58th.-George 3rd.-Chap. 24. An Act to exclude certain description of persons from serving as Representatives in General Assembly. Section 1-What persons disqualified Section 2-Suspending clause. Passed 11th March, 1818.

Whereas, it is expedient that per sons who are engaged as Spiritual Guides and Teachers in the profession of religi-ous faith and worship shall abstain as much as possible from secular affairs. Be it therefore enacted &c., 1— From and after the passing of this Act, no person shall be capable of being elected a member to serve in Assembly. clected a member to serve in Assembly, or of sitting or voting therein, who shall be a minister of the Church of England, or of the Church of Scotland, or a Minister, Priest, Ecclesiastic or Teacher, under any other form or profession of religious faith or worship whatever.

2—This Act shall not be in force until His Majesty's Royal Approbation be thereunto had and declared.

(This act was confirmed, finally enacted, and ratified by an Order of the King in Council, dated the 6th of February, 1821, and was published and declared in the Province on the 12th of June, 1821.)
