.60 in 1890, a decrease of \$125.14; but in this connection it should be mentioned that the value of the Ammunition issued and credited in the receipts for sighting shots amounted to \$110 76, which if deducted would leave a net decrease of only \$14.38.

Cash Prizes and Badges amounted to \$7,299.31, as against \$7,519.30 in 1890, a decrease of \$219.99.

The expenditure of the Bisley Team this year amounted to \$5,556.15, as against \$5,811.27 in 1890, a decrease of \$255.12 ; this is accounted for by a reduction in the cost of passage of the Team by the Dominion Line, and of certain other contingent expenses connected with the Team, here and in England.

A Statement of the expenditure made by Major Weston, commanding the Bisley Team for 1891, will be found in the Appendix.

REPORT OF
MAJOR B. A. WESTON,
COMMANDING THE
BISLEY TEAM FOR 1891.

To Lieutenant-Colonel the Honourable G. A. Kirkpatrick, President of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association:

SIR,—As Commanding Officer of the Canadian Bisley Team of 1891 I have the honour to report that in accordance with instructions I proceeded to Montreal, and the several members of the Team, excepting Sergeant Mitchell, who had received special permission to proceed to England in advance, reported to me on the 23rd day of June and signed the prescribed regulations.

On inspecting the team I found one member without any uniform and I was only enabled to supply him through the kindness of some of the officers of the Montreal Brigade, and one member was without full dress and although he had ordered this it was not ready in time to enable him to parade at the inspection by H.R.H. the Duke of Cambridge; and I would suggest that the notices to members of teams hereafter require them, as a condition to their being allowed to sign the regulations, to report fully provided with uniform, instead of as at present notifying them that deficiencies will be made up at their expense.

We left Montreal on the morning of Wednesday, June 24th, on board the "Sarnia," arrangements having for the first time been made with the Dominion Line for the transport of the Team, and I desire here to state that the accommodation of the team, both on the outward and homeward voyages, was most satisfactory, and the agents of the line and the officers of the steamers were most attentive and obliging.

Owing to heavy head seas the steamer did not arrive at Liverpool until the evening of Sunday, July 5th, where we landed at 10 p.m., and

through the courtesy of the Customs officials all the baggage was examined and passed that night, and I had of necessity to take the Team to the North Western Hotel, Lime Street, there being no train to Cambridge until Monday morning.

Immediately on arrival I telegraphed Colonel Roberts, and on our arrival at Cambridge on Monday was met by him and his Adjutant, Captain Earle, and was informed that they had not understood the application made early in the season for the use of their range as an intimation that the team was coming and consequently had made no preparations for us. Col. Roberts kindly offered to provide accommodation for the officers of the team in the colleges, but as no very satisfactory arrangement could be made for the rest of the team, I concluded a contract with the proprietor of the Lion Hotel for the board of the whole team, and as the cost of this was little more than the former mode of camping on the range, I should recommend its being followed in the future if the team goes to Cambridge. A contract can easily be made before the team goes over.

Practice began on Tuesday morning and was kept up steadily until Friday evening, the shooting on the whole being satisfactory and giving promise of good shooting at Bisley.

The thanks of the Association are certainly due to Col. Roberts for his unvarying courtesy and attention to the members of the various teams that visit Cambridge, and for giving up the use of his range, to the inconvenience of the members of his own corps.

I left the team at practice under Major Blaiklock, and proceeded to Bisley on Wednesday, July 8th, and perfected arrangements for the reception of the team, and completed the necessary entries.

We left Cambridge at 7 a.m. on Saturday, July 11th, and did not reach Bisley until 4 p.m. that day, too long to be on the road to do so short a distance. Arrangements should be made by which the team could go direct to London from Cambridge instead of via Bletchley.

I had the Canadian camp laid out much on the same lines as in former years, and mindful of my instructions kept the expenditure down as much as possible, but the Canadian team has become so conspicuous a feature of the annual meeting of riflemen at Bisley, that in my opinion

no greater reduction can be expected, nor is it desirable that there should be under the circumstances. If it becomes necessary to materially cut down the expenses below those of this year, then the team can no longer occupy the distinctive position it has hitherto.

I found during our stay at Bisley that the Army and Navy Co-Operative Society had added a supply department, in which they kept for hire camping outfits, and I herewith enclose their list of articles supplied and the prices therefor, and as their articles are new and they furnish a much better outfit for I think less money, and agree to deliver it ready for use in camp, I should strongly recommend arrangements being made with them for the necessary outfit for next year. This had better be done before the team goes over.

A great deal of complaint was made in camp by those there about the quality and quantity of food supplied by the contractors, and the prices charged therefor, and an increasing number have provided themselves with messes, amongst others the team from Jersey, whose enclosure is immediately beside the Canadian, and thanks to the kindness of Lieut.-Col. Robin, in command of this team, a large number of the Canadian team secured their subsistence with them.

Now that camp kitchens can be procured at Bisley, and if necessary cooks and servants from the camp at Aldershot, in view of the fact that members of the Jersey team subsisted at an expenditure of only £2 12s. for the time of the meeting, this including the cost of all servants, whilst members of our team were allowed £4.4 for the same time, I should advise that either a mess be started for the Canadian team, or if possible a joint mess be made with the Jersey or some other team, and a considerable sum be thereby saved to the Association. The mess outfit suitable for roughing it at Bisley would not cost a great deal, and it could be left in the N.R.A. stores from year to year.

Under the new arrangements at Bisley official application should be made each year before the team crosses for the requisite number of tents and notice given of the day on which they will be occupied.

Return tickets from Montreal were furnished me for the several members of the team, and as in some instances the tickets were over lines that were not as convenient for the members in point of depart-

ure as others, it was suggested by the members that it would be more satisfactory if the amount of the ticket were given them and they be allowed to go by whichever road should prove most convenient.

I have already sent to the Treasurer of the Association a general statement of receipts and expenditure, together with details of the same and vouchers. Also the acquittance roll, signed by the members of the team, showing amount paid for subsistence and prizes.

Herewith appended are details of the scoring of the team at Bisley in the Grand Aggregate matches, also the scores in the Kolarapore match, and a list of the prizes won by the team.

Before leaving Bisley I made application for use by next year's team of targets on Butt 18 or 19 not used in the regular matches, on the ground that it would save the team expense, trouble and delay, and I have only lately received a reply to this application in which the Council of the N.R.A. regret that they cannot grant the application.

There is a good range at the camp at Pirbright within a mile of Bisley Camp, and if permission could be obtained to use this range, the team could go direct from Liverpool to the camp at Bisley and thereby save a day for practice, get accustomed to camp life, and, what is of more importance to those competing for the first time at Bisley, get a knowledge of the shooting-ground and surroundings, and have practice under conditions more in accordance with those at Bisley than can be obtained at Cambridge.

As to the shooting of the team the appended list of prizes won will show that the team of '91 won more prizes and to greater value than any other Canadian team that ever crossed, winning four first and seven second prizes, and others amounting in all to £581, besides three prizes in kind, and cups and badges.

The much coveted Kolarapores we did not win, but the contest for them was probably the keenest that has ever been held, and until the very end it was impossible to tell which of the teams representing the Mother Country, Guernsey and Canada, would win. The match was shot in exceedingly bad weather; at 200 yards a violent rain and hail storm with high winds prevailed, and at 600 yards the light was exceptionally bad, and appeared to affect our men more than those of the

other teams. At 200 yards we led the field, at 500 yards Guernsey had caught up to us, and we were ultimately beaten by the Mother Country team by seven points, and beat Guernsey by one point.

We did not win the "Queen's," but by the magnificent shooting of Lieut. Davidson the closest approach to a win yet was made, and I shall not be surprised in the near future to see this grand prize come to Canada. Lieut. Davidson was well up in the first stage, finished the second stage in third place with a score of 197 points, and ultimately finished fourth in the third stage with 264 points, winning a badge and £30. At one time at the last range Lieut. Davidson was leading the field, and I heard many hearty wishes that he might finish first.

Lieut. Davidson's shooting throughout was exceptionally good and steady, and he deserved all the congratulations that he received.

A perusal of the accompanying list of prizes won and the acquittance roll will show the somewhat hardship of the present method of distribution of prizes won, as Lieut. Davidson won £69, and with one exception got the lowest distribution of prizes.

Sergt. Henderson started badly in the Queen's, only having 83 points in the first stage, but finished ninth in the third stage, having put on the best score of the field, 42 points, at 900 yards. Sergt. Horsey was also in the third stage.

Once more Canada has won the Prince of Wales' prize. This match was shot, as were most of the matches this year, in very trying weather, but notwithstanding this Capt. McMicking was able to put on a fine score of 97 points, and thereby secure this fine prize.

The Mackinnon match was open to teams of ten representing England, Scotland, Ireland, Wales, India and any colony, the conditions being to fire five rapid volleys at 400 yards in one minute, one of the volleys to be interrupted by the teams being brought from the "present" back to the "ready" by command. In this match England fired first, and the officer commanding this team allowed so much time for each volley that his team only fired four volleys, none of which were interrupted, and as a matter of course excellent scores were made by the team having so much time to take aim. Our team fired

next, and thanks to the excellent judgment of Major Blaiklock, who commanded the team, the five volleys were got off within the prescribed time. Wales and Jersey also competed.

England won first prize and Canada second, the scores being :

As instances to show the good shooting of the team I may mention that in the "Heath" and "Carrington" matches, open to the field during the whole meeting, the only "possibles" made were by the Canadians, Sergt. Armstrong and Capt. Milligan having made one each in the Heath, and Sergt. Marris winning the cup with one in the Carrington.

The Canada Club with its usual kindness presented a cup, and this I gave to the second aggregate, made by Sergt. Horsey.

The Corporation of London Cup was won by Lieut. Davidson with the score of 301 points.

The team was inspected by His Royal Highness the Duke of Cambridge, who came over from Aldershot at great personal inconvenience. His Royal Highness was pleased to express his satisfaction with the appearance of the team and with their great success in the various competitions.

I had arrangements made with one of the news agencies to send to Canada the reports of the daily winnings of the team, and I regularly sent daily returns of these, but it appears that little or nothing of this was ever cabled across, and I would suggest that next year arrangements if possible be made with some of the leading Canadian papers to have these returns cabled across direct, and if necessary the Association bear part of the expense.

The conduct of those under my command was most exemplary, and they well sustained the already great reputation of Canadian riflemen at Bisley.

In Major Blaiklock I had a most efficient and painstaking adjutant, and I must bear testimony to the zeal and energy shown by

him in directing and seeing carried out the routine work of the team, as well as his readiness at all times to render me every assistance. His practical ability as a "coach" was of the greatest assistance to the team.

It affords me much pleasure to be able to place before you so favourable a record of the Canadian Bisley Team of 1891.

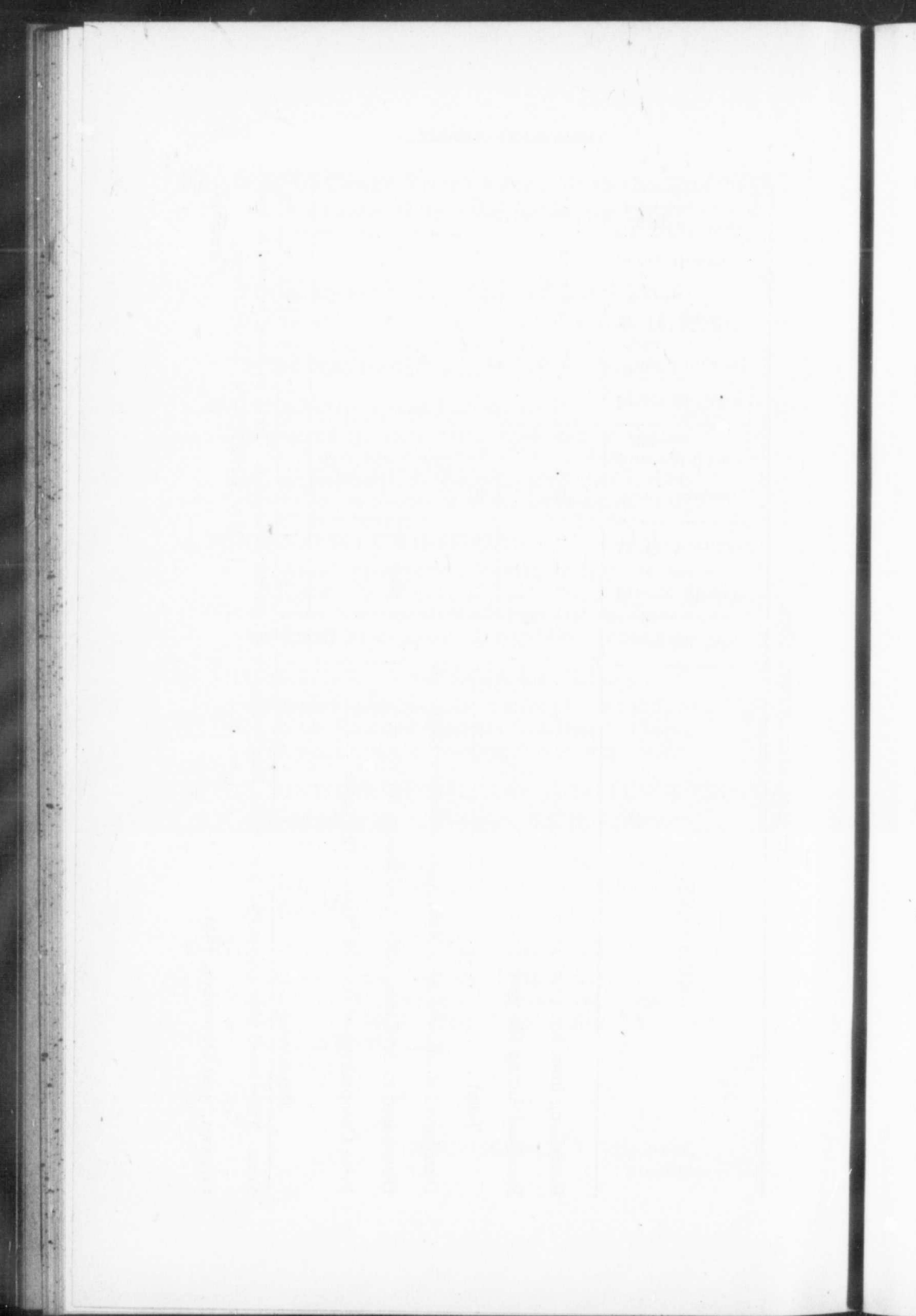

Members present—Lt.-Colonel White; Lt.-Colonel Tilton; Lt.-Colonel D. A. Macdonald; Major Blaiklock; Lt. Colonel Macpherson, Treasurer; and Lt.-Colonel Bacon, Secretary.

The minutes of the two previous meetings were read and confirmed.

The accounts for expenses incurred in preparing and enlarging the accommodation of the Rideau Range were gone into, when it was resolved—

“That the accounts should be submitted to the Hon. Minister of Militia and Defence, with a view of having the accounts for the work done on the range fairly chargeable to the Militia Department paid by that Department.

Claims for refund by competitors were then carefully examined case by case, and adjudicated on their merits.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel Tilton, seconded by Lt.-Colonel Anderson—
"That the 1st Leicestershire Team be admitted to compete in the Lansdowne Aggregate Match."—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel Tilton, seconded by Captain O'Grady—
"That Lt.-Colonel Macpherson, Lt.-Colonel Bacon and Lt.-Colonel Macdonald, be a Committee to arrange for the catering for the Matches."—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel Anderson, seconded by Lt.-Colonel D. A. Macdonald—

"That the Statistical Officer's request for a third assistant be granted."—Carried.

Moved by Lt.-Colonel Anderson, seconded by Lt.-Colonel Tilton—
"That the pay of the Staff for the conduct of the matches be the same as last year."—Carried.

It was resolved that there should be a public presentation of all Team Prizes, and Individual Prizes of \$10.00 and over.

Annual Meeting of Competitors.

The annual meeting of competitors was held at the Drill Hall on Tuesday evening, 1st September. Lt.-Col. White, chairman of the Executive, presided, and Lt.-Col. Bacon, secretary of the Association, kept the minutes. There was not a large attendance of competitors, and at the outset there appeared to be absolutely no grievances to be ventilated. While matters for discussion were being thought of, Col. Bacon read the results of the Gzowski and British Challenge Shield matches, completed a few hours previously. The competitors cordially applauded the Guards for their double victory, as the names were read off.

THE SKIRMISHING TARGETS.

Capt. Macdonald, Q. O. R., complained of the uneven ground opposite the targets on either end, which handicapped the teams drawn to fire there in these military matches. He also complained that the targets were not a uniform height above the crest of the parapet, and suggested that the frames should be so marked beforehand that the targets could be raised to exactly the same level all along the line. He drew attention to the possibility of shots in addition to those allowed being placed upon the targets, either by the mistakes of other teams or by competitors improperly firing more than once at any one halt, and suggested that an officer or non-commissioned officer should be detailed to follow each team and superintend the firing.

The Chairman said he quite admitted the force of Capt. Macdonald's contentions, and would see that the matters mentioned came to the attention of the Executive.

FIRING SUPERINTENDENCE.

Major McSpadden asked if any two teams from the same corps had fired at the same time, and if so whether they had drawn adjoining targets?

Col. Bacon replied that in every case where two teams had been entered, they had fired at different times, one being with the first lot and one with the second.

Major McSpadden endorsed what had been said as to the advisability of having officers superintend the teams.

Lt.-Colonel Hood said this was the practice at the Quebec matches. He thought that in future the cards for the officers in the butts should be so printed and ruled as to keep the marks for each round clearly separate, and that this would facilitate deductions for extra shots found upon the targets. He suggested also that steps should be taken to award marks for good and bad volleys.

SIGHTING SHOTS AND AMMUNITION.

Major Sam. Hughes, 45th Battalion, referred to the possibility of mistakes arising, in connection with the regular match tickets, from the addition of the sighting shot value in making up the score, and suggested that in future the blank for the sighter should be placed to the left of the competitor's name.

Staff-Sergeant Jos. Dent, 10th R.G., inquired why the competitors were compelled to take the round of ammunition included in the price of each sighting shot, at the office instead of at the firing point.

The Secretary explained that there would be a difficulty in keeping track of ammunition issued to be so served out at the firing points.

THE FIRING PONTS.

Captain Macdonald, Q.O.R., said many of the firing points were so uneven as to cause great discomfort, and he asked that they be levelled.

The Chairman said the Executive had already considered this matter, and had decided to level the mounds early next spring, so that they would be in good condition for the next meeting.

THE REVOLVER CONDITIONS.

Lieut. Mercer, Q.O.R., called attention to the new conditions of the Revolver Match, which called for a revolver not less than .44 calibre and $7\frac{1}{2}$ inches in length of barrel. He said it was impossible to secure such a weapon as called for.

The Chairman said that the regulation had been framed exactly

in accordance with the instructions received from Council by the programme committee. The idea was that the match should be fired with exactly the weapon which would be carried on service, and the description given applied to the service Colts.

LEFT-HANDED SHOTS.

Major Hughes aired a grievance in connection with the left-handed shots, who to find room on the butts have to cross their legs with those of their right-handed mates, to the serious danger of many a score, by reason of one of the parties thus piled together unexpectedly moving as the other is about to fire.

Capt. J. Bruce, 10th R. G., said as a left-handed shot he could cordially endorse the complaint just made, as he found the right-handed men a decided nuisance when the space was limited. (Laughter.)

Lieut. Curran, 12th, agreed that there was a nuisance somewhere, and suggested in abatement that the left-handed shots should so describe themselves in making their entries, so that they might be squadded together.

MARTINI AMMUNITION.

Lieut. E. D. Sutherland, 43rd Battalion, renewed his suggestion of last year that Martini as well as Snider ammunition should be distributed at the firing points, and asked if there was any obstacle in the way.

The Secretary said the principal reason why the suggestion had not been put into effect was that while the Snider ammunition is put up in seven and five round packages specially for the Association, the Martini, which comes from England, is all in ten round packages, and could not be handled at the firing points without much trouble. Next season, however, the Martini ammunition will probably be made in Canada, and then the suggestion can be acted upon.

THE ADOPTED WEAPON.

Major McSpadden suggested that the meeting pronounce in favour of the exclusive use of the Martini rifle.

The Chairman, in response, referred to the League scores as an

evidence that the Snider is not by any means a weapon to be despised, and he pointed out that as England is superseding the Martini by an improved arm, it is just as well for Canada to hasten slowly in the matter of a change.

FURTHER NURSERY PRIZES.

The Chairman took this opportunity to announce, by request, that a citizen of Ottawa had offered \$50, and another citizen had offered to secure a further \$50, as a nucleus of a fund for a nursery team match. (Applause.)

Lt.-Colonel Hood: "I am authorized by a Montreal gentleman to offer \$100 to the ten highest men on the Bisley hundred at this meeting, if they will shoot over Queen's ranges and average 90 points." (Laughter and applause.)

Major Hughes said a Toronto gentleman had offered to contribute towards a nursery aggregate prize fund.

Captain J. T. Hartt said he cordially agreed with the suggestion of an aggregate for *bona fide* Nursery men. He thought a good step had been taken this year in reducing the minimum of the prize to bar entry, and he would like to see the move followed up. In his own province, New Brunswick, the Nursery aggregate match was productive of very good results.

Major McSpadden urged a veterans' match, for officers and men over sixty years of age, some of whom found it too hard work to keep up with the younger shots. "A man they call Ronan," he said, "has some kind of a new waggon wheel that he hangs in front of him to keep his sights straight, and if the old gentlemen had something like this to help them I am sure they would do well enough."

A "LORDS AND COMMONS" MATCH.

Lt.-Colonel Hood announced that in view of the presence of Parliament in Ottawa at this meeting, the Executive had framed a match for teams from the Senate and House of Commons, after the

pattern of the Lords and Commons Match at Bisley. The teams were to consist of six on each side, and the match would be fired on Thursday afternoon.

Major McSpadden expressed the hope that these gentlemen would be armed with weapons from the racks of some of our country battalions. (Laughter and applause.)

THE SQUADDING.

Captain Hartt reminded the competitors that at their meeting last year they had passed a resolution asking for indiscriminate squadding, and as their wish had been very satisfactorily carried out at this meeting he thought they should pass a resolution of appreciation, which he accordingly moved.

Lieutenant Sutherland seconded the resolution, and commended also the change whereby the firing points and butts were indicated on the tickets, in place of requiring the range officers to allot the tickets, to the neglect of their proper duties.

The Chairman having put the motion, it was carried with general applause. In tendering the vote to Lt.-Colonel Bacon, Lt.-Colonel White said it gave him much personal satisfaction to do so, and he was sure the Secretary would be gratified to know that the competitors appreciated the result of the pains he had taken in this connection.

Lt.-Colonel Bacon briefly acknowledged the vote, and incidentally begged that the natural difficulties in connection with the squadding should not be increased by requiring him to separately allot the right and left hand shots. (Laughter.)

TEAM ENTRIES.

Major Hughes asked if the affiliation fee of \$12 might not with advantage be reduced. He said now that unlimited team entries were allowed in the Association match, there was a temptation for small associations to club together and pay only one affiliation fee. If this could not be reduced, he suggested that only one team entry be allowed from each association, but unlimited teams from any one corps should be allowed in the Dominion of Canada match.

THE LATE LIEUT. E. A. MACNACHTAN.

Lt.-Col. Tilton moved a resolution of regret at the recent death of Lieut. E. A. Macnachtan, of the Cobourg Garrison Artillery. He made a touching reference to the deceased as one of the best known and most respected riflemen in Canada, and one of the most faithful workers who had ever served on the Council of the Association. The mover had become intimately acquainted with Lieut. Macnachtan when, in 1882, he commanded the Wimbledon team, of which deceased was adjutant, and he felt therefore that it was all the more appropriate for him to move this resolution.

The Chairman, in putting the resolution, said he heartily concurred in all that had been said. He was sure that the disappearance of the familiar figure of Lieut. Macnachtan from amongst the range officers was very generally deplored.

THE MEMBERS' MEETING.

Lt.-Colonel Tilton said that on behalf of the Council he desired to express their thanks to the competitors for attending at this meeting and the suggestions made for improving the arrangements.

Major Hughes said this brought to his mind the distinction made between members and associate members, and the fees of \$2 and \$1 charged respectively. He thought that if the membership fee were \$1 and the annual meeting of members were more generally made known, there would be a larger attendance. As it was, very few bore in mind the fact that the annual business meeting was held the third Wednesday after the opening of Parliament.

Major McSpadden said that in passing a vote of thanks they should not forget Lt.-Colonel John Macpherson, the Treasurer, who no doubt was prevented from attending to-night. That gentleman had given great attention, as usual, to getting the camp and the tents ready for the visiting riflemen, and deserved to be remembered by them. He moved a vote of thanks, which was seconded by Staff-Sergt. Bell and heartily accorded.

Major McSpadden then moved a vote of thanks to Lt.-Colonel

White for his services in the chair. Lt.-Colonel Bacon put the motion, which being carried with applause, the Chairman spoke briefly in acknowledgment. He said he had been a member of the Association since the beginning, and always would be found ready to do his best in its interest.

The meeting then adjourned.

REGULATIONS.

The Prize Meeting of the Association will be conducted by a Special Committee of five members (three to form a quorum), appointed by the Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other Members of Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or that of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding, but they or a majority of them may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS.

1. *Competitors must make themselves acquainted with the Regulations, as also with the conditions of any match for which they have entered, as in neither case will the plea of ignorance be entertained.*
2. *Competitors must refer to the Notice Board morning and afternoon, to ascertain whether orders have been issued altering the original detail of the shooting, or affecting them seriously.*
3. *Competitors must, when at the firing point, comply with all orders given by the range officers on duty.*

GENERAL REGULATIONS.

- I.—No Active Militiaman shall shoot as a member of more than one corps.
- II.—No Officer, Non-commissioned Officer or Private, employed by the D.R.A. for duty at the firing points, or in the butts, shall shoot either for a prize or for practice.
- III.—In competitions restricted to Active Militiamen, or in which they shoot as such, the uniform of their corps shall be worn, in accordance with the Regulations and Orders for the Militia, viz.:—
 - a. Tunic, patrol or regulation fatigue jacket, Elbow caps of leather or other material will not be allowed.
 - b. Trousers.

c. Regimental head dress, or a cap cover, with or without a cap under it. Cap covers or puggarees may be worn over the regimental full or undress cap, and great coats or waterproofs over uniforms.

Officers of a corps must all appear dressed in the same order, as must also Non-commissioned Officers and Privates. Where a duly authorized undress for officers exists, they (the officers) may appear in it, although the Non-commissioned Officers and Privates may be in full dress. *Waist belts must be worn, except when firing.*

d. In competitions not restricted to the Active Militia competitors must appear strictly in uniform as above, or wholly in plain clothes. (See Reg. XIX c.)

NOTE.—In "Military Matches" the above rules shall not apply, as special details for dress are issued.

IV.—All protests or objections shall be made at once to the Secretary or Range Officers on duty, and, when practicable, in writing. When a protest is in the first place made verbally, it must subsequently be put in writing, and handed to the Secretary not later than one hour after the occurrence on which the protest is founded, and the Executive Committee reserve the right to refuse or accept any protest received or presented after the expiration of that time.

V.—Competitors must submit their rifles and ammunition for inspection whenever required.

VI.—Fixed or artificial rests will not be allowed, except in the Skirmishing Matches.

VII.—Competitors shall only use the mats provided by the Association. Cork beds and elbow rests will not be allowed.

VIII.—No wiping out between shots will be permitted.

IX.—"Blowing off" shall not be permitted at the firing points, or after competitors have taken their position for firing. Pits will be provided at places near the firing points where competitors can "blow off" before joining their squads on presentation of a "blow off" ticket, which will be sold for five cents each, and include the cost of one round of ammunition, to be obtained from the person in charge on delivery of ticket.

X.—No competitor shall load until he has taken his position at the firing point, and the Register Keeper has given the word, "All Clear."

XI.—Slings may be used in all matches, but they must be of the Government length and pattern, white, brown or black, and attached to the rifles as in Government arms.

XII.—In individual competitions—Competitors may use a binocular or telescope, *not mounted on any kind of stand*, provided their doing so causes no delay in the shooting.

XIII.—After a competitor has taken his place at the firing point, no person, except the Register Keeper, or an Officer on duty, will be permitted to speak to him.

XIV.—In *matches* where both team and *individual prizes* are being competed for, *coaching* of any kind is strictly prohibited.

XV.—In *Matches* where the prizes are offered to *teams only*, the members of each team shooting together will be permitted to “coach” or “spot” for each other, and to use binoculars or telescopes for that purpose, provided their doing so does not delay or impede the shooting. The duly recognized Captain or Adjutant of a team, although not himself shooting, will be permitted to assist his team in like manner, and to appoint spotters to assist him. With the above exception no other persons will be allowed within the ropes, or permitted to offer advice or instruction to the competitors.

XVI.—Any violation of these rules, or any part of them, must be at once reported by the Register Keeper to the officer in charge, who will caution the offender, and on any repetition of the offence shall report the same to the Executive Officer, that the case may be dealt with by the Special Committee as laid down, under the head of “penalties,” and the person or persons offending may be removed from the firing points.

XVII.—PENALTIES--DISQUALIFICATION.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire in a name other than his own; or
- (b) Who shall fire twice for the same prize, unless permitted by the conditions of the competition to do so; or
- (c) Who shall intentionally discharge his rifle at the wrong target; or
- (d) Who shall offer money, or a bribe of any kind, to any employee of the Association, under any pretence whatever; or
- (e) Who being cognizant of any attempt to defraud the Association shall fail to report the same with due diligence to the Council, Executive or Special Committee; or

- (f) Who shall be guilty of any conduct which the Council, Executive or Special Committee may consider discreditable ; or
- (g) Who shall be reported to the Council, Executive or Special Committee as having been elsewhere guilty of such conduct, or the aforesaid offences ; or
- (h) Who shall directly or indirectly make any arrangement with any other competitor for pooling or dividing any prize, shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Council, Executive or Special Committee, or on the receipt of such report from any affiliated or duly recognized Association, forfeit all his entrance fees and prizes, and be disqualified from competing at any Prize Meeting of the Association until reinstated.

XVIII.—EXCLUSION FROM FURTHER COMPETITION DURING THE MEETING.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fire when the danger signal is up ; or
 - (b) Who shall discharge his rifle on the range except in accordance with the regulations for shooting ; or
 - (c) Who shall be found with a loaded rifle, except when at his proper firing point and engaged in competing ; or
 - (d) Who from a proper want of care discharges his rifle accidentally. [If such discharge is due to a defect in his rifle an ample and satisfactory explanation must be given] ; or
 - (e) Who shall alter or make any erasures on his firing ticket ; or
 - (f) Who shall act in any way that might prove dangerous ;
- shall, upon the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, be excluded from all further competition at the meeting, and shall forfeit all his entrance fees.

XIX.—DISALLOWANCE OF SCORES.

Any competitor—

- (a) Who shall fail to comply with the conditions laid down for any particular prize ; or with the orders of the Executive or Range Officers ; or
 - (b) Who shall infringe any of the instructions and regulations for the conduct of the meeting while shooting for any particular prize ; or
 - (c) Who shall shoot dressed partly in uniform and partly in plain clothes. (See Reg. III. d) ;
- shall, on the occurrence being proved to the satisfaction of the Special Committee, have his score for that particular prize disallowed, and if such disallowance refers to the Grand Aggregate, he shall also forfeit all claim to shoot in the Governor General's Match.

XX.—FINES.

Any competitor who shall accidentally fire at the wrong target shall be fined one dollar, to be paid forthwith to the Range Officer.

In cases where a competitor is "excluded from further competition," or where his "score is disallowed," for any particular prize, the *circumstances only* under which the penalty was incurred shall be posted on the notice board, as a warning to others, without the NAME of the individual implicated.

In case of "disqualification," the NAME of the offender as well as the particulars of the case shall be posted on the notice board.

XXI.—MITIGATION OF PENALTIES.

The Special Committee shall have power to vary, mitigate or remit any of the above penalties.

XXII.—PRIZE WINNERS.

- (a) Unless otherwise specified, no one will be allowed to take more than one prize in any competition.
- (b) Winners of prizes will, on signing the official prize list, receive the amount or amounts due to them from the Treasurer of the Association.
- (c) If a formal presentation of prizes takes place, winners, being Active Militiamen, must parade in the full dress uniform of their corps.
- (d) All Challenge Cups and Shields must be returned to the Secretary on or before the 15th August, 1892.

XXIII.—DISTANCES AND TARGETS.

XXIV.—SIGNALLING—SCORING.

1. The signalling will be as follows:
 - (a) Bull's Eye, Counting.....5..... White disc.
 - (b) Inner, "4..... Red disc.
 - (c) Magpie, "3..... Black and White disc.
 - (d) Outer, "2..... Black disc.
 - (e) Ricochet, "R..... Black bar.
 - (f) *Misses* will *not* be signalled; but if a target is lowered under the impression that it has been hit, and if no hit is found on it, after raising it the marker will wave a *black* disc, to signify that the target has not been struck.
2. When *two* shots strike a target simultaneously, that which has the highest value will alone be signalled with the *signal disc*, and the competitor whose proper turn it was to fire at the target will be credited with the shot, provided he has fired. *Both shots will*, however, be shown by spotting discs.
3. On a target being lowered, the position of a hit, if any, will be shown by the spotting disc when the target is again raised.
4. The signalling shall not be questioned, but if a shot is not signalled, and the officer in charge of the firing points be satisfied that a reasonable doubt exists as to whether the shot may have struck the target, he may call on the officer in charge at the butt to examine the target, and the result of such examination as signalled shall be final. Any competitor challenging a shot shall deposit the sum of *fifty cents* with the officer in charge at the firing point, which shall be forfeited in case no hit is found on the target.
5. If on a target being raised the *spotting disc* appears manifestly to disagree with the *signal disc*, the Register Keeper shall stop the firing at the target, and report the circumstances to the Range Officer, who shall decide the shot after enquiry of the officer in charge at the butt, but no deposit will be required, nor shall there be any appeal from the decision given.
6. All claims for shots signalled *must be made before* another shot is fired at the target in question.
7. If at the moment at which a competitor fires, his target should be lowered in such a manner as to falsify the result of his shot, the Range Officer is empowered to cancel the result of such shot, and to permit the competitor to fire another shot in its place.

XXV.

The rifles shall be Snider (Long or Short) and Martini-Henry rifles, either of Government issue or of *bona fide* Government pattern, and bearing the Government viewer's mark.

1. Weight of Snider not to exceed, without bayonet, 9 lbs. 12 oz.
Weight of Martini-Henry, without bayonet, not to exceed 9 lbs.
2. No pad or shoe for the heel plate will be allowed.
3. Minimum pull of trigger, 6 lbs.
4. Sights to be strictly in accordance with those of the Government issue. Filed sights will not be allowed.
8. All alterations of the register must be initialled by the Officer making them, but no alterations, except in the case of a clerical error, shall be made without his having first signalled to the but.
9. No person will be permitted to go to and examine a target during the meeting except the Executive Officer or such person or persons as he may duly authorize to do so in his behalf.

In Skirmishing.

When the number of hits counted on the target exceeds the number of shots allowed in the competition, three marks shall be deducted for every such hit in excess of the number of such shots, unless it be proved that such hits on the target in excess of the number of shots allowed could only have been made by competitors in the squad firing more than the authorized number of rounds, in which case the squad shall be disqualified.

- (a) All sights may be temporarily blackened or whitened, but black and white must not be mixed so as to produce grey, and no application of colour will be allowed after the competitor has taken his position at the firing point.

No application of a permanent nature will be allowed.

No shading of sights will be permitted.

- (b) The *back sight* may be tilted forward or backward, or supported at any angle by an extemporized means.

- (c) The sliding bar may be inverted and used on either side of the uprights. *One* permanent centre line for the Snider, and *three* for the Martini Henry will be allowed, and temporary marks or lines of any kind removable at pleasure may be used, but not consisting of slips of paper or other substance capable of being shifted or removed.

XXVI.—AMMUNITION.

None but the ammunition issued or sold by the D. R. A. on the ground shall be used or allowed.

XXVII.

Unless otherwise specified the shooting at all ranges shall be from the firing points, and may be in any position, with the head to the target.

In the Standing position the whole of the left hand must be in front of the trigger guard, and the left elbow clear of the body.

XXVIII.—ORDER OF SHOOTING.

1. Competitors must be present at the firing points punctually at the time detailed on their tickets, otherwise they will not be allowed to shoot; the time to be regulated by the clock in the Secretary's office. "Blowing off" and all other preliminaries must be completed beforehand, and will not be allowed as excuses for delay.
2. In all ordinary competitions competitors shall, when possible, be formed up by threes and fire shot and shot *alternately*.
3. When but *one* competitor is present, he shall fire his shots without undue delay; but the officer in charge of the firing point, or *some one named by him*, must witness the shooting, and countersign the register. Failing such verification the score will be invalidated. Any person present whom the competitor may name will watch the score recorded, and if need be raise objection *before* the next shot is fired.
4. No two competitors shall shoot in any competition, except in Martini matches, with the same rifle; nor shall a competitor change his rifle at any range during a competition, unless his first rifle should become unserviceable through an accident, which must be verified by the Officer in charge.
5. The competitor must, after delivering each shot, pay attention to the score called out by the Register Keeper, and himself see that such score is correctly entered on the Register, so that any objection to *the score recorded* may be investigated before the next shot is fired.
6. In the case of unreasonable delay in firing on the part of any competitor, or such delay as the Range Officer may consider likely to prolong the firing beyond the time allowed, the Range Officer shall have the right to caution and time the competitor by a sand glass purporting to run one minute, more or less, and if after such caution the competitor does not fire before the sand glass has run out, the Range Officer shall declare the shot forfeited and call on the next competitor to proceed with his firing.

XXIX.—TIES.

A. *In Individual Competitions for a Series of Prizes.*

1. If at more than one distance by the range totals in inverse order, commencing at the longest range.

2. By the fewest *outers*.

3. By the fewest *magpies*.

4. By the fewest *inners*.

5. By the value of each shot in inverse order.

In the case of ABSOLUTE TIES.

(a) If for PRIZES IN KIND, by shooting off, as in clause B.

(b) In the case of a prize PART IN KIND AND PART IN MONEY, by shooting off for the Prize in Kind and dividing Money.

These sub-sections apply also to competitions at single distances. Where a "possible score" is made, the maker shall fire three shots immediately after.

N.B.—In all competitions the order of the winners shall be decided by the foregoing rules, if possible, but in the case of absolute ties the names shall be arranged alphabetically and bracketted.

B. *In Individual Competitions for a single Prize.*

1. By the aggregate score in five rounds at the longest distance.

2. By firing single shots until decided.

Absentees shall forfeit their claim to shoot.

C. *In Team Competitions.*

1. If at more than one distance, by the aggregate range totals in inverse order.

2. By the fewest *outers*.

3. By the fewest *magpies*.

4. By the fewest *inners*.

5. By the highest scorers in each team shooting off, as in Clause B.

D. *Grand Aggregate.*

1. By the total score in each match in inverse order.

2. By the total scores at 600 yards.

3. By the *total scores at 500 yards.*
4. By the *total scores at 400 yards.*
5. By shooting off, as in Clause B.

In the Governor-General's Match scores of equal numerical value shall be treated and placed by the before stated Rule B.

E. *In cases not met by the foregoing.*

1. By any *special rule attached to the conditions.*
2. By the *fiat of the Committee.*

XXX.—ENTRIES.

The Executive and Special Committees reserve to themselves the power of refusing any Entry for any match, or of cancelling at any moment any entry that may have been previously accepted.

The privilege of Entry is restricted to members who have paid their subscription (\$2.00), and to associate members, who pay the fee of \$1.00 at the time of entry.

1. Entries for the several competitions shall close on days to be named by the Committee.
 2. Every competitor shall enter and shoot under his own name, and not oftener than once for any prize, unless specially allowed by the terms of the competition.
 3. No entry shall be accepted after the hour fixed for the commencement of the competition to which admission is sought.
 4. Entries shall be classified :
 - (a) Ordinary (at the published rate of entrance fees). To include those made and received by the Secretary of the D. R. A. on or before 4 p.m., Wednesday, 26th August.
 - (b) Post (at an increased charge of 20 per cent. on the published rate of entrance fees). To include those made or received after 4 p.m., Wednesday, 26th August.
- N B.—The acceptance of Post Entries will be entirely governed by circumstances. As a rule the privilege will be withdrawn as soon as the target accommodation allotted for each competition is absorbed, and whenever the Special Committee may determine.

2 To meet the case where difficulty may be experienced in selecting the actual competitors in sufficient time to make the required

entries by the 26th August, Officers commanding corps and Secretaries of Provincial or Local Associations will be permitted to send in their application for (state No.) competitors, accompanying such application with the amount of the entrance fees; and to postpone the rendering of the actual names of those for whom they make the entries, until the selection of the competitors is definitely made. In such cases the Register Tickets will not be issued before the nominal return is handed to the Secretary. Any payment made for entries in excess of the number of competitors nominated will be returned in full, as provided for in the following regulations:

XXXI.—RETURN OF ENTRANCE FEES.

1. Entrance Fees in full will be returned to those—
 - (a) Who are prevented from being present at the meeting; or
 - (b) Who attend the meeting but are incapacitated from illness or accident; or
 - (c) Whose entries the Executive or Special Committee may have cancelled.
2. Claims based on other consideration than the above will, if allowed, be subject to a penalty of half forfeit.

XXXII.—SQUADDING.

1. In the case of competitors classified as ordinary entries, arrangements will be made and details published of the day, hour and target at which each competitor will be required to attend to fulfil his engagements.

XXXIII.—ALTERATIONS OF SQUADDING.

1. Any alteration which the Executive Officer may find it necessary to make will be duly notified on the notice board, and such notice shall be a sufficient authority for the change. In the absence of such notice, tickets will be available only for the target for which they were originally issued, and any erasure or alteration, unless verified by the initials of the Secretary or Executive Officer, will cancel the ticket.
2. The place of publication of all notices affecting the detail of shooting shall be the board fixed without the tent of the Secretary, and the posting of a notice on such board must be taken and accepted as a good service on all affected thereby.

XXXIV.—REGISTER TICKETS.

1. Should a competitor lose his ticket, or omit to take it to the firing point, or fail to attend at the hour detailed, or give a wrong ticket, and so by *his own neglect* miss the opportunity of competing for

the prize for which his ticket was issued, he shall forfeit his claim on the Association in regard to such competition, and no duplicate ticket shall be issued to him except under special circumstances.

2. Any erasure or substitution of one name for another, unless made by the Secretary or Executive Officer, shall invalidate the ticket.

The Council reserve the right to alter, amend or rescind any of the foregoing regulations as circumstances may require.

CONSTITUTION.

ADOPTED AT ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

1. That the Association be denominated "THE DOMINION OF CANADA RIFLE ASSOCIATION."

2. Any person being a subscriber of \$2.00, and paying the same before the first day of September, or the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting, shall become a member of the Association for the current Association year, and any member may continue his membership by the annual payment of \$2.00.

Any person may become an Associate Member of the Association for the current year upon payment of the sum of \$1.00, and shall have the privilege of taking part in the annual matches, but shall not be entitled to vote at any meeting of the Association.

3. Donors of \$10.00 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less value, to be competed for at the Annual Prize Meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as Life Members of the Association, they having the full rights and privileges of ordinary members, and their names to be published in the Annual Reports.

Donors of money or prizes in kind of Five Dollars value and upwards, but less than Forty Dollars, shall be entitled to be enrolled as members for the year in which they contribute to the Prize Fund, with rights and privileges of membership.

4. Any Provincial Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$25.00 annually, and any other Rifle Association of the Dominion subscribing not less than \$12.00 annually, to the funds of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it. Each Affiliating Association shall be entitled to receive a Silver Medal for competition by its *bona fide* members. The winner of such medal, being an efficient member of the Active Militia, or an officer retired retaining rank, to be entitled to compete free of entrance fee in the "Dominion of Canada and "Affiliated Association" matches at the first Prize Meeting of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association

at which he is present after he wins the medal; provided always that the name of the winner and details of the matches at which it is won shall have been communicated to the Secretary of the D. C. Rifle Association not later than the first day of such prize meeting.

5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patron, to be named by the Council.

The Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada for the time being shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."

6. There shall be a President, to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Association.

7. There shall be a Vice-President for each Province, to be elected in the same manner as the President.

8. There shall be a Council of members of the Association, who shall be elected in the following proportions:

Fourteen	[14]	from Ontario,
Ten	[10]	" Quebec,
Six	[6]	" New Brunswick,
Six	[6]	" Nova Scotia,
Four	[4]	" Manitoba,
Four	[4]	" British Columbia,
Four	[4]	" Prince Edward Island,
Two	[2]	" each of the North-West Territories so soon as Associations are formed therein and affiliated with the Dominion Rifle Association, as Provincial Associations,

one-half in each to be elected at the Annual Business Meeting of the Dominion Association, the other half by the Provincial Associations of the respective Provinces at their Annual Meeting; the names of those elected by the Provincial Association to be notified to the Secretary of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association on or before the day of the Annual Business Meeting each year. Six members of the Council shall form a quorum.

9. The Council shall at its first meeting choose from its own members the Chairman of the Council.

10. The Council shall annually elect at its first meeting an Executive Committee, consisting of fifteen (15) of its members, and in the event of a vacancy occurring therein during its term of office, the same

may be filled up by the Executive Committee from the members of the Council. Five (5) to be a quorum. The President of the Association and Chairman of the Council shall be *ex-officio* members of the Executive Committee.

11. The Presidents of the various Provincial Associations in connection with the Association, and the Deputy Adjutants General commanding districts, *being members* of the Dominion Rifle Association, shall be *ex-officio* Vice-Presidents, and all Vice-Presidents shall be members of the Council.

12. There shall be a Treasurer and a Secretary at Ottawa, both to be appointed annually by the Council, and holding office during pleasure, who shall receive such compensation for their services as may be voted by the Council.

13. The Council shall have the arrangement of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting, such account having been previously audited by a person or persons, not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

14. The Executive Committee shall give effect to such instruction as the Council may from time to time order, respecting the management of the affairs of the Association.

15. The Council may from time to time make such rules for their guidance as they deem necessary.

16. The Annual Prize Meeting shall be held at Ottawa, at such time and under such regulations as may be determined on by the Executive Committee, as to all points not previously decided upon by the Council; and such Prize Meeting of the Association shall be conducted by a Special Committee of five members, three to form a quorum, appointed by Executive Committee, either from the Executive Committee or other members of the Council, with power of substitution by the Executive Committee from time to time as occasion may demand, and said Special Committee shall have power to hear and determine all matters arising at the meeting submitted for their consideration, and their decision, or the decision of a majority of them, shall be final, conclusive and binding; but they, or a majority of them, may at their discretion refer any question to the Executive Committee, in which case the decision of the Executive Committee shall be final.

17. An Annual Report, embracing an audited account of the Finances shall be drawn up by the Secretary under the direction of the Council, and shall be published and sent to members of the Association at least one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting.

18. The Annual Business Meeting of the Members of the Association for the Election of Officers and the Council, and the transaction of other business, shall be held at Ottawa, on the third Wednesday after the assembling of the General Session of Parliament of the Dominion. At the close of such Annual Meeting or an adjournment thereof the Association year will terminate.

19. A General Meeting shall be held on the second day of the Annual Prize Meeting for the discussion of all matters that may be brought forward by any member or competitor attending the matches, but no changes in the Constitution shall be made except at the Annual Business Meeting.

20. No alteration in the Constitution shall be made except by a resolution duly passed at the Annual Business Meeting, or some adjournment thereof, and no such resolution shall be proposed unless a notice in writing of the terms of such resolution, signed by two members as proposer and seconder thereof, shall have been given to the Secretary one month previous to the Annual Business Meeting at which the same is to be proposed, and it shall be the duty of the Secretary to immediately notify all Members of the Association of such proposed amendments.

21. The Council shall have power to fill any vacancy occasioned by death or resignation in their number, from among the members of the Association

General By-Laws of the Association.

ADOPTED AT

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING, 1877.

There shall be two Ordinary Meetings of the Council, Meeting of Council. The first of which shall be held immediately after the Annual Business Meeting of the Association, and the second, on the first day of the Annual Prize Meeting.

Extraordinary Meetings shall be summoned by the Extraordinary Meetings. Secretary, if required by the Chairman, or by any four of the Members of the Council, at such place as the Chairman may direct—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least fifteen days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such Extraordinary Meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at The Council to keep minutes of all proceedings. all Meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to inspection of any Member of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of Finance Committee. three Members of the Council, to be chosen at the first meeting.

The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, in such Treasurer to deposit sums received in Savings Banks. chartered bank as the Finance Committee may direct, all sums of money received by him on behalf of the Association.

Expenditure of sums for current expenses. All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary must be authorized by the signature of the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by some of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Expenditure of a general nature. Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

Annual Accounts. A detailed statement of all receipts and expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer, made up to and closed on the 30th November.
