

# No. 137.

A By-Law to make provision for the Preservation of Public Morals within the United Counties of York and Peel.

HEREAS, by the provisions of Statute 22 Vic., cap. 54, sec. 282, Consolidated Statutes of Upper Canada, power is given to the Council of every County to pass By-Laws for certain purposes therein mentioned.

The Council of the Corporation of the United Counties of York and Peel, enacts as follows:

- 1. It shall not be lawful for any person to sell or give intoxicating drink to any child, apprentice, idiot, or meane person, without the consent of a parent or legal protector of such child, apprentice, idiot, or insane person; nor shall any person sell or give intoxicating drink to any servant after being forbidden so to do, either verbally or in writing, by his or her employer.
- 2. It shall not be lawful for any person to circulate any indecent placard, writing or picture, or to write any indecent words, or to make any indecent pictures or drawings on any walls or fences in streets, highways or public places.
- 8. It shall not be lawful for any person to utter any profune oath, or obscene, blasphemous or grossly insulting language, or to commit any other immorality or indecency in any street, highway, or other public places.
- 4. It shall not be lawful for any person to be drunk or guilty of any disorderly conduct in any street, highway, or public place, or at any public meeting held for a lawful purpose.

- 5. It shall not be lawful for any person to open or keep a Bowling Alley for lare or profit.
- 6. It shall not be lawful for any person to open or keep a Gambling House in which any Faro Bank, Rouge et Noir, Roulette Table, or other device for gambling is kept; and it shall be the duty of any Peace Officer to seize and destroy any device used for the purpose of gambling when found therein.
  - 7. It shall not be fawful for any person to keep any House of ill-fame.
- 8. It shall not be lawful for any person to bathe or indecently expose his or her person by washing in any waters near any public highway between the hours of seven o'clock in the morning and eight o'clock in the evening, unless provided and clothed in a proper bathing dress sufficient to prevent any indecent exposure of the person.
- 9. Any person found guilty of a violation of any of the provisions of this By-Law shall, upon conviction before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction in these Counties, be liable to a fine of not more than forty dollars, nor less than one dollar, to be collected by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender if not paid forthwith; and in case no goods or chattels are found belonging to such offender, it shall be lawful for any Justice to commit the offender to the Common Jail of the Counties for a period not exceeding twenty days, with or without hard labor, as the said destine may direct.
- 10. One-half of any fine imposed shall be paid to the informer and the other half to the Treasurer of the Municipality in which the offence was committed.
- 11. By-Law No. 125, passed by this Council on the 5th of June, 1863, is hereby repealed, except in so far as it relates to the repeal of By-Law No. 69.
- 1.2. All informations under this By-Law shall be laid within three months from the commission of the offence.

No. 443.

A By-Law to provide for the Election of Warden.

WHEREAS by 46th Vic., Cap. 18, Sec. 223, County Councils shall, at their first meeting in each year, elect one of themselves to be Warden.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

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ts as follows :

1st. After the Clerk has taken the chair fifteen minutes shall be allowed for nominations.

2nd. Five minutes shall be allowed to each mover and seconder to address the Council.

3rd. A member nominated may retire at any time prior to an election.

4th. The vote shall be by ballot, and shall be taken "Yea" and "Nay" separately upon each nominee in the order proposed; any candidate receiving a marrier of ballots equal to the majority of members present shall be declared elected; should none of the candidates proposed receive such majority, the proceedings shall be taken de novo.

No. 553.

A By-Law to provide for searching for and taking materials for keeping in repair the Connty Roads, known as the York Roads.

WHEREAS the Corporation of the County of York are the owners of certain Roads known as Yonge Street, Dundas Road, Kingston Road, and Lake Shore Road.

And whereas it is necessary that the said Corporation of the County of York should search for and take such materials within the Municipality as may be necessary for keeping in repair the said Roads.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York, that the said the Corporation of the County of York may search for and take such timber, gravel, stone, sand, earth, or other material or materials (within the Municipality) as may be necessary for keeping in repair and of the said Roads hereinbefore referred to and commonly known as the York Roads within the said County of York.

Provided always that the right of entry upon any lands for the purposes aforesaid, and the price to be paid for such materials as may be taken for the said purposes, and the price to be paid for the exercise of any of the powers in respect of the metters aforesaid vested by law in the said Corporation shall, if not agreed upon by the parties concerned, be settled by arbitration under the provisions of any law or statute in that behalf.

#### No. 566.

A By-law to provide for the Payment of Reeves and Deputy Reeves attending the County Council or Committees of the same.

WHEREAS by cap. 188, sec. 281, R. S. O., County Councils may pass By-Laws for paying the members for attendance in Council or on Committees.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That the members of the County Council shall be paid the sum of three dollars per day for each day's actual attendance at the sessions thereof, and on Committees, when Council is not in session; also, the sum of ten cents per mile necessarily travelled from their respective residences to the place of meeting; provided that when an adjournment takes place over one day each member shall be entitled to an additional allowance of ten cents per mile for mileage as aforesaid.

2nd. That the Treasurer of this County, on the certificate of the Clerk, be and is hereby authorized and required to pay the indemnity as provided in the first clause of this By-Law.

3rd, That By-laws Nos. 480 and 545, and all other By-laws inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

#### No. 567.

A By-Law to appoint Officials for Industrial Home, and to provide for the payment of the same.

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Municipal Institutions Act of Ontario, the Corporation of the County of York has purchased certain landed property near the Town of Newmarket, in the Township of King, in the said County of York, containing fifty (50) acres more or less, and have erected thereon a House of Industry and Refuge. And whereas, by the provisions of sec. 460, cap. 184, R. S. O., County Councils are authorized to provide by By-Law for the appointment and payment of an Inspector, keeper, matron and physician, and other servants, for the superintendence, care and management of such House of Industry and Refuge.

And whereas it is expedient to pass a By-law to give effect to the above provisions.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

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1st. That J. C. Lundy be and is hereby appointed Inspector of the House of Industry and Refuge, at a salary at the rate of one hundred dollars per annum.

2nd. That the Inspector shall enter into a bond with two or more good and sufficient sureties in the sum of fifteen hundred dollars for the due performance of all duties pertaining to his office. The sufficiency of such sureties shall be examined annually by the Finance Committee at the June Session and reported to this County Council.

3rd. That Jared Irwin be and is hereby appointed Keeper of said House of Industry and Refuge, at a sulary at the rate of three hundred dollars per annum, with board and lodgings in the said House at the expense of this Corporation.

4th. That Eliza June Irwin be and is hereby appointed Matron of the said House of Industry and Refuge, at a salary at the rate of two hundred dollars per annum, with board and lodgings in the said House at the expense of this Corporation.

5th. That R. M. Coulter, a legally qualified medical practitioner, be and is hereby appointed Physician to the said House of Industry and Refuge, who shall receive for his services, including all necessary medicines, a salary at the rate of one hundred and seventy-five dollars per annum.

6th. The above mentioned Officers to hold office during the pleasure of this Council; to be paid quarterly, on the 1st days of the months of April, July, October and January in each year, and to be subject to such rules and regulations as may, from time to time, be made by this Council.

7th. That By-laws Nos. 453, 466, 500 and 529, and all other By-laws of this Council inconsistent with this By-law, be and the same are hereby repealed.

No. 568.

A By-law to Reward Persons for Apprehending Parties Guilty of Horse-Stealing.

WHEREAS by cap. 184, sec. 494, R.S.O., 1887, every County Council shall pass a By law to reward persons for apprehending parties guilty of horse stealing.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That the sum of twenty dollars shall be paid out of the funds of this Municipality, by the County Treasurer, to any person or persons who shall pursue and appre-

hend, or cause to be apprehended, any person or persons guilty of stealing any horse or mare within this County; such reward to be paid only on the conviction of the thief, on the order of the Judge before whom the conviction is obtained.

2nd. That By-Law No. 438 be and the same is hereby repealed.

No. 569.

A By-law to appoint Inspectors of Public Schools and Examiners for the County of York, divide the County into two Territorial Districts for Purposes of School Inspection, fix Remuneration of Public School Inspectors, etc.

WHEREAS by the Revised Statutes of Ontario, cap. 225, sec. 176, and sub-sections thereto, it is the duty of County Councils to appoint one or more persons to be Inspector or Inspectors of Public Schools in the County, and to prescribe and number the territorial limits of each.

And whereas, under and by virtue of the provision of sec. 168 of aforesaid chapter 225, County Councils are empowered to appoint a Board of Examiners for their respective Counties.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

1st. That for purposes of inspection of Public Schools the County of York be and the same is hereby divided into two territorial districts, to be known respectively as the Northern and Southern Districts, and to be bounded as follows, that is to say: The Northern District shall be composed of the Townships of Georgina, North Gwillimbury, East Gwillimbury, Whitchurch, King, and so much of the Township of Vaughan as lies to the north of the side line between lots ten and eleven throughout the respective concessions of that Municipality, also the incorporated towns of Newmarket and Aurora and Villages of Holland Landing and Richmond Hill; and the Southern District shall be composed of the Townships of York, Markham, Scarborough, Etobicoke, and so much of the Township of Vaughan not included in the Northern District, also the incorporated Villages of Markham, Stouffville, Weston, Woodbridge, East Toronto and the Town of North Toronto.

2nd. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid that A. B. Davidson be and he is hereby appointed Inspector of Public Schools for the Northern District; and that David Fothringham be and he is hereby appointed Inspector of Public Schools for the Southern District of the County of York.

Thompson and Robert W. Doan be and the same are hereby appointed Examiners, who, in connection with the Inspectors of Public Schools, shall constitute a Board of Examiners for the County of York.

4th. And be it further enacted that the Inspectors of Public Schools aforecaid, during their continuance in office and no longer, shall receive the sum of five dollars per school per annum for each school inspected by them in their respective districts; also a further sum of sixty dollars to cover travelling expenses, as provided by cap. 225, sec. 181, of the Revised Statutes of Ontario, but not to include the sums allowed by law for the performance of their respective duties as examiners of teachers and examiners for the admission of pupils to the High School; and the Treasurer of this County is hereby authorized and required to pay to said Inspectors the above respective sums in four quarterly installments, upon the certificates of said Inspectors that they have faithfully performed their said duties.

5th. And be it further enacted that all school returns by Trustees of Public Schools in that portion of the Township of Vaughan situate or lying in the Southern District of this County, as provided in the first section of this By-law, made to the Inspector of the Southern District, shall be handed over to the Inspector of the Northern District, who shall made all returns of Public Schools required by law for the Township of Vaughan to the Education Department.

6th. And be it further enacted that By-laws Nos. 485, 461, 470 and 488, and all other By-laws inconsistent with this By Law, be and the same are hereby repealed.

# No. 570.

A By-law to define High School Districts, and Repeal all former By-Laws inconsistent therewith.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Counneil of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That the Villages of Weston, Markham, Richmond Hill, and Towns of Newmarket and Aurora, be and the same are hereby set apart as five High School Districts. as follows:

District No. 1 to consist of the incorporated Village of Weston.

District No. 2 to consist of the incorporated Village of Markham.

District No. 8 to consist of the incorporated Village of Richmond Hill.

District No. 4 to consist of the incorporated Town of Newmarket.

District No. 5 to consist of the incorporated Town of Aurora.

2nd. And be it further enacted that By-laws Nos. 386, 521 and 537, and all other By-laws of this Corporation inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

A By-Law to amend By-Law No. 279 by striking out the name of J. M. Doan, on the Lake Simeoe Junction Railway Board, as he has removed from the County, and inserting the name of John Λ. Ramsden in lieu thereof.

Be it enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That John A. Ramsden be and is hereby appointed Director on the Lake Simeoe Junction Railway Board, in lieu of J. M. Doan.

2nd. Be it further enacted that By-Laws Nos. 279 and 561 be and the same are hereby repealed.

No. 572.

A By-Law to regulate Driving and Riding on Roads and Bridges in the County of York.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of s. s. 14, Sec. 479 of the Municipal Act, County Councils may pass By-Laws for regulating the driving and riding of horses and other cattle on highways and public bridges, and for preventing racing, immoderate or dangerous driving or riding thereon;

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

1st. It shall not be lawful for any person to engage in or pursue the practice of

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enacts as follows:

immoderate or dangerous driving or racing with horses or other animals, either by riding or driving, running or trotting races on any of the highways in the County.

2nd. In case any person travelling or being upon any highway in the County in charge of a vehicle drawn by one or more horses, or other animals, meet another vehicle drawn as aforesaid, they shall turn out to the right from the centre of the road, allowing the vehicle so met half the road.

3rd. In case any person travelling or being on any highway in charge of a vehicle as aforesaid, or on horseback, be overtaken by any vehicle or horseman travelling at greater speed, the person so overtaken shall turn out to the right and give half the road, and allow the said vehicle or horseman to pass.

4th. In case of one vehicle being met or overtaken by another upon any of the highways in the County, and by reason of the extreme weight of the load on either of the vehicles so meeting, and the driver finds it impracticable to turn out as aforesaid, he or they shall immediately stop, and if required so to do for the safety of the other vehicle, he shall assist the person in charge thereof to pass without damage.

5th. In case any person in charge of a horse or other animal, with or without a vehicle, used as the means of conveyance on any highway as aforesaid, through drunkenness, be unable to ride or drive with safety to other persons travelling on or being on the highway, he or they shall incur the penalties imposed by this By-Law.

6th. All persons travelling upon any highway with a sleigh or sled drawn by one or more horses or other animals, shall have at least two bells attached to the horse, harness, or vehicle.

7th. It shall not be lawful for any person to ride or drive any horse or horses or other animal through any body of men assembled on the highways at a faster rate than a walk.

8th. It shall not be lawful for any person or persons to ride or drive with one or more horses or other animals on that portion of the public highways set apart and improved for public sidewalks.

9th. If any person contravenes this By-Law or any part thereof, and such contravention be truly proved by one creditable witness before any Justice of the Peace having jurisdiction in the County, the offender or offenders shall incur a penalty of not less than one dollar or more than twenty dollars, in the discretion of the Justice or Justices, together with the costs.

10th. If the penalty and costs are not paid as ordered by the convicting Justice, he shall issue his warrant to levy by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender or offenders, and the surplus of the sale, if any, after deducting the penalty, costs, and charges of the sale, shall be returned to the owner of the goods on demand.

11th. In default of payment or distress, the offender or offenders shall be imprisoned in the Common Gaol for a period of not less than one day nor more than twenty-one days, at the discretion of the Justice, unless the fine, costs, and charges of committal, be sooner paid.

12th. When the pecuniary penalty has been levied under this Act, one moiety thereof shall go to the informer or prosecutor, and the other moiety to the Local Corporation, unless the prosecution is brought in the name of the Local Corporation, in which case the whole of the pecuniary penalty shall be paid to the Local Corporation.

13th. And be it further enacted that By-Law No. 486, and all other By Laws inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

No. 573.

A By-Law to make Regulations for Governing the Proceedings of Council, &c.

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of the provisions of Cap. 184, Sec. 283, R.S.O., power is given to Councils to make regulations for governing the proceedings of the Council, the conduct of its members, and for calling special meetings.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York, enacts as follows:

1st. In all the proceedings had or taken in the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York, the following shall be the Rules and Regulations for the order and dispatch of business in the Council and in Committee of the Whole.

2nd. The Warden or Chairman shall preserve order and decorum, and shall decide questions of order, subject to an appeal to the Council.

and. When the Warden or Chairman is called upon to decide a point of order or practice, he shall state the rule or authority applicable to the case: if objection is taken to his ruling, he shall submit it to a vote of the Council, in the following words: Shall the ruling of the Chair be sustained.

4th. The Council shall meet each day at ten o'clock a.m., unless otherwise ordered by special motion: if there be a quorum present the Warden shall take the chair and call the members to order, when the Clerk shall call the Roll and read the Minutes of the preceding day of session, to the end that any mistakes therein may be corrected by the Council.

5th. Should the Warden not be in attendance within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for meeting of Conneil, the Clerk may call the meeting to order for the pur pose of appointing a chairman, who shall preside until the arrival of the Warden.

6th. If, at the time appointed for the meeting of the Council, there should be no quorum present, the Warden or Chairman may take the chair, and after the lapse of

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should be no the lapse of fifteen minutes there should still be no quorum, he may a journ the Council; in which case the hour of adjournment and the names of the members present shall be inserted in the Minutes.

7th. When the Council adjourns the members shall keep their seats until the Warden or Chairman has left the chair.

8th. The Minutes of the Council shall consist of a record of the names of all members present or absent at any meeting of the Council, and of all resolutions and proceedings taken in Council.

9th. All Reports adopted and By-Laws passed by the Council shall be printed in the Appendix to the Minutes.

10th. Reports of Committees submitted to the Council and not adopted in their original form may, at the written request of two members of the Committee, be printed in the Appendix to the Minutes, with the words added "not adopted."

11th. If the Warden or Chairman desires to leave the chair to take part in the debate, or for any other purpose, he shall appoint one of the members of the Council to fill his place until he resumes the chair.

# ORDERS OF PROCEEDINGS IN COUNCIL.

12th. Every member desiring to speak is to rise in his place uncovered and address himself to the chair.

13th. When two or more members rise to speak, the Warden or Chairman shall call upon the member who rose first in his place, but the other or others may appeal to the Council, if dissatisfied with the Warden or Chairman's decision, by the question, "Which member was first up," without debate.

14th. No member shall speak twice to a question, except in explanation of a material part of his speech, in which he may have been misconceived, but then he is not to introduce new matter. A reply is only allowed to a member who has made a substantive motion.

15th. No member shall speak beside the question, nor use offensive language against any member of the Council.

16th. Any member may require the motion or question under discussion to be read at any time of the debate, but not to interrupt a member while speaking.

17th. A member called to order from the chair shall sit down, but may afterwards explain. The Council, if appealed to, shall decide on the case, but without debate. If there be no appeal the decision of the chair shall be final.

18th. Every member present in the Council chamber, when a question is being put, shall vote thereon, unless the Council shall excuse him; and no member coming into the Council chamber after a question has been put shall be allowed to vote. The Warden or Chairman shall cause notice to be sent to members in committee or antercoms when a vote in Council is about to be taken.

19th. A motion to adjourn shall always be in order, except when a vote is being taken.

20th. When the Warden or Chairman is of opinion that a motion offered is contrary to the rules or privileges of the Council, he shall rule it out of order, subject to an appeal to the Council, as provided in Rule three.

21st. When the Warden or Chairman is putting a question, no member shall walk out of or across the Chamber, nor when a member is speaking shall any members hold discourse to interrupt him except to call him to order, nor pass between him and the chair.

- 22nd. One day's notice shall be given of all motions for the introduction of new matter, or for the appointment of any committee; but this rule shall not apply to motions or questions arising out of any matter at that time before the Council.
- 28rd. All motions shall be in writing, and seconded (except for adjournment, going into committee of the whole on By-Laws and Reports, or for receiving Reports or Petitions,) before being read from the chair or debated.
- 24th. After a motion has been read by the Warden or Chairman, it shall be deemed to be in possession of the Council, but may be withdrawn at any time before decision or amendment with permission of the Council.
- 25th. A motion for commitment, until it is decided, shall proclude all amendment to the main question.
- 26th. When a question is under debate no motion shall be received unless to amend it, or commit it, or to postpone it to a certain day, or for the previous question, or for adjournment, or to lay it on the table.
- 27th. The previous question, until it is decided, shall preclude all amendment and debate of the main question, and shall be in the following words: "That this question be now put," and, if decided in the affirmative, the original question shall be put forthwith, without amendment or debate; but, if decided in the negative, the original question cannot be put until a future day.
- 28th. All questions, whether in Council or Committee, shall be put in the order moved, (except in filling up blanks, the shortest time and the smallest sum shall be put first), and amendments shall take precedence of original motions, and shall be put in the reverse order made, not more than one amendment to an amendment shall be received.
- 29th. Upon a division of the Council, if the yeas and nays are called for by any member before a vote is being taken, the names shall be recorded in the Minutes. Chap. 184, Sec. 245. R.S.O., 1887.

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#### BY-LAWS.

30th. By-Laws shall be introduced upon motion for leave (of which one day's notice has been given), specifying the title thereof, except when upon motion to appoint a committee to prepare and bring it in, or upon report of a standing committee.

31st. No By-Law shall be committed or amended until it shall have been twice read, after which it shall go to committee of the whole, unless otherwise ordered.

32nd. Amendments made in Committee shall be reported to the Council by the Chairman. After Report is received and By-Law read a third time, it may be subjected to debate and amendment in the Council before the question to pass, sign and scal, shall be decided.

33rd. By-Laws shall be read throughout by the Chairman in Committee of the Whole, and considered by clauses, leaving the preamble and title last.

34th. No By-Law, resolution, or question, substantially the same, may be twice considered in the same session.

35th. Every By-Law shall receive three several readings, each on different days, previous to its being passed.

36th. When a By-Law has been read in Council, the Clerk shall endorse the reading and time on the back thereof.

37th. When a By-Law or agreement has passed the Council, it shall be dated, signed by the Warden and Clerk, and have the Corporate Seal attached.

38th. Persons whose property may be affected by any By-Law shall have the privilege, either in person or by agent, of appearing before the Committee having charge of the same.

39th. Any Municipality in the County requiring a By-law confirmed for closing a Road allowance, shall petition the Council to that effect, and shall produce evidence satisfactory to the Standing Committee on Roads and Bridges that they have passed the By-Law in accordance with Sub-sections 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, of Sec. 546, Chap. 184, R.S.O.

40th. All By-Laws submitted to the Council by private members shall be referred, after the first reading, to the Standing Committee on By-Laws and Legislation to report thereon.

41st. Petitions by the Council shall be treated as reports, and shall be presented through a Committee, and be read by the Clerk, after which they shall go to Committee of the Whole unless otherwise ordered.

# PETITIONS, ETC., TO THE COUNCIL.

42nd. Petitions and Memorials addressed to the Council shall be presented by a member in his place, who shall be answerable to the Council that they do not contain improper or impertinent matter, who shall endorse the name of the applicant, and the substance of such application, and sign his name thereto, which endorsement only shall

be read by the Clerk unless a member shall require the reading of the paper, in which case the whole shall be read.

43rd. No Petition shall be received after the second day of each Session unless it shall arise out of any matter before the Council.

44th. All Petitions, Memorials, Reports and Communications laid before the Council shall be rend once by the Clerk (or the endorsement thereon), after which they belong to the Council, and if required to be read must be moved for.

#### COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE COUNCIL.

45th. In forming a Committee of the Whole, the Warden or Chairman, before leaving the chair, shall appoint a member to preside, who shall have the same authority as the Warden in the chair, except deciding Questions of Order. If any disturbance should arise the Warden, or presiding officer, shall resume the chair forthwith that order may be restored.

46th. Motions need not be in writing or seconded, and members may speak more than once on the same subject.

47th. A motion to rise and report shall be decided without asbate, and a motion to rise, if carried, shall dispose of the question in the negative.

48th. The Chairman shall report the decision of Committee to the Warden or presiding officer.

49th. Rules 22, 31, 35, 36, 41 and 44 may at any time be suspended upon a twothird vote of the members present.

#### STANDING COMMITTEES.

50th. In the first session of Council in each year Standing Committees shall be appointed for the following purposes, viz.:

Finance,

Fducation,

County Property,

Equalization of Assessment,

By-Laws and Legislation,

Roads and Bridges,

Industrial Home.

Printing and Contingencies,

to whom all documents relating to those subjects shall be severally referred, unless referred to a Special Committee.

51st. The Warden shall, for purpose of consultation, but not to vote, be, ex officio, a member of every Standing Committee.

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52nd. A majority of members composing a Committee shall form a quorum, unless otherwise ordered by Council.

(a) No Special Committee shall be appointed to exceed five members, who shall be elected by ballot.

#### ORDERS OF THE DAY.

Ford. When any order or orders of the day shall be left undisposed of at the time of an adjournment, either for want of a quorum or otherwise, such order or orders shall be taken up in succession as the first business after the daily routine at the next meeting of the Council.

A By-Law to authorize 'he Warden and Treasurer of the County of York to borrow certain sums to meet the current expenditure of the County.

HEREAS it is necessary to make provision, by way of temporary loans, for the purpose of providing funds to defray the ordinary expenditure of the County until the taxes levied for the current year have been fully collected, there being uncollected of such taxes a sum of not less than the sum hereby authorized to be borrowed.

And whereas the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars is required to meet the now current expenses of the said Corporation, and it is expedient to authorize the Warden and Treasurer to borrow the said sure.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the County of York:

1st. That the Warden and Treasurer be and are hereby authorized, under the seal of the Corporation, to negotiate a loan or loans with the Imperial Bank of Canada, or other chartered Bank or person, in such a manner as may be in the interest of the County, for such sum or sums as may be necessary, not to exceed in the whole the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars.

2nd. That the said sum or sums so borrowed shall be repaid on or before the fourteenth day of December next.

3rd. That a covenant or agreement, sealed with the Corporate seal, and signed on behalf of the Corporation by the Warden and Treasurer, be duly executed and given to the said Bank or person, as aforesaid, as security for the repayment of the sum borrowed with interest.

No. 575.

A By-Law to Assess for County Purposes, Maintenance ε Industrial Home, Payments of School Teachers, and an account of the Lake Simcoe Junction Railway.

WHEREAS, by an Act passed by the Local Legislature of this Province, power is given to County Councils to levy rates for County Purposes, Payment of County Officers, and other expenses in connection with the County.

And whereas it is necessary to make an assessment on the property of the County of York for said purpose,

Be it enacted by the Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That there be levied and collected from the property rated on the Assessment Rolls of the several Townships, Towns and incorporated Villages of the County, according to the last revised and equalized Assessment Rolls (and not otherwise exempted), the sum of twenty nine thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven dollars and thirty cents (\$29,857.80), for the payment of certain salaries, allowances to County Councillors, as portion of the expenses for the Administration of Justice, for the payment of certain grants, and for other necessary and incidental expenses of the County; said sumbeing

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the Assessment the County, acnerwise exemptblars and thirty inty Councillors, yment of certain said sun being provided for by a rate of c: a mill on the dollar on the equalized value of the property on the aforesaid rolls.

2nd. Be it enacted that a further sum of eight thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven dollars and nineteen cents (\$8,957.19) be levied and collected from the property rated on the aforesaid rolls, for the purpose of supporting and maintaining an Industrial Home, established by the County; said sum being provided for by a rate of three-tenths of a mill on the dollar on the equalized value of the property on the aforesaid rolls.

8rd. Be it enacted, that a further sum of four thousand eight hundred and fortyone dollars (\$4,841) be levied and collected as aforesaid from the several Township
Municipalities in the County, for the payment in part of the salaries of qualified teachers
of Public Schools, and in order to entitle the said Township Municipalities to receive
their proportion of the Legislative grant for the payment of Public School Teachers.

4th. Be it enacted that a further sum of three thousand nine hundred and twentyone dollars and thirteen cents (\$3,921.13), by a rate of two mills and sixty hundredths
of a mill on the dollar, be levied and collected from all the property rated on the Assessment Rolls of the Townships of Georgina. North Gwillimbury and that portion of East
Gwillimbury described as follows, that is to say: Commencing at the south west angle
of Lot No. 1 in the 2nd Concession of the said Township of East Gwillimbury, thence
northward along the western boundary of said 2nd Concession to the northern boundary
of the said Township, thence east along the northerly boundary of the said Township
to the north-east angle thereof, thence south along the eastern boundary of said Township to the south-east angle thereof, thence west along the southern boundary of said
Township to the place of beginning, excepting thereout all the roadway and property of
the Northern Railway Company of Canada situated within the said Township of East
Gwillimbury, for the payment of debentures and interest thereon, on account of the
bonus granted to the Lake Simcoe Junction Railway Company.

5th. That the amount apportioned to the several Municipalities are according to the schedule herewith annexed, and which schedule forms part of this By-Law.

No. 576.

A By-Law to appoint a Superintendent of York Roads and County Engineer.

The Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

1st. That John Thomas Stokes be and is hereby appointed Superintendent of the York Roads and County Engineer.

2nd. That his salary shall be at the rate of twelve hundred dollars per annum, payable quarterly by the Treasurer, which sum shall include all his expenses in connection with the York Roads, and all works belonging exclusively to the County.

(a) Provided always, that in attending to any duties not connected with the York Roads he shall be allowed five cents per mile as travelling expenses for each mile necessarily travelled.

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3rd. He shall give security to the amount of three thousand dollars, himself in \$2,000, and \$1,000 of an approved Guarantee Company, for the faithful performance of the several duties of his office, and devote the whole of his time to the discharge of said duties.

- 4th. The duties of the said Superintendent of the York Roads shall be as follows:
- (1) He shall have the general charge of the Roads, and of all matters connected with the management thereof, and shall cause the employees under his control to be paid for the time or work performed.
  - (2) He shall make an inspection of said Roads at least twice in each month.
- (3) He shall submit all accounts to the Warden and Commissioners for their approval before issuing his order for payment of the same.
- (4) He shall superintend the maintenance and repair of the Roads and their Bridges, and shall prepare plans and specifications, subject to the approval of the Commissioners of County Property, for all bridges under the control of the County Council, or other civil engineering works that may be required.
- (5) He shall report annually at the January session, or oftener, should he deem it advisable, or if so ordered by the County Council, relative to the condition of the Roads, suggesting any alterations or improvements that may appear desirable.
- (6) He shall, if directed by the County Commissioners, report on all securities tendered to the Corporation in connection with the Roads, and see to the proper execution thereof, on approval by said Commissioners.

5th. That By-Laws Nos. 481 and 527, and all other By-Laws inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

# No. 577.

A By-Law to define the position of the Toll gates, Check Gates, and Sidebars on the York Roads, and to prescribe the Rates of Toll to be collected thereat.

WHEREAS, under and by virtue of the provisions of the "General Road Companies Act" and "The Municipal Act," County Councils are empowered to pass By-Laws to regulate Toll-gates, Check Gates and Side-bars upon certain roads and to regulate the rates of Toll to be collected thereat.

And whereas the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York deems

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vith the York ior each mile it advisable to pass such a By-Law for regulating Toll-gates, Cheek Gates, and Side-bars upon the York Roads, and for fixing the rates of Toll to be collected thereat.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York as follows:

1st. That from and after the passing of this By-Law the Toll-gates on the York Roads shall be and are hereby established and located on the different Roads as follows:

#### I.—YONGE STREET ROAD.

Gate number one, about 200 feet north of City limits.

Gate number two, at the north side of lot number thirty-five, Youge Street.

Gate number three, at the north side of lot number seventy-five, Yonge Street.

Gate number four, at the south side of lot number one hundred and one, Yonge Street.

#### II.—KINGSTON ROAD.

Gate number one, at its present location, about two hundred feet north of Queen Street.

Gate number two, at its present location at the intersection of the sideroad between Lots Nos. 16 and 17, Concession "D," Scarboro", and the Kingston Road.

Gate number three, at its present location, about a quarter of a mile east of the boundary line between the Counties of York and Ontario.

#### 111.—DUNDAS STREET ROAD.

Gate number one, at its present location, about two hundred feet north of Humberside Avenue.

Gate number two, at its present location at the intersection of the road between Lots 5 and 6, Concession one, Township of Toronto, on the north side of Dundas Street.

Gate number three, near the centre of lot number eleven in the first Concession, Township of Toronto, at the intersection of the road leading to Port Credit.

#### IV.-LAKE SHORE ROAD.

Toll-gate at its present location, about one hundred and ninety feet west from the west limit of Roncesvalles Avenue.

2nd. And be it further enacted that the several Check Gates and Side-bars on the York Roads shall be and are hereby established as at present located.

3rd. That all teams drawing a load of manure upon the York Roads be allowed to pass free of toll.

4th. Every vehicle with wheels of thirty-six (96) inches or more in diameter, and tires of not less than four (4) inches in width, and drawn by two horses or other beasts

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meter, and her beasts of draught, with loads, five cents; and for each additional horse three cents; and for each vehicle above named without load, three cents.

5th. Any double team carrying less than six hundred pounds weight shall be considered an unloaded team; and any one-horse vehicle carrying less than three hundred pounds weight shall also be considered unloaded.

6th. That the following rates of toll shall be collected at the various Toll-gates and Side-bars on the York Roads at each time of passing, viz:

For every vehicle of any kind drawn by two horses or other beasts of draught, with load, except as provided by clause No. 4...... 10 cents.

For every saddle horse or other beast, with rider...... 4

For each sheep, pig, or goat...... 1

7th. That By-Laws Nos. 440, 444, and all other By-Laws inconsistent herewith, shall be and are hereby repealed.

8th. Any person contravening any of the provisions of this By-Law shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the provisions of "The General Road Companies Act," and all penalties imposed by the authority of any other Act imposing penalties for contravention of By-Laws relating to Toll Roads.

A By-Law to appoint a County Solicitor.

WHEREAS it is expedient that a Solicitor, to be paid by a fixed salary, be appointed to superintend the legal business of the County.

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That C. C. Robinson be appointed Solicitor for the County.

2nd. That the said Solicitor shall have an office in the City of Toronto.

3rd. That the said Solicitor shall for and in consideration of the yearly salary hereafter mentioned perform the following duties:

- (a) He shall at all times, upon the request of the Warden, the County Commissioners, the Chairman of Committees, or the County Clerk, give his opinion either verbally or in writing as requested, upon any question affecting the interests of the County, and shall give his assistance to any legislation required;
- (b) He shall act as Solicitor for the County in any litigation or arbitration that may be commenced by any corporation or person in any matter in which the County may be interested, whether as a party to said litigation or arbitration or otherwise;
- (c) The County Commissioners or the County Clerk shall at all times be entitled to ask the advice or assistance of the said Solicitor in any matter which in any way affects the legal rights of the said County;
- (d) The said Solicitor shall receive as his sole remuneration, for the said services, the salary hereinafter provided, save and except in the cases hereinafter excepted.
- 4th. The said Solicitor shall act as counsel for the County in all matters of litigation, arbitration, or dispute without extra assistance in the way of counsel fees or otherwise, unless the said assistance is recommended in writing by the County Commissioners or the Warden.
  - 5th. The salary of the Solicitor shall be the sum of \$600, payable quarterly.
- 6th. The said Solicitor shall, however, be entitled to receive, in addition to the said salary, all legal disbursements for counsel fees, or otherwise, actually paid out by him according to this By Law in the course of legal proceedings affecting the interests of the County.

7th. When there has been a suit or action decided in favor of the County, in which by the judgment of the court the County is entitled to costs, to be paid by the opposing party, the said Solicitor shall, in addition to his said salary, be entitled to whatever amount, exclusive of disbursements for witness fees and court fees which may have been paid by the County, that the said judgment may award.

8th. This By-Law shall come into force the 25th day of June, 1890.

9th. And that all By-Laws inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

No. 580.

A By-Law to provide for licensing Hawkers, Pedlars and Petty Chapman.

WHEREAS under and by virtue of the provisions of the "Municipal Act," Chap. 184, Section 495, and sub-sections thereto, County Councils may pass By-Laws for licensing, regulating, and governing Hawkers or Petty Chapman, &c.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

1st. From and after the passing of this By-Law it shall not be lawful for any Haw-kers or Petty Chapman, or any other persons carrying on petty trades, or who go from place to place or to other men's houses on foot or with any animal bearing or drawing any goods, wares, or merchandise for sale, or in or with any boat, vessel or other craft, or otherwise carrying goods, wares or merchandise for sale, or who being agents for persons not resident within the County, sell or offer for sale tea, dry goods or jewellry, or carry or expose samples or patterns of any of such goods to be afterwards delivered within the County to any person not being a wholesale or retail dealer in such goods, wares, or merchandise, without having first obtained a license therefor.

Provided always that no such license shall be required for hawking, peddling, or selling from any vehicle or other conveyance, any goods, wares, or merchandise to any retail dealer or for hawking or peddling any goods, wares, or merchandise, the growth, produce or manufacture of this Province not being liquors within the meaning of the

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ANS, Warden. laws relating to tavern or tavern licenses, if the same are being hawked or peddled by the manufacturer or producer of such goods, wares or merchandise, or by his bona tide servants or employees having written authority in that behalf, and any such servant or employee shall produce and exhibit his written authority when required to do so by any Municipal or Peace Officer.

2nd. Any person selling or offering goods for sale or barter for which a license is required under this By-Law, shall, upon demand, forthwith exhibit his license.

3rd. The amount payable for license under this By-Law shall be as follows, viz: To travel on foot the sum of \$8, to travel with a horse or other animal \$20, and for every additional horse or other animal \$5, to sail or travel with a boat \$50, to sail or travel with a decked vessel \$30, each of such licenses shall be in force for one year from the date of such issue and no lenger.

4th. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer of this County to provide blank forms of licenses of the several kinds herein named, and on receipt of the amount herein named he shall issue such license or licenses under the Corporate seal signed by himself and the Clerk.

5th. The Treasurer shall publish quarterly m two of the public papers of the County the names of all persons so licensed, describing whether foot or otherwise.

6th. Any person contravening any of the Provisions of this By-Law, shall for such offence, on conviction before one or more Justices of the Peace, forfeit and pay a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than forty dollars, in the discretion of the Justice or Justices together with the costs, and if not paid forthwith the same shall be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender, and in default of such distress the offender shall be imprisoned in the common jail of this County for any time not exceeding twenty-one days, unless such fine and costs shall be sooner paid.

7th. All fines collected under this By-Law shall be paid one-half to the informer and the other to the Treasurer of the Local Municipality, unless the prosecution is brought in the name of the Local Corporation, in which case the whole of the penalty shall be paid to the Local Corporation.

8th. Be it further enacted that By-Law No. 496 of this Corporation, and all other By-Laws inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

A By-Law to provide for Licensing and regulating Auctioneers.

WHEREAS by Cap. 184, Sec. 495, and sub-sec. 2, R.S.O., County Councils may pass By-Laws for licensing, regulating and governing Auctioneers.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

1st. That after the passing of this By-Law it shall not be lawful for any person to exercise the calling of an Auctioneer, or put up goods, wares or merchandise, or other effects, to public outery, within the County of York, without first having obtained a license therefor;

Provided always that this By-Law shall not apply to or affect Sheriffs' Officers, Division Court or Landlerds' Bailiffs, or Bailiffs or Officers of any other Court or legal authority, who may sell goods by auction while in the discharge of their duties as such Bailiffs or Officers.

2nd. On the receipt of the sum of Twenty Dollars from the person applying for the same, the Treasurer shall issue, under the Corporate Scal, a license to the person named therein to exercise the calling of an Auctioneer for one year from the date of issue.

3rd. Every person acting as an Auctioneer shall, if required so to do, forthwith exhibit his license; and in default of so doing shall, upon conviction thereof before any Justice or Justices of the Peace having jurisdiction, be fined in a sum not exceeding ten dollars with costs.

4th. That in case of death the legal representative or representatives of deceased shall be entitled to a rebate for the unexpired portion of the year for which such license is granted, and that the Treasurer be authorized to pay the same upon the recommendation of the Warden.

5th. Any person exercising the calling of an Auctioneer contrary to this By-Law shall, upon conviction thereof before any Justice or Justices of the Peace having juris diction, be fined not less than ten nor more than fifty dollars, exclusive of costs, and if such fine be not paid forthwith, it shall be levied by distress and sale of the goods and chattels of the offender on the authority of a warrant, under the hand and seal of the convicting Justice or Justices; and if sufficient distress cannot be found the convicting Justice or Justices shall commit the offender to the common jail of this County for any term not exceeding twenty days, unless the fine and costs be sooner paid. R.S.O., Cap. 184, Secs. 417 to 428.

6th. All fines collected under this By-Law shall be paid one-half to the informer and the other half to the Treasurer of the Local Corporation, unless the prosecution is brought in the name of the Local Corporation, in which case the whole of the pecuniary penalty shall be paid to the Local Corporation. R.S.O., Cap. 184, Secs. 417 to 423.

7th. That By-Law No. 487, and all other By-Laws inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

## No. 582.

To make Rules and Regulations Governing the York Industrial Home, or House of Industry and Refuge.

WHEREAS the Council of the Corporation of the County of York has, in accordance with the law in that behalf, established a House of Industry and Refuge in and for said County.

And whereas by the provisions of the Municipal Act, Chap. 181, Sec. 462, and sub-sections thereto, County Councils are authorized to make rules and regulations for the superintendence, care and management of said House of Industry.

Therefore the Council of the Corporation of the County of York enacts as follows:

#### ADMISSION OF INMATES.

1st. That Section 369, Chap. 48, 36 Vic. and sub-sections thereto, shall be and form part of this By-Law.

2nd. Any two or more of Her Majesty's Justices of the Peace in and for the said County of York may, by writing under their hands and seals, commit to the said House of Industry and Refuge, to be employed and governed according to the Rules and Regulations herein provided:—

- (1) All poor and indigent persons who are incapable of supporting themselves.
- (2) All persons without the means of maintaining themselves and able to work, and who refuse or neglect so to do.
- (8) All persons leading a lewd, dissolute or vagrant life, and exercising no ordinary calling or lawful business sufficient to gain or procure an honest living.
- (4) And all such as spend their time and property in public houses, to the neglect of any lawful calling.
  - (5) And idiots.

Srd. The commitments of persons referred to in the 1st and 5th subsections of Section 2 of this By-Law may be under the hand and seal of the Reeve or any member of the Council of the County of York, if an actual and bona fide resident of the County of at least one year's standing, and may be in the form of Schedule A 1 to this By-Law, or to like effect; and the warrant or order of commitment may be in the form of Schedule 2 to this By-Law, or to like effect; and that persons committed under this clause shall not leave the Home until discharged by the Commissioners and the Inspector.

## EXPENSES OF COMMITTING INMATES.

4th. The expenses of sending inmates to the Home, committed under municipal anthority, shall be paid by the County at the rate of fifteen cents per mile, one way, when only one person committed. When two persons are sent at the same time to the

Home, the ten cents charge for provided conveyed Deputy-R of miles in

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or municipal le, one way, time to the Home, the amount payable by the County for conveying the second person shall be ten cents per mile one way, and when more than two are sent at the same time the charge for conveying each additional one over two shall be five cents per mile one way, provided always that when the additional one is a child under two years old, it shall be conveyed free of charge. Such payment to be made on the order of the Reeve or Deputy-Reeve of the municipality sending the same, who shall also certify to the number of miles necessarily travelled. Mileage to be counted the nearest way to the Home.

#### BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS.

5th. At the January Session in each year, two members of the Council shall be appointed by By-Law (the first-named to be Chairman) to constitute a Board of Management of the said Industrial Home and Farm, to be known as "Industrial Home Commissioners," whose duty it shall be to meet at the Home within three days after the close of each month for the purpose of examining and passing accounts in connection with the Home for the previous month, and to order payment of the same in due course; and the Chairman shall send or cause to be sent, a statement of the amount required to pay the same, together with such further sum, not to exceed fifty dollars, as in the opinion of the Board of Commissioners may be required for incidental payments, to the County Treasurer, who, on order of the Warden, shall deposit to the credit of the Inspector, in a bank in Newmarket, to be named by the Board of Commissioners, the amount so required.

- (1) All accounts for purchases for the Home or Farm shall become payable on the tenth day of the month following that in which the purchases are made and delivered.
- (2) The Board of Commissioners shall exercise a general supervision over and direct all matters in connection with the government and maintenance of the Home and Farm, and the keeping of the accounts, books and registers hereafter provided for.
- (3) The Board of Commissioners shall, in a book provided for that purpose, keep a full and complete account of all expenditure in connection with the Home and Farm as per Schedule E, or to like effect, of this By-Law, said book to be submitted to the County Council at the January and June meetings.
- (4) It shall be the duty of the said Board of Commissioners to examine into any case in which they consider an inmate has been wrongfully committed and report to this Council.

#### OFFICERS' DUTIES.

6th. It shall be the duty of the Inspector to visit the Home at Past once in two weeks to see that the rules and regulations herein provided are duly enforced, and to hear any complaints that may be made by the inmates or others in reference to its management, and to report the same, either to the Standing Committee or County Council, as he may think best. He shall also act as Secretary to the Board of Commissioners.

7th. He shall, subject to the direction of the County Council or its Standing Com-

mittee, procure all necessary heip and supplies for the Home and Farm; also all raw materials for manufacture and such tools and implements as may be required for the full employment of such of the inmates as are able to work. All supplies to be purchased by tender whenever possible, and the Inspector shall certify all bills or claims to the Board of Commissioners.

- 8th. He shall also, in books to be provided at the expense of this Corporation, keep the following registers and accounts, that is to say:—
- (1) A register of the names of all paupers, vagrants, etc., admitted into the Home in the form of Schedule D to this By-Law.
  - (2) A burial register in form of Schedule C to this By-Law.
- (3) A register of children bound out to service in the form of Schedule B to this By-Law.
- (1) A cash book, in which he shall enter all items of receipts and expenditure at least once in two weeks, and balance the same at the close of each month.
- (5) A ledger, to the accounts in which he shall post from time to time the transactions shown in the cash book.
- (6) He shall at the times set forth in this By-Law, and as directed by the Board of Commissioners, pay the accounts duly passed and ordered to be paid by the said Board of Commissioners, and shall as soon as may be and not later than the fifteenth day of each month transmit to the County Treasurer a transcript or copy of the entries in the cash book for the preceding month, attested by the said Board of Commissioners, together with the vouchers, which he will continue to take in duplicate as at present.
- 9th. In addition to the foregoing, it shall also be the duty of the Inspector to make a yearly report to the County Council for the year ending the 31st of December in each year, and at such other time as he may be directed by resolution of this Council, in the form of Schedule F to this By-Law, together with any other matter he may think of sufficient importance to bring under the notice of the Council.
- 10th. He shall also, on or before the thirty-first day of December in each year, check the inventory of personal property belonging to the institution and value the amount of produce on hand, and report the same to the County Council at the time of making his annual report.

#### DUTIES OF THE KEEPER.

11th. It shall be the duty of the Keeper, and he is hereby authorized and required to receive into the said House of Industry and Refuge for their maintenance and support such persons only as are legally committed under the provisions of this By-Law. It shall also be his duty to undertake the general superintendence of the House of Industry and Refuge and the Industrial Farm attached thereto, and when not otherwise engaged, devote his time in tilling and cultivating said farm, securing and harvesting the crops, or at other manual labour, according to the requirements of the several seasons of the year, and in order to work said farm in a skilful and husbandlike manner,

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and required ace and suphis By-Law. are House of ot otherwise d harvesting the several ike manner, he shall give his attention and time to the benefit of the institution and shall earry into effect all the rules and regulations from time to time adopted by the County Council for the government and management of said House; he shall also provide, under the direction of the Inspector, all the provisions required for the House, and shall see that the provisions furnished to the inmates are of good quality and sufficient in quantity, and that no waste thereof be permitted; he shall not permit the use of intoxicating drinks by any of the inmates.

(1) That the Keeper shall make returns to the Council the names of all persons that have died in the Heme during the year, and where they were committed from.

12th. He shall keep regular accounts in writing of all materials, provisions, fuel, clothing and other necessaries provided for the use of the Institution, and of such expenses and charges attending the maintenance and support of the poor as shall be paid by him, and dispose of all surplus products, and of all monies received by him from sale of the products of their labour or otherwise, for which purpose the following books are placed in his charge:—

- (1) A blotter book, in which he shall enter a full memorandum of all purchases and sales made by him, and from which the Inspector may be able to make the proper entries in the cash book.
- (2) A petty cash book, in which he shall enter all his receipts and payments as they occur, and shall balance the same at the close of each month; also for the Inspector's use.
  - (3) A book in which he shall a exparticulars of the produce of the farm.
- (4) He will see that in all cases of purchases for the Home or Farm, so far as made by him, that an invoice is obtained, and in the case of sales that an invoice or bill of sale be given, and wherever possible, the initials of the purchaser be entered on the counterfoil of the bill of sale.
- (5) He shall also keep a wearing apparel book, and therein keep a correct and particular account of each and every article issued to the inmates, and shall keep a complete inventory of all personal property in and about the place, and assist the Inspector in checking the same for the purpose of the annual report, and also assist in the valuing of provisions, produce, etc., on hand.
- (6) He shall also keep a visitor's book, in which parties visiting the institution shall enter their names with any remarks or comment they may see fit to make.
- (7) In the event of the death of any inmate of the Home the Keeper shall notify by wire the Reeve of the Municipality from which such inmate was committed, and also the nearest known relative of such death; so that friends and relatives of the deceased may be notified of the same, and that unless instructions are received as to the disposition of the body within twenty-four hours after such notice has been sent, the Keeper will dispose of it as directed by statute.
  - (8) That in case of the death of any person committed to the Industrial Home

and a demand has been made in writing by a bona fide friend or relative of the person so dying, previous to his or her death, that the body shall not be handed over to the Inspector of Anatomy, but shall be decently interred by such friend or relative, or by the Keeper of such Home, upon a deposit being made of the sum of five dollars at the time of the aforesaid demand.

(9) It shall be the duty of the Keeper to order all goods, groceries, etc., from the contractor by telephone, and not to be absent from the Home without permission from the Commissioners or Inspector during the hours from twelve o'clock noon to five p. m., except Sundays.

13th. He shall also examine all paupers on their admission into the House, note such facts in regard to them as are important to be preserved, shall cause them to be thoroughly cleansed and suitably located, having reference to their age, sex and general character; shall be especially careful that the infirm immates and children are treated with considerate care and kindness, and shall see that proper attention is given to the sick.

14th. He shall also see that every department and all furniture and utensils are kept neat and clean and in order, and that all provisions, fuel and every other article consumed in and about the premises are used with the strictest economy.

15th. He, or his assistants detailed for the purpose, shall also visit each and every occupied room after the ringing of the retiring bell, and see that the immates have all retired (excepting those on duty) and shall see that all the fires are made secure and safe and that all lights are extinguished, save and except only where lights are permitted to be kept for the benefit of the sick.

16th. He may also for violation of any of the rules, for disobedience or bad conduct by any of the inmates, inflict suitable punishment at his discretion (but employ no improper means) by confinement or otherwise, but in cases of solitary confinement not for a longer period than twenty-four hours, unless by the direction of the Inspector.

## DUTIES OF THE MATRON.

17th. It shall be the duty of the Matron to take charge of and generally direct all indoor operations; to see that all female inmates are provided for according to their respective wants; and that cleanliness and order be observed both in their persons and apartments.

18th. It shall also be her duty to exercise due care over such of the County's property as may be committed to her charge, see that the same be not lost or embezzled direct the detailing of the women under her charge to such branches of industry as in her judgment they are best fitted to perform.

19th. She shall also at proper and seasonable times have all the clothing of the inmates and all bedclothes changed and replaced with clean apparel.

## DUTIES OF THE PHYSICIAN.

20th. It shall be the duty of the Physician to undertake the sanitary supervision

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of said Home, and to attend all cases of sickness that may occur.

21st. He shall also, in a book to be furnished for that purpose, note all cases of treatment by him; in case of death to certify therein the cause, and shall also record in such book the births that occur in said Home, and shall prepare the necessary registration certificate in each case.

22nd. He shall also when called upon by the Keeper examine any of the inmates feigning illness or otherwise, as to their ability to work, and shall visit the Home at least once in two weeks, and report to this Council at the June Session in each year the number of deaths, all cases of illness, cause of illness, the disease in each case, the number of visits made to each case.

### BURIAL GROUND.

29rd. If deemed advisable by the County Council or its Standing Committee, a suitable place on some part of the said Industrial Farm shall be selected and set apart for a burial ground for the burial of such of the inmates as may die in said Home, and whose bona fide friends or relatives request the bodies to be buried therein, as aforesaid; such burial ground to be fenced in and properly laid out in tiers or rows, and the graves plainly numbered. A burial register shall also be kept in the form of Schedule C to this By-Law.

## BINDING OUT OF CHILDREN TO SERVICE.

24th. If it is desired by any person of good morals and repute to take any child from the House of Industry and Refuge as an apprentice to any lawful trade, profession or employment, or to take one on trial for a short time with the intention of having him or her so apprenticed, the Inspector may, if satisfied of the character of the person making such application, give his consent thereto, and cause application to be made by the Keeper to the Chairman of, and at the Court of, General Sessions of the Peace, to have such child put and bound out as an apprentice in conformity with Cap. 133, R. S. O.

25th. Provision shall be made to have such child sent to school, and also requiring that at the expiration of the apprenticeship he or she shall be furnished with an outfit of good and comfortable clothing.

26th. A register shall be kept in the form of Schedule B to this By-Law of all children bound out.

## RULES FOR THE INMATES.

27th. The following shall be and are hereby adopted as Rules and Regulations to govern the inmates.

### RULE 1.

At the ringing of the morning bell, every inmate in the Home (the sick excepted) must rise, dress, wash and be in readiness to proceed to the duties of the day.

### RULE II.

The bell shall ring ten minutes before each meal, when all shall get in readiness to repair to the dining room, and take such seats at the table as are assigned to them, when they shall observe decency and order.

### RULE III.

No inmate shall be allowed to loiter about the kitchen, nor shall any provisions (except at regular meals), be carried to any part of the House without the consent of the Keeper or Matron.

### RULE IV.

The evening bell shall be rung at nine o'clock, when the inmates shall secure the fires, put out the lights, and retire to bed in their respective apartments.

#### RULE V

No inmate shall be allowed to trade or exchange clothing, or any other article in their possession, nor beg of those visiting the Home; nor shall they receive any money or other article without the consent of the Keener or person in charge.

### RULE VI.

All inmates shall diligently and faithfully perform the duties assigned them by the Keeper or others in charge.

### RULE VII.

Any inmate guilty of drunkenness, disobedience, immorality, obscenity, disorderly conduct, profane or indecorous language, theft or waste, or who shall absent himself or herself from the premises without the permission of the Keeper, or who shall be guilty of injuring or defacing any part of the House or furniture therein, or who shall commit waste of any kind, shall be punished as the case may seem to demand.

### RULE VIII.

In all cases of solitary confinement the prisoner shall be debarred from seeing or conversing with any person except the Inspector, the Keeper, or the person employed to supply their wants; and the food of such prisoners shall consist solely of bread and water unless otherwise ordered by the Inspector or Physician.

## RULE IX.

Any inmate who shall have communication, either directly or indirectly, with any one thus confined, without permission, shall be subject to punishment by a like confinement.

### RULE X.

No inmate shall go beyond the limits of the Industrial Farm unless by the permission of the Keeper, nor remain out beyond the time specified by the Keeper.

### RULE XI.

The Sabbath Day shall be strictly observed, and no irreligious diversion or unnecessary labor be indulged in. At the ringing of the bell for the purpose of assembling

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sion or unnecese of assembling for religious instruction and worship, every person (unless excused by the Keeper) shall appear dressed in clean apparel, in the instruction room, and shall behave with decency and sobriety. No noise or disturbance shall be made in any part of the House during such exercises.

### RULE XII.

Every inmate, previous to admission to the House, shall be subjected to examination and search by the Keeper or one of his assistants.

#### RULE XIII.

No visitor shall have admission to the House on the Sabbath, without permission of the Keeper upon good cause shewn or to attend religious worship.

### RULE XIV.

All persons aggrieved muy prefer their complaints to the Inspector when he is visiting the House, or to a member of the County Council.

28th. Persons admitted to the House being the possessors of money shall deliver over said meneys to the Inspector, and by him placed to the credit of the funds of the Home; and should such persons so admitted possess a life interest in any real estate, it shall be incumbent upon them to make such assignment thereof as will enable the County to utilize the annual value thereof for the benefit of the County; provided further, that in case said persons so admitted deliver to the Keeper or other employes of the Home any article of value it shall be their duty to hand over the same to the Inspector, who shall keep a proper inventory of the same in a book to be provided by the County for that purpose: and in case of the death of said inmate, on the order of the Standing Committee, said Inspector shall deliver such article of value to the relatives or other parties entitled to receive the same, or to whom said article may be bestowed by deceased; but when not so delivered, may be disposed of by order of Council, on the recommendation of said Standing Committee on Industrial Home.

29th. And be it further enacted that By-Laws Nos. 451, 500 and 547 and all other By-Laws of this Council inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed.

A By-Law to authorize and empower the Metropolitan Street Railway Company to extend their line of railway from their present northerly limit to the top of York Mills Hill.

HEREAS by agreements made between this County and the Metropolitan Street Railway Company on the twenty-fifth day of June, 1884; the twentieth day of January, 1886; the twenty-eighth day of June, 1889; and the seventeenth day of December, 1889, respectively, the Metropolitan Street Railway Company has power and authority to operate their Street Railway on Youge Street, between the Northerly limits of Toronto and Glen Grove Park;

And whereas divers ratepayers of the County are desirous of having the Company extend their Street Railway North to the top of York Mills hill;

And whereas it is deemed advisable and in the public interest to allow the said extension;

Be it therefore enacted by the Municipal Covaril of the Corporation of the County of York:

1st. That the Metropolitan Street Railway Company be and the same is hereby authorized and empowered to extend and operate their Street Railway by Electric or Cable Power or Horse Power from the present Northerly limit of said road on Yonge Street to the top of York Mills hill, under the conditions of the agreement hereinafter referred to being carried into effect.

2nd. That an agreement be prepared to amend the agreements of this County with the Company, allowing said Company to extend their Street Railway to a point indicated in Clause 1 of this By-Law, subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as the Warden and Commissioners of County Property and Mr. Wilson may approve of, and that upon such approval the said agreement shall be executed on behalf of this Corporation.
