**CANADIAN.**

A winter carnival is being proposed in  
Quebec.

Rein is interfering with the exhibition at  
Regina.

Chatham paid over the \$1,405,000 for  
the local water-works plant on Saturday.

There were 47 deaths during July in  
Hamilton.

The new Mount Hamilton incline rail-  
way has been completed.

Government land at Yalo, B.C., is to  
be offered at \$1 per acre.

Stables and out-buildings on Lord Aber-  
deen's ranch in British Columbia have  
been destroyed by fire.

There are already three cases of murder  
for the September sittings of the Court of  
Queen's Bench at Montreal.

Some important arrests are promised in  
connection with the tobacco smuggling be-  
tween this city, Boston and New York.

Mr. Gladstone, according to Pearson's  
views three acres of land at Niagara Falls,  
worth about \$5,000 per acre.

The new telegraph cable has arrived  
from England for the Grand Lake quan-  
tities. It is a dead end, and is to be  
used for a plant at Kakump in West Kootenay.

Dr. Clark, superintendent of the Rock-  
wood asylum, Kingston, agrees that  
Shortes, the Valleyfield murderer, is in-  
competent to stand trial.

The Government has granted Messrs.

The Customs Department received a bag  
of gold dust to the value of \$4,000 from  
Tiklon in payment of customs duties on  
Saturday.

Mr. Louis Papineau, a descendant of  
the great French-Canadian leader, has sub-  
mitted one hundred dollars towards the  
Chester monument in Montreal.

The Municipal Council of Springfield,  
Mass., has taken action to recover \$1,476  
in taxes from the Roman Catholic church  
authorities of St. Boniface.

It is rumored in Montreal, that, owing  
to some misunderstanding with the author-  
ities, the Rev. Abbe Froula, vice-rector of  
Laval University, has tendered his re-  
signation.

There were twenty-two Chinese women of  
full blood arrested in New York, and sixteen  
who are half-breed. There are nearly 100  
Chinese babies, about two-thirds of whom  
have American citizenship.

Elizabeth Flieger, aged 23, daughter of  
Gen. Flieger, of the United States Ordinance  
Department at Washington, yesterday  
stole a diamond ring and a watch, and was  
sent to the workhouse.

Two men, Frank Butler and Timothy  
McCarthy, of St. John's, N. Y., were  
thrown into the river about the Falls from  
their salted down during a squall on Sat-  
urday, and carried over the Atlantic Falls.

C. H. Bennett, who is now a prisoner in
