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

U.S. WARSHIPS SENT TO MEXICAN COAST

Washington Government to Back Up Demands by Force, if Necessary.

FOREIGNERS IN PERIL Twenty-Five Thousand in Capital Run Risk From Rioters and Famine.

Canadian Press Despatch. WASHINGTON, March 9.—American warships were being despatched to Mexican waters today as the latest move on the part of the American Government in the Mexican crisis.

Foreigners in Danger. The sending of war vessels followed vigorous representations to Gen. Carranza, demanding prompt improvement in conditions affecting foreigners and their interests in Mexican territory under his control.

It was confidently expected in administration circles today that the latest steps taken by the American Government would cause a change in the attitude of Gen. Carranza towards foreigners.
