



Tyrrell and his brother James of the Deminion Geological Survey left last bring to explore the Barren Grounds beween Lake Athabasca and Hudson's Bay. A ster from them was published some weeks ago from Fort Chippewyan. The letter below is the last heard from them. They were then 500 miles from Hudson's Bay and about to cross a country never before traversed by white man. If they have had any kind of luck they ought now to be on the shores of of the bay. But whether they will get home this winter or not is altegether a matter of chance.

FOND DU LAC, June 29, 1893.
We have now reached this the last post of the Hudson's Bay Company that we shall come to before starting into the Barren Grounds, and so far everything has gone on pleasantly and well. Since leaving Fort Chippewyan James has made a survey of the north shore of Lake Athabasca to here, a distance of 180 miles, and I have already surveyed the rest of the shore to Black Lake. Besides, we have secured a guide to take us up to the Barren Grounds and to carry part of our load that far.

The old man who was in charge here last year died last winter, and the post has been abandoued as a summer post, so that we may be out before you receive this letter; but if not, you will know that we are all in good spirits and have already made some interesting discoveries.

HEALTH NEWS

r. Bryce off for Port Dalhousie—A Difficulty Arranged. Difficulty Arranged.

Dr. Bryce, secretary of the Provincial Board of Health, left for Port Dalhousie and Niagara Falls yesterday morning to investigate the complaints from that section of malaria nuisance, arising from water on the Dominion property that has been dammed back by the canal bank.

The Provincial Health Board has been notified that the trouble between Windsor and Walkerville; on account of Walkerville sewage contaminating the Windsor drinking water, has been amicably settled. Each town has agreed to pay a proportionate share of the cost of a new water main to enter the St. Clair above Walkerville.

Editor World: The statement made in the public press that the Independent Order of Foresters "is seriously disturbing the insurance world of two continents"led the writer to examine the system of this body with the result that there is the most ample ground why the present position of the body should seriously disturb all those who are relying upon it as a provision for themselves and those dependent upon them. An examination of the literature of this body shows that all its contracts are what are known as endowment contracts, i.e. (I) For payment at death of the sum named in the certificate; or on its holder attoining age of 70 such amount is payable in 10 annual instalments; or (2) what is known as the special endowment benefit, payable to the holder at death or on attaining expectation of life. To show the entire unsoundness and insufficiency of the system I will at present only give a few illustrations of the special endowment. With regard to the vital element of the insufficiency of the sums charged by this order to meet its contracts the Supreme Chief Ranger stated recently in the public press that any criticism of that character always received the most serious and respectful consideration of the body. The rates quoted above from Government tables are absolute and do not provide any margin for expenses, while the rates of the L.O.F. are liable to a deduction of 5 per cent. for expenses, which would increase the annual deficiency, already less, from one-half the sum absolutely essential for such a contract. 


