London, Sept. 8, 10.25 p . m. - The British and French forces north and east of Paris have had further successes against the German invaders, according to the official builetin
issued today, while in Galicia the Russians continue with considerable success their attempt to envelop and defeat the Austrian army of 400,000 men under General Auffenburg. For the moment, at least, interest centres in the campaign in France, for it is felt that the battle proceeding there is the first real crisis of the war, and will have a most vital effect on the outcome.
