



MY LESSON STORY THIS WEEK.







Here, he called some more of his disciples to be his followers. One Sabbath day he performed some wonderful miracles. Amongst others he healed Peter's wife's mother of a fever. Then, he and his disciples went for a journey through Galilee, healing the people and teaching them, after which he went back to Capernaum. While there, the people brought their sick friends to him, and he made them well. Amongst others, there was one man who had a dreadful disease called palsy, and was not able to walk; so four of his friends had to carry him. They laid him on a kind of thick quilt, or mattrass, and one man took hold of each corner, and in that way carried him. As they came near the house where Jesus was, they found so many people around it, that they could not get in at the door, but they wanted so much to have him healed, that they carried him up the stairs, which were on the outside of the house, and lowered him down through the roof.

When Jesus saw how anxious they were to have the man cured, he not only cured him, but also forgave his sins. 

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OT long after healing the man who was sick with the palsy, Jesus made a journey to Jerusalem. While there he performed a wonderful miracle, he healed a sick man at the pool of Bethesda.

When the leaders of the Jews saw his great power they became envious of him, and began to hate him. Jesus did not stay long in Jerusalem at that time, but went back to Galilee. He had two very important things to do: he wanted to choose twelve disciples, and then to speak the wonderful words that we have in our lesson to-day.

The night before he did these things, he went up into a mountain and prayed all the night. (If Jesus needed to pray how much more do we?) The next morning great crowds of people came to him, and he taught them. It seems as if some of the people had been calling him "Lord, Lord," meaning that he was their master, but when he told them what they ought to do, they did not do it. Perhaps they were like some children who came to Sunday school, and say that Jesus is their Lord and king, but when they are at home, or at play, or at school, they do not obey this Lord and king. To shew these people how foolish they were, Jesus told them a story about a man who built a house upon the sand, and as soon as the storm came it was washed away. Then he told them of another man who built his house upon the solid rock, and when the storms came they did not wash it away, because it was built upon such a good foundation. People who hear the words of Jesus, and do not obey them, are like the foolish man, who built his house upon the sand. But people, who, hearing the words of Jesus, obey them, are like the wise man who built his house upon the rock. Let us children learn not only to hear but to obey.







MY LESSON STORY THIS WEEK.

S Jesus was once more approaching Jerusalem, he was asked a question by a certain lawyer. These lawyers were learned men, and tried to get such hard questions that Jesus could not answer them. Jesus answered this question by telling the man that he should love God and his neighbour as himself. Then the man asked him another question which he thought Jesus could not answer, it was this, "Who is my neighbour?" Jesus wanted to teach him (as he wants to teach us) that everybody in the whole world was his neighbour, and that he should love everybody just as much as he loved himself. A true neighbour is one who loves us. If we want to be true neighbours to other people in the world, we must love them. But the lawyer did not want to understand, so Jesus told him this story. A man was going from Jerusalem to Jericho. The road was rough and dangerous. Some thieves stopped him and wounded him, and stripped him, leaving him half dead. By chance a priest passed by that way and saw the wounded man lying there, he did not stop to help him, but passed him by. Then a levite passed along, he too, saw the wounded man, and went up and looked at him, but would not help him. Both of these pretended to be good men, and it would be expected that they would have helped him, but they did not. A third man then came up to him-a Samaritan, from whom little might be expected, he had pity for him, went up to him, bound up his wounds, poured oil and wine upon them to make them well, set him upon his beast, took him to an inn and paid the keeper for taking care of him. When Jesus had finished telling this story, he asked the lawyer which of these three was the neighbour to the man who fell among thieves? The lawyer had to say it was the Samaritan, although he did not want to, for the Jews had no dealings with the Samaritans, and the lawyer was a Jew.

MY LESSON STORY THIS WEEK.

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ESUS prayed much. Sometimes he would spend a whole night on the mountain praying. If Jesus needed to pray much, we need to do so more. The disciples seemed to have learned this, and one time when Jesus had finished praying, they said to him, "Lord, teach us how to pray." Then it was that Jesus taught them what we call "the Lord's prayer," which we have for our lesson to day.

Let us see what this prayer means. It is divided into eight parts.

First-"Our Father which art in heaven." Let us remember that we are praying to a loving father, who made the beautiful world and everything that is in it. Second—" Hallowed be Thy name." God, Father, Holy Spirit, Christ, and Jesus, are names which we should reverence and love. Third-"Thy kingdom come." Here we pray that the kingdom of Jesus may drive out the kingdom of Satan from the world. That Jesus may be the king of every heart. Let us be sure that he is king of our hearts. Fourth-" Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." This means that we want God to do as he thinks best with us, not our way, but God's way is what we pray for. Fifth-"Give us this day our daily bread," means that we ask God from day to day for our food. Sixth—"And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors." We need not expect God to forgive us, unless we forgive others, for in this prayer we do not ask any more. Let us be sure that we are willing to forgive everybody, so that we may be forgiven. Seventh-"And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil." Here we pray that God will guide us, and keep us away from the danger of doing wrong, but if we fall into temptation because we do not allow God to guide us, we pray that he will shield us, and bring us back to himself.

MY LESSON STORY THIS WEEK.

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LL this quarter we have been learning about Jesus. Now we have come to the last lesson. Jesus taught his disciples about himself. In one of our lessons he told them that he must be put to death, but that some day He would come back again and live with them. He wanted His disciples and He wants us to be always watching.

He told His disciples that those servants are blessed, whom, the Lord when He cometh, shall find watching. He told them that He would make a feast for them and that he himself would serve them. He also wanted to show them that there was danger in not keeping watch over their thoughts, words and actions, and told them that if when he came he found them watching, carefully guarding their thoughts, carefully choosing their words and doing the things that Jesus would like them to do, he would make them rulers for him. Jesus teaches us that we must watch Satan, for he comes when we are not expecting him, like a thief in the night. He tempts boys and girls with little habits of wrong doing; he tells them to say "Pretty soon" when Mamma asks to have something done at once. He gets them to say "I don't want to" when they know there is something they ought to do. He tempts them to say "I don't like you," when Jesus says that we ought to love everybody. Perhaps he gets them to eat things that are not good for them and even tempts them with the wine cup, and says to them just taste it a little "It's good! It's good!" What he wants them to do is to disobey mother rather than obey her promptly, to hate people rather than to love them and to do what our Golden Text says we ought not to do, be drunken with wine.
