Pepresentatives of the United States and Canadian Governments held a Third Round of discussions today in Ottawa on a wide range of fisheries and territorial waters questions. The First Round of these discussions was held in Ottawa on August 26-27, 1963, and the Second Round in Washington on December 4, 1963.

Work has also begun on the construction of a warehouse at the Port of Castries on the Island of St. Lucia and of an airport freight shed at Basseterre on the Island of St. Kitts. A contract of approximately \$1 million for the construction of the schools and warehouses has been awarded to Sirotek Construction Limited of Ottawa and the building programme is expected to be completed within 12 months.
