It is constructed upon a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon in their several positions respecting the Earth, and serves to show what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of her quarters.

The nearer midnight any of the Moon's changes occur, the finer will be the weather during the succeeding week; the nearer noon any of those changes happen, the more foul and wet will be the weather that will follow.

JANUARY.—We had the curiosity to look through a lot of old Almanacks the other day to see what work was recommended to farmers for January. One gave a dissertation on the importance of "Theory,"—another a discourse on "System," or "Science" in farming; but, as for "farm operations," it seemed as if such were not required. Now one great secret of successful farming, as in every other industry, is to prevent waste,—waste of food material, waste of labour, waste of implements, waste of manure, and, last but not least, waste of the manual and mental energy of the farmer himself. If January is a workless month, what a fearful waste there must be on the farm. And January is to be followed by February and March and a portion of April, during all which the farmer may idle, if he be not thoughtful and thrifty. Contentment, in such a case, is great loss, and men who have not provided themselves with farm work for the winter naturally turn to lumbering and such like work, leaving the care of the farm and stock probably to the female portion of the household. Herein lies one of the causes of the backwardness not only of Nova

Scotian, but of American Farming, for when the Farmer-Lumberer returns to his farm, he finds no preparation for spring work, many things have been neglected, and the spring is half over before the most necessary operations have well begun. Remedy: Let every farmer keep a sufficient quantity of live stock for fattening, &c., as shall afford him profitable work for the winter, in connection with other indoor farm work. In order to do this he must raise a very large supply of roots. The storing and caring for these will give him plenty of work to fill up the last months of the year. Then after Christmas he will find his fattening stock in need of much attention, and, ere his barn floor is fairly cleared up, it will be time to cut his cord-wood, to chop a new clearing, and so on. And his profits should come in, not as the price of logs or lumberman's wages, but as the proceeds of Easter Beeves and Fat Wethers. Spring will open with farm yard and boxes full of manure, and the whole farm will burst into a luxuriance that was never known before.

MARCH.—This is hot-bed month, and how to make a hot-bed is a secret worth knowing. Select a sheltered spot, protected from animals, lying to the sun, and near a well or water-butt. Build on this space a neat pile of manure, of such a size that when the frame is put on top, there will be a clear foot of manure outside all round. Cow manure will not heat at this season. Horse manure will not heat at this season, if the animal has not been feed upon oats or some kind of grain. Keeping these facts in view you can select your manure, or make such a mixture, as will give the degree of heat required. Spread over the manure, inside the frame, about four or five inches of very fine soil;

this should have been prepared in the Fall, and kept dry under cover all winter,—otherwise it is likely now to be in a hard frozen mass. The glass sashes are then to be put on and kept close till the hot-bed heats; the steam and heat will start the seeds of weeds, which may be allowed to grow. Air is then given, and when the heat modifies, weed and rake the surface and sow your spring seeds,—cauliflowers, cabbages, celery, tomatoes, &c., for the kitchen garden; and stocks, verbenas, petunias, asters, balsams, and such-like annuals for flower-garden ornament. The seeds will bear a good deal of heat before they emerge from the soil, but as soon as the first leaves begin to appear the flame must be aired daily, taking care to avoid cold draughts.

APRIL.—Some seasons a good deal of useful spring work can be done in April, but usually we have to wait till May for seed-time, still it is the duty of the farmer to have all his winter's work finished before the first of this month; to have his tools and horses and men all ready, and his seed and artificial manures (if to be used) at hand. Manure under cover may be carted out on the frozen soil to where it is to be used. In fields seeded down with timothy last fall, it will now be time to sow clover,—a mixture of red and alsyke is best for hay, as the white clover does not grow tall enough for cutting. Where early potatoes are

required, the seed should be kept in a warm place so as to start the eyes, and whenever the ground is dry enough they may be planted. Peas and broadbeans may be sown at the very beginning of the month. Onions, parsnips and carrots also should be put in as soon as the ground is fit to give them the mere delicate seed-bed they require. Beets and mangold wurzel are usually sown at the end of the month or early in May. All gooseberry and currant bushes should be dressed, dug around &c., apple and pear trees gone over, and generally the whole kitchen garden and orchards thoroughly cared for. Remove the boughs from strawberry plants gradually, and make the flower garden neat and trim.

soil, or is too tender to withstand the coldness of the soil, or the probable frosts of June. Such exceptional crops are hush beans, pole beans, corn, tomatoes, cucumbers, squashes; it is only in warm sandy soils that such things can be safely sown before the end of the month. Turnips also should not be sown in May. Finish all top dressing of grass lands, keep down weeds in gardens, give more air to frames so that the plants may grow strong and hardy, see that all fences are secure before you let out any cattle into the pastures, clear out cellars and sheds, whitewash buildings, and put the whole homestead into summer order.

and turnips may be sown. Early turnips may be put in early in the month, but field turnips for a general crop should not be sown till the ground has been dry and warm long enough to give an opportunity for preparation of the seed-bed. In the flower garden, verbenas may be set out early in the month, and about the middle of the month other less-hardy bedding plants, such as geraniums, petunias, &c. Dahlias had better be kept under glass until the end of the month or beginning of July.

JULY.—Turnip sowing is about the only kind of "Spring Work" that now remains. Let the ground be thoroughly pulverised before sowing, which should never be done except during hot sunshiny weather. The turnip requires heat to start it, yet after the plants are well grown, they enlarge their bulbs most freely under the influence of rather cool wet weather. They do best in light soils, enriched by bone dust or other phosphatic manures. Mangels, potatoes, carrots, &c., will now require careful attention in the way of hoeing, cultivating, weeding, &c. The work of this month makes or mars the crop. Prepare for Haying, which will begin from the middle to end of July, according to the

locality, and the forwardness of the season. In the flower garden much attention must be given, and will be amply repaid, at this season. The flower borders have to be kept open by forking over with a spade or trowel, roses and other plants requiring rich nutriment should have frequent applications of liquid manure, and when insects appear (as they are certain to do this month) the plants should be syringed overhead with water to which a little petroleum has been added; for red-spider this is a sovereign cure, but then recollect that the petroleum may cause the leaves to drop if the dose be to large.

barn can be rigged with a pitching fork to work by horse power, there is another immense saving of manual labour. But, with all these improvements, do not hurry your hay making, do not get into a hay fever, but look calmly on, and see that every forkful of hay is quite dry before you put it into the barn. The time of hay harvest is also the seed-time for hay. If you have any land ready to be seeded down, do so as early in the month as you can. Timothy sown now will give a good crop of hay next season. But don't sow clover now; if you were to do so, the young plants would all be dead before spring.

As garden crops are taken up, clear away the weeds and stalks, and, as opportunity offers, dig up the ground roughly for the winter. OCTOBER.—Where roots are cultivated (and they ought to be on every farm to a much larger extent than they are at the present time in Nova Scotia), the farmer's chief work this month will be in taking up his root crops. We have said nothing about grain, because every farmer is likely to look after that, and harvest it carefully. But in regard to root crops there is a good deal of misconception. To take up and store roots successfully is a simple art when properly understood, but the frequent destruction of roots in the cellar shows that it is not always understood or carried out. Potatoes should be dug in dry

weather, and allowed to dry completely on the surface before being put together in heaps or in the cellar; the best way is to put them on a barn floor and exclude the light, otherwise they will become green and acquire a bitter taste and poisonous qualities. Mangels, turnips and carrots should be topped and the fine root fibres cut off. Before storing they should, in like manner, be exposed to dry air that the wounds may heal over; if put at once into the cellar, the wounded tissue will begin to ferment, and a large portion of the roots will be rotted by contact. If facts such as these are kept clearly in view, no farmer need lose his roots. Of course the cellar must be kept well aired and dry, and frost carefully excluded.

County Courts.

By Chap. 18 of the Acts of 1874, provision has been made for the erection of County Courts, and for the purpose thereof the Province has been divided into SEVEN DISTRICTS, viz.:

District No. 1 embracing the County of Halifax.

District No. 2 embracing the counties of Lunenburg, Queens and Shelburne.

District No. 3 embracing the Counties of Annapolis, Digby and Yarmouth.

District No. 4 embracing the Counties of Kings, Hants and Colchester

District No. 5 embracing the Counties of Pictou and Cumberland.

District No. 6 embracing the Counties of Inverness, Antigonish and Guysborough.

District No. 7 embracing the Counties of Cape Breton, Victoria and Richmond.

Section 3 of said Act provides that there shall be one Judge for each district, who shall reside in the district for which he is appointed, and hold office during good behaviour; every Judge shall be a Barrister of at least seven years' standing. Section 4 provides for the holding of Courts. Section 5 provides that the sittings of each Court shall continue so long as business shall require, except in cases where the same Judge is to hold a Court elsewhere. Section 6 prescribes the practice as to notices of trial, &c. Section 7 regulates the holding of Chambers. Section 8 provides for the appointment of a Clerk for each County; and Section 9 provides for the appointment of a Deputy Clerk. Section 10 prescribes the mode and manner of adjournment when a Judge cannot attend, and as to how another Judge may be called on. Section 11 prohibits every Judge from practising as a Barrister, on pain of forfeiture of his office. Section 12 prescribes the oath to be taken by the Judge. Section 13 provides that the practice, forms and mode of procedure, when not specially provided for by said Act, shall be according to the practice of the Supreme Court. By Section 14 it is enacted that no County Court shall have cognizance of any action wherein (1) title to land is brought in question, or (2) the validity of any devise, bequest, or limitation is disputed, [some slight exceptions to this], or (3) for crim. con., seduction, or (4) breach of promise of marriage, or (5) any action against any Justice of the Peace for anything done by him in the execution of his office. Section 15 enacts that, except as above, said Courts shall have jurisdiction and hold pleas in all actions *ex contractu*, when the debt or damages claimed do not exceed \$400; and in all actions of tort where damages claimed do not exceed \$200; and in actions on bail bonds to a Sheriff in any case in a County Court, whatever the penalty may be; and all appeals from Magistrates shall be to the County Courts. Section 16 requires that every plea, replication or other pleading relating to the title to land shall be verified by affidavit that the same is not vexatiously pleaded, nor for delay, nor to oust the jurisdiction of the Court. Section 17 prescribes for the change of venue on its being shown that the cause can be more conveniently tried in some other County Court. Section 18 regulates the mode of issuing and serving process, and the time of return of writs shall be the same as in the Supreme Court; when the Sheriff is a party to a cause the Coroner acts in his place. Section 19 declares that the powers of the Clerks of the County Courts shall be the same as those of the Prothonotaries

of the Supreme Court; Commissioners to take affidavits in Supreme Court are Commissioners also for County Courts. Section 20 provides where the Court has no jurisdiction in an action brought judgment shall be rendered as in case of nonsuit, the defendant having execution for his costs only. Section 21 provides that all Acts of the Province relating to all matters connected with the administration of justice in the Supreme Court, shall apply to County Courts when not otherwise regulated by the Act. Section 22 states that the Clerk of the Court shall file all papers, and keep books of record and judgments, copies of which latter duly certified, are evidence of the same in all Courts of the Province. Section 23 provides that the Clerk shall furnish certificate of judgment when required; he may also tax costs, and enter, sign and date in the County Judgment Book, judgments in undefended causes brought for the recovery of debts, by confession or default, said judgments to be as valid as if signed by a Judge; Writs of execution are to be same in form, with like force and effect, as those of the Supreme Court. When lands are levied on they are to be advertised, sold and conveyed by the Sheriff, as in the Supreme Court. Section 24 provides that the writ of replevin may issue from County Courts when the value of the goods detained does not exceed \$200. Section 25 authorizes the person entitled to immediate possession of premises, which the tenant refuses to deliver up, to apply to the County Court Judge, and on his making oath that the tenant has occupied premises for an expired term, and has received notice to quit, such Judge shall issue a summons to tenant to show cause why he holds over. On neglect to attend, or inability to show cause, Judge issues warrant to Sheriff to deliver possession to the person entitled to immediate possession. Section 26 provides that the County Court, shall have Supreme Court power and authority, vested by Chap. 97 Revised Statutes, 4th series, and by Chap. 137 revised statutes, 3rd series. Section 27 abolishes the summary jurisdiction of the Supreme Court, continuing present power in all suits and proceedings pending. Section 28 provides that Executors and Administrators may sue and be sued in County Courts in cases when the amount does not exceed \$400. Section 29 authorizes the County Court, to issue writs into any County of the province. Section 30 provides that all causes are to be tried without a jury, by the Judge, (subject to an appeal to the Supreme Court), unless, when the claim is over \$80, the County Judge deems it proper to have a jury, in which case the Clerk shall instantly return a jury of ten. Section 31 provides that the Sheriff is to summon ten petit jurors from persons living within 5 miles of the Court House. Section 32 orders that five out of the ten jurors shall be empanelled and sworn; four of whom, in case after two hours no agreement is had may render a verdict. Section 33 declares that the jurors are subject to the like pains and penalties, as may be inflicted by a Judge of the Supreme Court. Section 34 orders that County Court Judges, are *Ex officio* Justices of the Peace in the district where residing without power to issue any Civil process in that capacity. Section 35 provides that subject to the assent of the Supreme Court Judges, the County Court Judges may make rules regulating forms of proceedings. Section 36 gives to County Court, some power to amend errors in Civil cases as Supreme Court has. Section 37 declares the Court competent to punish for contempt by fine not to exceed \$50, or by imprisonment not to exceed one month. Section 38 arranges for the Sheriff's fees. Section 39 provides that affidavits used in

the County Court, may be sworn before a County Court Judge, a Supreme Court Judge, or any Commissioner for taking of affidavits in the Supreme Court. Section 40 empowers a County Court Judge, to issue an order under his hand and the seal of the Court, for prisoners to appear and give evidence in causes. Section 41 authorizes a County Court Judge, or any Commissioner authorized to take affidavits in the Supreme Court, to issue Capias out of the County Court. Sec. 42 orders the Sheriff to arrest within one month after date of such Capias, defendant to remain in custody until he gives a bail bond to Sheriff, or make a deposit of sum endorsed on Capias with \$50 for costs. Section 43 asserts that all further proceedings where party is arrested under process are to be according to practice of the Supreme Court. Section 44 states that when the practice is not provided for by the Act it is to be arranged by the Judge of County Court. Section 45 gives authority to the Judge to grant a rule for a writ of execution for the recovery of costs. Section 46 provides that the Sheriff of the County Court, shall be allowed the same fees as now given by Supreme Court. Section 47 prevents any but Attorneys of the Supreme Court practising in County Courts. Section 48 authorizes the Governor in Council to provide seals for the various County Courts. Section 49 provides for the fees of Lawyers. Section 50 provides that the costs of all suits defaulted are to be taxed by the Clerk, and the costs of all contested suits are to be taxed by the Judge, who tried the cause. Section 51 provides for an appeal from County Court, to Supreme Court. Section 52 empowers the County Court Judges to grant rules and orders in cases of irregularity. Section 53 provides for stay of proceedings upon appeal. Section 54 provides for the payment of Jury's fees. Section 55 abolishes the jurisdiction of the City Court for City of Halifax, in all cases of torts and forcible entry and detainer. Section 56 repeals inconsistent portions of existing laws. Section 57 stays the operation of the County Court Act, till proclamation by Lieut.-Governor in Council.

- For 1 Square Rigged Vessel, 2 balls close up, one on the outer halliard and one on the inner halliard.
- “ 2 Do, 1 ball hoisted on the outer halliard, and 1 close up on the inner halliard; outer ball dropped.
- “ 3 Do, 2 balls close up on the outer, and one on the inner.
- “ 4 Do, 2 balls separated, and one close up on the inner halliard.
- “ 5 Do, a pendant of any colour on the outer halliard, and one ball close up inside.
- “ 6 Do, a pendant under a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball at the inner halliard close up.
- “ 7 Do, a pendant over a ball close up on the outer halliard, and a ball close up on the inner halliard.
- “ 8 Do, a pendant under two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.
- “ 9 Do, a pendant between two balls close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.
- “ 10 Do, a flag of any colour close up on the outer halliard, with a ball close up on the inner halliard.

The above balls, &c., are hoisted on the east or west yard arm, according to the *quarter* the vessel first appears in.

When Sailing Vessels are reported from an Outpost, the following signals are made on the lower yard, now used exclusively for sailing vessels, as repeats:—

For Square Rigged Vessel, two balls of a size, one at the outer, the other at the inner halliard, close up.

Lanterns are hoisted at night to denote a Steamer reported.

Red light on outer and white light inner on E. yard-arm denotes Steamer East reported.

Green light outer and white light inner on W. yard-arm—Steamer West reported.

Red light above white, 12 feet apart, mail from England.

Green light above white, 12 feet apart, mail for England.

White light above red, 12 feet apart, Newfoundland mail.

White light above green, 12 feet apart, Bermuda mail.

Green light above red, 12 feet apart, English Man-of-War.

Red, Green and white, 12 feet apart, enemy's Man-of-War.

The coloured lantern is always shown at yard arm, and the white one at the inner halliard, E or W, according to the quarter the Steamer is reported in.

Numbers are indicated the same as on the lower yard.

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; The Coast of New Brunswick and the United States in the Bay of Fundy; and at Cape Ray, Newfoundland.

WEST FROM HALIFAX.

CHEBUCTO HEAD—On the Head. A revolving light, showing its greatest brilliancy every minute.

AN IRON BELL BUOY, painted black and surmounted by a cage, has been moored south-east by south, one-quarter of a mile from the Blind Sisters, off Sambro, to the westward of the entrance to Halifax Harbor. AN IRON CAN BUOY, painted black, has been placed two cables lengths south of the S. W. breaker off Sambro.

SAMBRO ISLAND—On the S. W. side of the entrance to Halifax harbor. A fixed white light, elevated 115 ft. above the sea, visible in clear weather from 20 to 25 miles. White Octagonal Building, Lat. $44^{\circ} 26' N.$ Lon. $63^{\circ} 35' W.$ In thick or foggy weather, signal guns from ships will be answered from the signal station by firing two guns in quick succession, and the same reply will be made from the island to the sound of a steamer's whistle.

PEGGY'S POINT—East point of entrance to St. Margaret's Bay. A fixed red light, about 65 feet above high water. Square white Building standing about 40 yards from the shore. Lat. $44^{\circ} 29' N.$ Lon. $63^{\circ} 57' W.$

CHESTER LIGHT ON IRON BOUND ISLAND—Entrance to Mahone Bay. One fixed white light, 25 ft. horizontally visible from sea from W. S. W. to N. E. Elevated 50 feet above high water. Lat. $44^{\circ} 26' 15'' N.$ Long. $64^{\circ} 4' 10'' W.$

MARGARET'S BAY—On the south point of Green Island, Margaret's Bay, Lat. $44^{\circ} 23' N.$, Long $64^{\circ} 2' 45'' W.$ The light is a revolving red and white light, showing alternate red and white flashes every minute and a half, and making a complete revolution every three minutes. The light is 59 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather will be seen at a distance of 15 miles.

MAHONE BAY—On Hobson's Nose Island, A fixed red light. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white.

CROSS ISLAND—Upon the S. E. point of the Island. Two lights placed vertically 44 feet apart, the lower light is fixed; the upper one flashing at intervals of a minute, visible 14 miles. Building red. Lat. $44^{\circ} 19' N.$ Long. $64^{\circ} 9' W.$

BATTERY POINT—At the entrance of Lunenburg harbor. A fixed white light, visible 12 miles. White square building. This harbor is easy of access, buoys are placed in the bay and entrance to the harbor on the Sculpin Rock, Haddock Shoal, Battery Point Shoal, and Head Shoal. In approaching the harbor from seaward the Buoy on Sculpin Rock, painted red and black in horizontal stripes, may be left on either hand, giving it a birth of two cable's length. The other buoys are painted black and must be left on the port hand going in. Iron can buoys in summer, spar buoys in winter.

IRON-BOUND ISLAND—Entrance to LaHave River. A bright flash light, of 20 seconds duration, followed by eclipses of 30 seconds. The lantern is on a square white tower, on the southern side of the island, 70 feet above sea level, visible from all points of approach.

MOBER'S ISLAND—West side of the entrance to LaHave River. A

fixed *red* light, on the S. E. point of the island. Square white building, 58 feet above sea level, standing 100 feet from the cliff. Lat. $44^{\circ} 12'$ N. Long. $63^{\circ} 18' W$.

PORT MEDWAY HARBOR—On Admiralty Head, West side of the entrance to the port. Square white building, with a black square in the centre of the seaward sides. A fixed *white* light, 44 ft. above sea level, visible 10 miles. Spar buoys are placed in the channel to Port Medway harbor, on the breaking ledges, Nautilus Rock, corner ground and edge of flats off Bang's Point. In passing in from seaward the *red* buoys must be left on the starboard, and the *black* buoys on the port hand.

LIVERPOOL—South end of Coffin's Island. A revolving *red* light appearing full at intervals of two minutes, 80 ft. above sea level. Building octagonal, in red and white horizontal stripes, visible 16 miles.

FORT POINT—Entrance to the inner harbor of Liverpool. A *red* fixed light, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand when entering the harbor.

PORT MOUTON HARBOUR—On North-east point Spectacle Island, a *fixed red light*.

LITTLE HOPE ISLAND—Off Liverpool. A revolving *red* light 40 feet above high water, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute. Situate nearly in the centre of the island. Lat. $43^{\circ} 8' 43'' N$ Long. $64^{\circ} 47' 15'' W$. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white.

PORT LEHERBERT, QUEEN'S COUNTY—On Shingle Beach, East side of the Harbour, fixed *red* light.

GULL ROCK—Off the entrance to Ragged Island harbor. A white fixed *light*, 51 feet above sea level. Square white building, Lat. $43^{\circ} 39' N$. Long. $64^{\circ} 66' W$.

CARTER'S ISLAND, RAGGED ISLAND HARBOR—On the middle of the Island, fixed *red* light. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white.

SHELburne HARBOR—On Sand Point, $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile S. E. of the Point.

SHELburne—On the S. E. point of McNutt's Island, at the entrance of the harbor. Two *white* light vertical—the upper light 100 ft. above sea level, and visible 18 miles; the lower light 38 ft. below the lantern at the top of the building, and visible 10 miles. Building painted black and white in vertical stripes.

NEGRO ISLAND—On North-east point. A revolving red and *white* light, showing alternately red and white flashes every minute. The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white.

BARRINGTON—On Baccaro Point, E. side of the entrance to the harbor. A *red* fixed light. Square white building, with a black ball on the seaward side.

CAPE SABLE ISLAND—A revolving light, bright 15 seconds and dark 25 seconds, elevated 49 feet, visible 12 miles. Octagonal white building. Lat. $43^{\circ} 27' N$. Long. $65^{\circ} 36' W$. High water at Cape Sable, full and change, at $7\frac{1}{2}$ o'clock. Spring tides rise 12 ft., neaps 6 ft.

SEAL ISLAND—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the S. point of Seal Island. A fixed *white* light, 80 feet above high water, and may be seen when approaching, from any point of the compass, at a distance of 18 or 20 miles. Octagonal white building. The *Blond Rock* lies about $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles S. by W. from the light house. Between this rock and the island there are some dangers; the ground

is rocky throughout and large vessels ought not to attempt passing between them. A Fog Whistle is also in operation at Seal Island—The whistle sounds in each minute as follows: A blast of five seconds, then an interval of five seconds, then a blast of five seconds and an interval of 45 seconds, to complete the minute.

PUBNICO HARBOUR—On the S. E. side of the entrance to the harbor, about 13 miles northerly of Cape Sable. A fixed *white* light, 28 ft. above high water, (rise and fall 12 feet.) Square white building, standing 50 fathoms from low water mark. Spar buoys mark the channel. Black left on port hand, red on starboard in approaching the harbour.

ARGYLE—A fixed *red* catoptric light, 115 feet above the level of high water has been erected on the south point of White Head Island, Yarmouth County, for the purpose of guiding vessels into Argyle harbour, Lat. $43^{\circ} 39' 40''$ N. Long. $65^{\circ} 52' 4''$ W.

FISH ISLAND—On Big Fish Island, E. side of the entrance to Tusket River. Two fixed horizontal *white* lights, visible 12 miles.

YARMOUTH—On the eastern island of Cape Fourchu, West side of the entrance to the harbor. A bright *revolving* light, 145 ft. above sea level, visible quarter minute and invisible half a minute. Seen in clear weather 18 or 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. Lat. $43^{\circ} 48'$ N. Long. $99^{\circ} 09'$ W. Steam Fog Whistle near Light House, a blast of 10 seconds in each minute, in operation in all thick weather.

YARMOUTH HARBOUR—A fixed *red* catoptric light, 27 feet above high water, has been erected on the end of the Reef on the South West point of Bunker's Island, east side of entrance to Yarmouth harbour. Lat. $43^{\circ} 48' 30''$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 8' 45''$ W.

AN IRON BELL BUOY, painted *red*, has been moored to the westward of Trinity Ledge, off Yarmouth harbour.

CAPE ST. MARY'S—East side of entrance to St. Mary's Bay, Digby Co. A *revolving* light, attaining its greatest brilliancy every minute, and showing alternately red and white faces, 100 ft. above high water. White octagonal building. Lat. $44^{\circ} 04'$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 08'$ W.

CHURCH POINT—A fixed *red* catoptric light, has been erected on Church Point, on the east side of St. Mary's Bay, Digby County. Lat. $44^{\circ} 1' 95''$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 7' 35''$.

WEYMOUTH—On the Beach, South side of the entrance to the harbour. A fixed *white* light.

BRIER ISLAND—Situate on the western side. A fixed *white* light, 92 ft. above sea level, visible 15 miles. Octagonal white building. A steam fog whistle on Whipple's Point, S. W. of light, in operation in all thick weather.

WESTPORT—On Peter's Island, at the S. entrance of the E. side of the Bay of Fundy. Two *white* fixed lights, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, 40 feet above high water mark, visible 10 miles, and is intended to lead vessels into Westport, or through Grand Passage. Square white building.

BOAR'S HEAD—N. entrance Petite Passage, Bay of Fundy. Alternate flashes, *red* and *white*, at intervals of 60 seconds. Square white building.

DIGBY GUT—On Point Prim, at the entrance of the Gut. A fixed *white* light, 76 ft. above high water, and visible 13 miles. Building square, painted *red*. A Steam Fog Whistle on Point Prim, in thick

or foggy weather, sounded 8 seconds in each minute, making an interval of 52 seconds between each blast.

PORT WILLIAMS—Two fixed *white* lights, 20 feet apart, perpendicularly, visible from all points of approach. Square white building. Port Williams is distant from Digby Gut Light E. 25 miles; and from Black Rock W. 28 miles.

MARGARETVILLE—A red *fixed* light, visible 10 miles from all points of approach. Building square, painted in white and black horizontal stripes. Margaretville is distant E. 37 miles from Digby Gut Light, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock Light.

BLACK ROCK—A *white* fixed light, 55 ft. above the level of high water, and visible 12 miles. Square white building.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT—On Hetty Point, N. side of the entrance to the River, and three leagues to the eastward of Cape Chignecto. One *fixed* light, 40 feet above high water visible 10 miles. Square white building.

A STEAM FOG WHISTLE has been erected at Cape D'or, Cumberland County.

PARRSBORO'—On the W. side of the entrance to Parrsboro' River. A fixed *white* light, 30 ft. above high water, visible 9 miles. Octagonal white tower, standing close to high water mark on the beach.

BURNT COAT HEAD—The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building. A *white* fixed light, 75 feet above high water level, and visible from all points of approach.

SPENCER'S POINT—A *white* fixed light is placed on the top of a building at this point, on the northern shore of Cobequid Bay, near the head of Minas Basin.

WALTON HARBOUR—A fixed *red* catoptric light on the north side of the entrance to Walton harbour, Basin of Mines, Hants County. Lat. $45^{\circ} 14' 0''$ N. Long. $64^{\circ} 0' 45''$

HORTON BLUFF—A *white* fixed light, 95 ft. above high water level, (rise and fall 40 to 45 ft.) visible in clear weather over the greater part of the Basin of Minas (after passing Cape Blomedon) and above the Five Islands and up to Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it. Square white building, standing 66 feet from the Bluff.

GANNET ROCK—The Gannet Rock is 66 feet above high water, and has a light house upon it, painted black and white, in vertical stripes. A *revolving* light (visible 12 miles), lies S. W. by S. distant $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles from the southern point of Three Islands, and S.S.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 7 miles from the S.W. head of the Grand Manan. A gun is fired to answer signals during a fog. There are a number of small ledges and sunken rocks about it, which are always breaking. The light stands conspicuously in the immediate vicinity of all the sunken rocks and dangers, extending from the old Proprietor to the Seal Islands of Machias, a distance of about 20 miles. Between the northernmost and southernmost of the Murr Ledges there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them above water, and which extend westward from the light house about 4 miles. From this range farther westerly, about six miles, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands, near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND—S. W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W. from Grand Manan, lie the Machias Islands. On the eastern island two light houses are

erected, showing *fixed* lights, distant from each other about 200 feet in the direction of E.S.E. and W.N.W., by which they are easily distinguished from all other lights on the coast. Elevated about 54 and 58 feet above high water, visible 15 miles. A gun is fired every four hours during a fog. Both buildings white.

GRAND MANAN ISLAND—On Swallow Tail Point, N. E. side of the island. A *white* fixed light, 148 feet above high water, visible 17 miles, Building white, Lat. $44^{\circ} 45' 22''$ N. Long. $66^{\circ} 44' 4''$ W. This is a conspicuous mark in the S. Channel between Briar Island and Grand Manan.

LITTLE RIVER—On an island at the entrance of the River. A fixed *white* light, varied by flashes every 90 seconds, 40 feet above high water, visible 11 miles.

QUODDY HEAD—On the S. E. side of Quoddy Head. A fixed *white* light, 133 feet above sea level, visible in clear weather 17 miles. It bears from the Southern point of Grand Manan $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 13 miles, and from the Northern point of said island W.N.W. $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles. Has a fog trumpet.

CAMPO BELLO—On the N. E. extremity of the island. A *white* fixed light, 64 ft. above the sea, visible 15 miles. Building white with a red cross. This light enables vessels to enter Head Harbor at all times. It is also a guide to vessels entering the main channel, to West Isles, Moose Island, and the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy.

POINT LE PREAU—Upon this projecting head land two fixed *white* lights, one above the other, distant 28 feet. The lower lantern is fixed to the outside of the building, and throws its light quite inshore, both to the eastward and westward into Mace's Bay. The highest light is 81 feet, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes, 5 ft. broad, and bears from the easternmost Wolves E. by N, 11 miles.

ST. JOHN, N. B. HARBOUR—On Patridge Island at the entrance of the River and harbor. A *white* fixed light, 120 feet above high water, and visible 20 miles. Building red and white in vertical stripes. A Steam Whistle is sounded 10 seconds in every minute during fog and snow storms, audible 4 to 6 miles. There is also a *Bell Buoy* at the extremity of the ledge at the eastern end of the island, which is very useful to vessels in thick or rough weather. The bell can be heard 3 miles.

QUACO HEAD—On a small rock lying off Quaco Head. A revolving *white* light, 58 feet above high water, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute, visible 15 miles. Building red and white in horizontal stripes.

GAPE ENRAGE—On the point of that name in Westmorland nearly opposite Apple River Light in Cumberland. A plain *white* light, 151 feet above the sea, visible 15 miles. Square white building.

GRINDSTONE ISLAND—On Grindstone Island, Chignecto Bay. Lat. $45^{\circ} 43' 13''$ N. Lon. $64^{\circ} 37' 25''$ W., 60 feet above high water. Octagonal white tower.

EAST FROM HALIFAX.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side of Halifax harbor. A fixed *white* light, elevated 58 ft. above sea level, and visible 10 miles.

DEVIL'S ISLAND—On the S. W. point of Devil's Island, Eastern

Building octagonal, painted black and white in vertical stripes. Lat. $44^{\circ} 39' 51''$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 51' 32''$ W. Visible 14 miles.

OUTER BEAVER, OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND—On South East part of the Island. A revolving *white* flash light, 70 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. Square white building with two black balls on its seaward side. A *reef* extends eastward from Beaver Island some distance. Lat. $44^{\circ} 49' N.$, Long. $62^{\circ} 21' W.$

LISCOMB HARBOUR—Revolving Light on Liscomb Island, 450 feet E. S. E. from West end of Cranberry Point on the West side of Liscomb Island, East side of the entrance to Liscomb Harbour. The light is a revolving *red* and *white* light, showing alternate red and white flashes every two minutes; elevated 64 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 15 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric, or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 feet high, painted white; roof of dwelling painted red. WHITE HEAD ISLAND—On the S. W. point of the island. A bright *flash* light of 10 seconds duration followed by eclipses of 10 seconds, displaying alternately 3 flashes and 3 eclipses in a minute. town of Arichat. A fixed *red* light, elevated 70 feet above high water. Lat. $40^{\circ} 28' 51''$ N. Long. $60^{\circ} 53' 40''$ W. The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white. Visible 14 miles.

ARICHAT—On Marachie Point, S. side of the entrance to the harbour. A *white* fixed light, 34 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Square white building. Lat. $45^{\circ} 29' 02''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 01' 52''$ W.

ARICHAT HARBOUR—The light is a fixed *red* light on the North end of Jerseyman's Island, elevated 39 feet above the level of high water, and in fine weather should be seen from a distance of 11 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building, 28 ft. high, painted white. Position—Lat. $45^{\circ} 30' 20''$ N., Lon. $60^{\circ} 3' 4''$ W. Church which will lead in clear of the Shoal. Only those well acquainted should pass to the eastward of the Shoal, or bring the beacon to bear to the north of N. E. AN IRON CAN BUOY painted red has been placed about one Cable's length S. W. of the Shoal in six fathoms of water. The buoy will be placed on or about the 1st of May in each year and taken up about the 10th December.

GUYSBOROUGH HARBOUR—On the W. side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chebucto Bay. A fixed *white* light, 30 feet above high water, visible 8 miles. Lat. $45^{\circ} 22' 47''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 29' 11''$ W.

EDDY, OR SAND POINT—(Gut of Canso.) On the W. side of the S. entrance to the Strait of Canso. Lat. $45^{\circ} 30' 29''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 13' 42''$ W. Two horizontal fixed *white* lights, 24 ft. apart, elevated 25 ft. each, visible eight miles. Square white building, with a black diamond on the seaward side.

POMKET ISLAND—St. George's Bay, Antigonish Co. Standing on the N. side, 50 yards from the E. end of the island. A fixed *red* light. Square white building, 50 ft. above high water. Lat. $45^{\circ} 38' N$. Long. $61^{\circ} 49' W$.

CAPE ST. GEORGE—On the N. side of the Cape. A revolving *white* light every half minute, visible 25 miles. 350 ft. above high water. Square white tower. Lat. $45^{\circ} 52' 35''$ N. Long. $61^{\circ} 53' 40''$ W.

PICTOU ISLAND—On the S. E. point of the island. A *white* fixed light, 52 ft. above sea level, visible 11 miles. Square white building, Lat. $45^{\circ} 49' 10''$ N. Long. $62^{\circ} 30' 29''$ W.

PICTOU HARBOUR—On the S. point of the entrance to the harbour. A *white* fixed light, 65 feet above sea level, visible 12 miles. A small

AMET ISLAND—Off Tatamagouche Harbour. A fixed *white* light, The lantern is placed on the top of the keeper's dwelling, which is painted white, 44 feet above high water mark. Building square, painted white. Light visible 10 miles. Lat. $45^{\circ} 50' 15''$ N. Long. $63^{\circ} 15'$ W.

MULLIN'S POINT—North side of entrance to Wallace Harbor, a fixed *white* light. The tower is a square wooden building, painted white.

PUGWASH HARBOR—A *fixed* light on Seaman's or Fishing Point, on the east side of the entrance to Pugwash Harbour. The light is a fixed light, showing red seaward, and white towards the harbour, it is elevated 48 feet above high water, and in clear weather can be seen from a distance of 8 miles. The illuminating apparatus is catoptric or by reflectors. The tower is a square wooden building 44 feet high, painted white. Position, Lat. $45^{\circ} 52' 30''$ N. Long. $63^{\circ} 40' 30''$ W.

PORT HOOD—A *fixed* light, shows *red* on the N. side, and *white* to the southward, elevated 54 feet, and visible 10 miles. Square *white* tower. Lat. 46° N., Long. $61^{\circ} 31' 40''$ W.

IRON CAN BUOYS have been placed at the following Shoals, Port Hood Harbor, C.B. Portsmouth Point, Spithead, Smith Spit, Dean Shoal, also one at Judique Shoal. Judique Shoal and Dean Shoal Buoy are painted red the other three are painted black. These Buoys will be placed on or about the 1st of May in each year and taken up about the 10th of November.

MARGARIE, OR SEA WOLF ISLAND—On the N. W. side of Cape Breton, nearly midway between Mabou and Cheticamp harbours, and distant 2½ miles from the main land. A *white* fixed light, near the centre and summit of the island, elevated 298 feet, visible 21 miles from all points of approach. Square white building. Lat. $46^{\circ} 21' 30''$ N., Long. $61^{\circ} 15' 33''$. To vessels in dangerous proximity to the Island the Light may become obscured by the abrupt cliffs on the side of the Island.

CHETICAMP—The light is a revolving *white* light on S. W. end of Cheticamp Island, revolution every one and a half minutes, and a flash every 45 seconds, elevated about 149 feet above the level of high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 20 miles. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric or by reflectors. INGONISH ISLAND—A fixed *white* light is exhibited at an elevation of 237 feet above high water, and in clear weather can be seen at a distance of 15 miles. The tower is a square wooden building, 40 feet high, and painted white. Lat. 46° 41' 20" N. Lon. 60° 20' W.

OUTER BIRD ISLAND—Between the entrance of the Great Bras d'Or, and St. Ann's (E. coast of Cape Breton). Alternate flashes of *red* and *white* at intervals of 60 seconds, elevated 77 ft., visible 14 miles. Octagonal white building. Revolving. Lat. 46° 23' 10" N., Long. 62° 22' 36" W.

ST. ANN'S HARBOR—On Point of Beach on north side of the entrance to the harbour, a fixed *white* light is exhibited at an elevation of 24 feet above high water, and can be seen at a distance of 8 miles. The light is for the purpose of guiding vessels through Bana Straits, and navigating the Little and Great Bras d'Or Lakes.

SYDNEY HARBOUR—The light is a fixed *red* light on the West end of South Bar, elevated 30½ feet above high water, and in clear weather should be seen from a distance of 10 miles. The illuminating apparatus is Catoptric or by reflectors.—The tower is a square wooden building, 20 feet high, painted white. Position—Lat. 46° 12' 40" N., Long 60° 12' 40" W. This light is for the purpose of guiding vessels into the harbour and marking the dangers of the bar.

LOW POINT—On the eastern side of the entrance to Sydney, C. B., harbour. A *white* fixed light elevated 70 feet, visible 14 miles. Building octagon red and white vertical stripes. Lat. 46° 16' 12" N., Long. 60° 09' 22" W.

FLINT ISLAND—On Flint Island, E. coast of Cape Breton, between
