As a result of this loose ness a terrific cry has been raised against the list as originally prepared. To quiet this row and for the evident purpose of keeping himself in good favor with everyone, if possible, Commissioner Ross has issued an arbitrary ruling which places on the lists at one fell swoop some six hun dred additional names.

Irrespective of the legal aspect the situation, it must be seen at a glance that the method by which the voters' lists have been prepared has absolutely nothing to commend it. Everyone who is at all familiar with the facts in the case knows perfectly on the lists is far in excess of the actual number of voters in the city. fall of 1900, there were in the neigh borhood of 800 votes east in the city of Dawson, and at that election universal suffrage prevailed.

There are almost double the above number of names on the voters' lists at the present time and certain qualifications are required which did not prevail at the former election.

The fault lies principally in the system which has been followed. No individual should be given the authority to arrange the lists as the assessor was permitted to do, and, on the other hand, the governor's action Berries' would be enough? 


