
Roumanians Fight Heavily on Little Lepsa, North of Putna Valley-French and Teuton Artillery Active in Champagne.

Berlin, Aug. 6, via London.—The Russians are preparing to give battle to the Austro-German forces advancing on the Russian front between the Dniester and the Pruth, according to today's arm headquarter's announcement. The Roumanian frontier southwest of Czernowitz, is also the ecene of Russian resistance. The text of the statement

reads:
"Army group of General Von Boehm-Ermolli: Along the Zbrocz,
there have been local engagements. Between the Dniester and the
Pruth the Russians have prepared for battle.

Pront of Archduke Joseph: Southwest of Czernowitz the enemy is offering resistance on the Roumanian frontier. Our attack is proceeding. We are new before the Sereth and after viscorous fighting have captured Radautz. On both sides of the Moldavia, and on the eastern bank of the Bystritzs several height positions were wrested from the Russian forces. Repeated Roumanian attacks on Casimului, and on Little Lepsa, north of the Putna Valley, failed with sanguinary losses."


DINE ON VEGETABLES.




