Thousands of people in this country have business or personal or social connections with more than one dominion, and in the pursuit of their ne-gotiations or inquiries it would be a sav-ing of time to be able to pass from one dominion building to another in a closely connected group. Tens of thousands of others are intending emigrants, many of them undecided which of the oversea do-minions they will chocse for their future home, and it would be a material help to them in pursuit of information to help them to a decision to be able to conduct their investigation in a number of separ-ate dominion buildings practically under one roof.
