

Mr. John Macdonald Explains the Provisions of his Bill—The Measure Passed Through Committee, With the Addition of a New Clause. OTTAWA, June 10.—In the House to-day Hon. Mr. Thompson introduced a bill in relation to the reorganization of lands, providing that all lands shall be transferred to the new court of claims.

Mr. John Macdonald moved the House into committee to consider the bill creating the new Dominion Department of Trade and Commerce. He said the Cabinet had arrived at the conclusion that the best plan for the reorganization of the country demanded the creation of a department specially charged with matters relating to trade and commerce, home and foreign.

In order to prevent an increase of the duties on the importation of goods, the new department would be the head of his own special department, and would also be the head of the Customs and Excise Department. 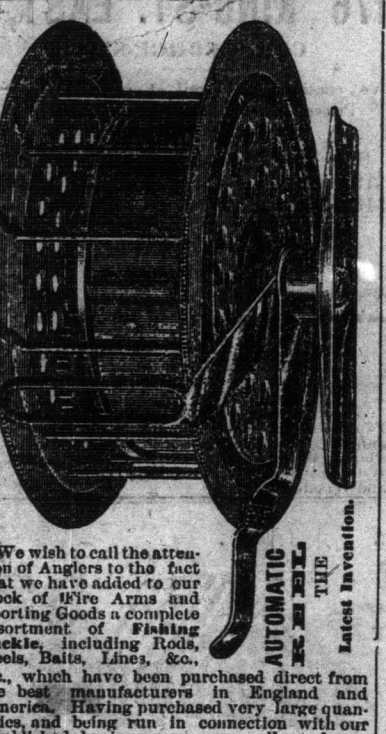
