



## THE SIXTY-FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL.

The Annual Meeting of the Corporation of the Montreal General Hospital was held in the Governor's Hall of the Institution, on Tuesday, the 18th May, 1884. Mr. Andrew Robertson, President of the Board of Governors, in the chair.

The Secretary read the following report, which was adopted and ordered to be printed for circulation amongst the subscribers :

GENTLEMEN OF THE CORPORATION OF THE MONTREAL GENERAL HOSPITAL :

I have the honor to present a brief report of the receipts and expenditure of the Hospital, and of the proceedings of the Governors during the year which terminated on the 30th April, 1886.

An analysis of the outlay of the year shows that a reduction has occurred in a large majority of the items belonging to ordinary expenditure : in cost of provisions, \$792.05 ; of instruments, \$345 ; of wines, liquors, soda water, etc., \$36.30 ; of dry goods, bedding, etc., \$86.89 ; of fuel \$496.16 ; of gas, \$45.45 ; of printing and stationery, \$59.94 ; of repairs, \$440.28 ; of furniture, crockery, etc., \$183.35 ; of salaries to medical officers, \$400 ; of wages to nurses and workmen, \$468.52.

The only items in which the expenditure of the year considerably exceeded that of 1884-85, were, insurance, \$650.54 ; and Steward and men's wages, \$345.35. The explanation of the diminished expenditure of the year is partly that the number of indoor patients treated during the year fell considerably short of that of 1884-85.

It is a matter of regret to the Governors that a Sunday collection has not been taken up more generally in the city churches. In many of the large cities in England and the United States collections are made in all the churches in aid of the hospitals upon the *same* day—the “Hospital Sunday.”

The following additions to the “Permanent Fund” have been received from legacies during the year : Trustees of Legatees of late Mrs. Stewart (Gale), \$2,900.00 ; Estate of late Laird Paton, \$500.00 ; Estate of Miss Mary Turner, \$500.00 ; Estate of Mrs. Margaret Campbell (formerly a nurse in the Hospital), \$100.00 ; Estate of John Moody of Terrebonne, \$100.00. Total, \$4,100.

There has not occurred any extraordinary expenditure during the year.

The total number of persons treated as in-door patients during the year 1885-86 was 2003, a reduction of 236 upon the number of 1884-85 ; of these 164 remained from last year, and eighteen hundred and thirty-nine (1839) were admitted during the year just ended.

The percentage of deaths to the whole admissions is 7.88; and, if the 30 cases in which death occurred within three days after entering the Hospital be omitted, the rate of mortality falls to 6.48 per centum. One-fifth of the entire mortality (32 out of 158 deaths) was due to diphtheria and typhoid fever, a sad reflection when it is borne in mind that both diseases depend very largely upon insanitary local conditions for their development and propagation.

There were 13,817 consultations in the General Out-door Department, and 3289 new patients. In the Eye and Ear Department there were 1033 new patients and 5132 consultations; in the Gynæcological Department 202 new patients, and 908 consultations; and in the Laryngological Department 180 new patients and 526 consultations. The nationalities of all the patients will be found in the table annexed to this report.

Two of the Life Governors died during the year, the late D. Lorn Mac-Dougall, Esq., a very old friend of the Institution, and the late Peter D. Dodds, Esq. The following gentlemen have qualified themselves for Life Governorship :—Messrs. Ewan Fisher Ames, Sam. H. Ewing, Edward W. Heney, Thos. E. Hodgson, Edward Holton, M.P., R. J. B. Howard, M.D., E. B. Ibbottson, Charles Arthur Jaques, James McGoun, Wm. Cassils McIntyre, James O'Brien, Edward Rawlings, and Andrew Stuart Robertson.

As regards the erection of the new hospital buildings mentioned in previous reports it may be stated for the information of the many

friends of the Institution, that the plans prepared a few years ago by Mr. Alexander Graham, an eminent London architect, under the auspices of Mr. Peter Redpath, have been examined by Mr. A. C. Hutchison, Charles Garth and George Roberts of this city, and their report has been received; that Dr. J. S. Billings of the Surgeon General's office, War Department, Washington, one of the highest authorities on hospital construction in the United States, has also furnished an elaborate report upon these plans; and that the Committee of Management has decided to recommend their approval and adoption by the Governors, with the understanding that they shall in the first place be submitted, with the several reports upon them which have already been obtained here and in the United States to Mr. Graham and such other experts on hospital architecture as may be deemed advisable by the President and Mr. Redpath, who are to be a committee for that purpose, as well as to afford all necessary information as to the requirements of the Institution. When the architect's finally improved plans and suggestions have been received it is the intention of the Committee of Management to begin at once the erection of at least one portion of the new Hospital. Indeed it cannot be well delayed much longer, for increased accommodation for the sick has long been needed, as well as a building containing the numerous improvements now regarded as essential in institutions provided for the care and cure of the sick.

It will be necessary to make a special appeal to the citizens to contribute a liberal endowment fund for the new building.

In this connection it may be stated that the following gentlemen deserve the thanks of the Corporation for their kind services in making the annual collection for the Hospital in the various wards of the city: W. B. Cumming, West Ward; J. G. Burrows and John Beattie, Centre Ward; W. F. Palmer, St. Lawrence and St. Ann's Ward; Walter Drake, East Ward; R. W. Salter, St. James Ward; Edward Rennick, St. Mary's Ward; W. E. Chester, St. Louis Ward; Jas. C. King, St. Lawrence Ward; Daniel Wilson and George Armstrong, St. Antoine Ward; and Fred S. Vaughan and William Masterman, St. Ann's Ward.

The thanks of the Corporation are also due to the Bell Telephone Company for the gratuitous use of an instrument for some years past.

The first experience of the new departments of Gynæcology and Laryngology shows that a large number of indigent sick have been relieved by them.
