During the debate on the Naval Aid Bill in the Senate, Hop. J. W. Daniel delivered a forceful and eloquent speech. He is quoted by Hansard as follows:

Hon. Mr. Daniel.—I quite appreciate the fact that it is almost impossible to say anything new on the subject of the Canadian Naval Service, or indeed anything which has not already been said many times over. Nor do I expect, in the few remarks I have to make, to have the slightlest influence in determining the vote of any hongentleman in this Chamber on one side of the House or the other. I think it is very plain to all who have been here for the last few days that the party whip of the hon, gentlemen opposite has a very long lash. It would appear, I think, very evident also that the nigh leader and the off leader, who might be supposed to pull a little apart, have felt the sting of that lash, and now trot along quite happily and joyously together. 

STORM CAUSED MUCH DAM-

FUTURE SERVICE TO HALIFAX.

The Canadian Gazette says: The unwillingness of the authorities to grant a substantial subsidy has caused another postponement of the scheme to establish an express steamship line between Canadian and British ports equal to the fastest New York service. This would call for a service of 23-knot boats between Halifax and Great Britain, which would be run in conjunction with an express railway service and thus bring Winnipeg within sevn days of Liverpool.

At present a 17-knot service is all that is called for under the latest mall contract entered into between the government and the Allan, Canadian Pacific, Canadian Northern, and Oceanic lines. This provides for three sallings a week in summer and two in winter. The agreement is, however, only for two years, and at the end of that time there is a likelihood of the scheme for acceleration receiving greater support.

The total number of vessels on the register books of the Dominion, according to a report just issued by the department of marine and fisheries for the year ending December 31 laat was \$3.380, measuring 838,278 tons, being an increase of 292 vessels and 65,832 tons as compared with 1911. The number of steamers was 3,667, with a gross tonnage of 651,252. The value of vessels of all kinds is placed at \$25,683, 340. It is estimated that 42,485 men and boys, inclusive of masters, were employed on ships registered in Canada during the year 1912.
