PREFACE.

DAWSON BROTHERS have prepared this catalogue, of a portion of the books now on their shelves, with a view to render available for selection, for persons living at a distance, the large stock of literature which they always have on hand. School and college textbooks will be the subject of a separate catalogue, and they hope to issue, from time to time, other catalogues, which will be sent to any person who is interested in books.

This catalogue has been arranged in classes for the convenience of those who may wish to extend their libraries in any special subject. The classification of books is, in fact, the classification of human knowledge, and is difficult to perform with entire satisfaction; nevertheless, the attempt has been made to arrange the books under the following heads, which, for the purpose of a bookseller's catalogue, may be sufficient:—

1. **PHILOSOPHY**—Divided into General, Metaphysics, Psychology, Ethics, Logic, Religious Philosophy, Occult Philosophy.
2. **SOCIOLOGY**—Divided into General, Politics, Constitutional Law, Political Economy, Commercial Economics, The Land Question, Law, Education, Military Science, Manners and Social Usages.
3. **THEOLOGY**—Divided into General, Commentaries on the Bible arranged under the headings of the different books, Apologetics, The Future State, Devotional, Anglican, Anglican Services, Presbyterian, Congregational, Congregational Unitarian, Roman, The Roman Controversy.
4. **HISTORY AND BIOGRAPHY**—Divided into General, Modern, Ancient, Ecclesiastical, English, American, Military,

Literary Biography, Miscellaneous Biography, Archeology.

5. **PHILOLOGY**—Divided into General, Classical, Greek, Latin, Foreign, English.
6. **LITERATURE**—Divided into General, Foreign, English Prose, Humorous, Essays and Belles-Lettres, Poetry (collections), Poetry (authors), Shakspeare (commentaries), Shakspeare (text), Sacred Poetry, Fiction, French Literature, Juveniles, Folk Lore.
7. **SCIENCE**—Divided into General, Mathematics, Astronomy, Electricity and Magnetism, Light and Heat, Physics, Chemistry, Geology, Biology, Natural History, Botany, Zoology, Ornithology, Entomology.
8. **APPLIED SCIENCE**—Divided into General, Building and Architecture, Naval, Applied Chemistry and Metallurgy, Mineralogy; Mechanics, Manufactures, Dyeing, Agriculture, and Gardening.
9. **GEOGRAPHY AND TRAVEL**—Divided into General, Arctic, British Colonies, Great Britain, Europe, Italy and Greece, The East, China and Japan, America.
10. **FINE ARTS**—Divided into General, Painting, Sculpture, Music, Decorative Home Arts, Illustrated Works.

Of these subjects, **THEOLOGY, SCIENCE and APPLIED SCIENCE, TRAVEL, FINE ARTS, NOVELS, and FRENCH LITERATURE,** are in separate catalogues, which are either appended to the main catalogue or distributed separately.

DAWSON BROTHERS send this catalogue out in the belief that no catalogue so varied has heretofore been issued in Canada. They feel sure that any one who is interested in books will find (no matter how large his collection may be) some books in it which he wishes to possess; for they have been carefully selected, from time to time, out of the current issues of the day.
