



The Grand Master then read the following Report :-VICTORIA, B. C., 13th February, 1884

To the Officers and Members

of the Grand Lodge of British Columbia, I.O.O.F.

BROTHERS:—In accordance with the rules and regulations of our Order, we again meet in this Hall for the purpose of exchanging our views on matters of interest to the Lodges we represent, and to legislate for the welfare of our beloved Order in the Jurisdiction. I am glad to meet you again, and I trust each representative will be governed by a sense of the responsibility with which he is intrusted.

I am happy to say that the growth of our fraternity in this Jurisdiction, during the year that has elapsed, has been very gratifying and that its condition is prosperous. The many excellent feature presented by a large number of other secret societies, has not had such a depressing effect on our progress as might be imagined; on the contrary the benefits of Oddfellowship are too plainly felt to admit of any retrograde movement, and it is my earnest hope that future year may find it equally as progressive as at the present time, and I would strongly recommend this Grand Body to try and introduce the Endowment system into the Order.

The interests of the Order in general, have been carefully provided for by the annual session of the Sovereign Grand Lodge, held in the city of Providence, R. I., in September last, and amongst its decisions immediately affecting this jurisdiction, I have to inform you that its committee on finance recommended that the representative tax due by this Grand Lodge for the year 1882 and 1883 be remitted. This recommendation was duly considered and adopted by the Sovereign Grand Lodge.

I would respectfully recommend, that one of your actions durin the present session should be the despatch of a petition to the Sove eign Grand Lodge, asking for the remission of the tax on the sam grounds for the year 1884. I advise this step for the reason that such a course will shew the Sovereign Grand Lodge that we are not also gether dependent on that Grand Body in dealing with our necessities without bringing such matters ourselves to its notice.

My official duties during the past year have not been onerous, fact that I am proud to state as speaking well for the peace and has mony which has prevailed throughout the Jurisdiction. I would however, here point out the necessity of every D.D.G.M. making him self conversant with the laws of the Order, as upon the decision of these officers in matters referred to them by Lodges in their districts depends much of the harmony and correct working of the Lodge To this end I would recommend that the senior Lodge in each districts

My official acts are herewith submitted for your consideration.

LODGES INSTITUTED.

On the 4th of March last I granted a dispensation for the organision of a new Lodge of the Order at Wellington, in District No. 3, and on the 16th I proceeded to that place in company with the Grand Seretary and Grand Marshal to institute the same. The new Lodge is known as Harmony, No. 6, and was opened under most flattering framstances. Thirty members were inlitated on the night of institution, all young men, whose efforts in thus extending the good work of the Order will no doubt meet with good results. As the Lodge is working under a temporary dispensation I trust that the necessary tops will be taken by the Committee on Petitions and the requisite Charter granted by you.

DISPENSATIONS.

In addition to the above I have granted dispensations during he year as follows :—

On 19th March, 1883,—To observe the sixty-fourth (64th) Anniresary of our Order on the 26th April, in such manner as the Lodges the Jurisdiction might consider most favorable for its welfare.

On the 23rd July, 1883,—To Victoria Lodge, No. 1, to confer the lare degrees of the Order upon one of its members at one meeting. The application for this dispensation should properly have been made any Deputy for District No. 1, but as it was addressed to me I confered it advisable to grant the request of the Lodge.

INSTALLATIONS.

On 5th July, 1883,—Installed the officers elect of Dominion office, No. 4.

On 9th July, 1883,—Installed the officers elect of Victoria Lodge, in l.

On 11th July, 1883,—Installed the officers elect of Columbia colge, No. 2.

On 2nd January, 1884,—Installed the officers elect of Columbia odge, No. 2.

On 9th January, 1884,—Installed the officers elect of Dominion edge, No. 4.

On 14th January, 1884,—Installed the officers elect of Victorial Lodge, No. 1.

On all the above occasions I was attended by the officers of the Grand Lodge, the installation in each case being carried out in ample form.

APPOINTMENTS.

On 22nd March last I received a communication from $Bro.\,J_{48}$. Wilcox, asking to be relieved of the duties of Deputy of District No.3. I was sorry to lose this very efficient officer, under whose able co-operation the work of the Order in this district had been so satisfactory.

On 18th April, I appointed Bro. A. Galloway as my Deputy \mathfrak{for} this District.

On the 26th ult., I received a communication from Bro. E.H. Fletcher resigning the office of Grand Secretary for the reasons there in stated. I accepted the resignation and appointed Bro. J. D. Robinson as the most suitable person to perform the duties of that office until this meeting. I trust you will endorse my action in both of these cases.

GRAND LODGE AND SUBORDINATE LODGE CONSTITUTIONS.

I would draw your attention to the above Constitutions and I submit that if you think fit, a close scrutiny be given to their provisions, with a view of correcting any deficiencies which may be pointed out, or incorporating any suggestions. In any case I would strongly advise that the present constitution of this Grand Lodge be submitted to the Sovereign Grand Lodge for its approval.

THE NEW WORK.

I am of opinion that as the members of the Order become better acquainted with the new Work it will become more popular, and not doubt some good has resulted from the new regulations requiring the work of the Lodges to be done in the Third Degree. We must admit that one drawback experienced is in the case of initiates who cannot participate in the work of the Lodge until they obtain the Third begree. Whilst on this subject I beg to state that it has come to my notice that books other than those authorized by the Sovereign Grand Lodge have been in use by certain Lodges, I must most strongly remonstrate against the use in this Jurisdiction of any other than the authorized Ritual. Such a course has a tendency to demoralize the work of the Lodges and by members falling into the use of terms which are garbled and which do not exist in the beautiful language of our Ritual besides being in direct contravention of the laws of the Order.

DEATHS.

Since our last meeting four of those who were then with us have been removed from our midst by the hand of death, namely, Bro. Howison, P.G. of New Westminster Lodge, No. 3, who died on the 6th April, 1883, Bro. R. Jenkinson, P.G., of Dominion Lodge, No. 4, who died on the 25th August, 1883, Bro. P. J. Hall, P. G., of Victoria Lodge, No. 1, who died on the 9th June, 1883, and Bro. James S. Drunnond, P.G., of Victoria Lodge, No. 1, who died on the 6th Feb. 1884. These were exemplary members and all zealous workers in the cause of Oddfellowship, and their loss to the Order will be greatly felt. I would recommend that a suitable memorial page to the memory of each be inserted in the printed proceedings of the present session.

REPORTS OF DISTRICT DEPUTIES.

I enclose the reports received from my several Deputies, a perusal of which exhibits a satisfactory condition of the Order in each district. The actions of each are submitted for your consideration and approval.

GENERAL.

I think it highly desirable that a competent member of this Grand Lodge should be authorized to visit Harmony Lodge, No. 6, with a view of looking into the affairs of that Lodge, seeing that the books bearing on the financial condition of the Lodge are properly kept, that the records are properly preserved, that the general work of the Lodge is carried on in accordance with the principles of the Order, the sum to be defrayed for the expense of such a purpose would not be large while I think the benefit of such a step would be appreciated by that Lodge.

I was glad to observe a general re-union at Plumper's Pass. This, I believe, was a very successful and pleasant affair, and will no doubt lead the way to others of a similar nature. The committee who had charge of this excursion were good enough to Invite me to attend. I was, however, obliged to decline.

CONCLUSION.

Before closing this report I must tender my thanks to the officers and members of this Grand Lodge for the honor they have conferred as me and to say that I will always look back upon the year of my diministration of the duties of this office as one of the most pleasant fmy life. I trust that we may have an exceedingly happy session, and that our labors will result in much good to our beloved Order.

IV, Sec. 2, of the Constitution of Subordinate Lodges.

APPEAL.

Victoria, B. C., October 17th, 1883.

To the N. G., V. G., Officers and Members

of Columbia Lodge, No. 2, I.O.O.F:

DEAR SIRS AND BROS:—I hereby appeal from the action of this lodge to Bro. D. Dale, D.D.G.M., for the following reasons, viz:—

That at a regular meeting of this Lodge held September 26th, 1883, bey did entertain an application from Pro. John A. Gardner to resive the degree or degrees, and they did also ballot for and elect the id Brother to receive the degrees, which is contrary to and in viotion of Article XVII of our By-laws, three months not having extend since Bro. John A. Gardner was rejected for his degrees, and he above mentioned article never having been repealed or altered face the approval of the same by the Grand Lodge of British Columba in 1874. CONSTITUTION

 \mathbf{oF}

SUBORDINATE LODGES.

PREAMBLE.

For the purpose of effecting uniformity in the administration of the privileges, honors and benefits of Oddfellowship within the jurisdiction, the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows of the Province of British Columbia ordain the following Constitution of Subordinate Lodges under its jurisdiction.

ARTICLE I.

Section 1. This Lodge shall consist of at least five member including one qualified to preside at its meetings, to be hailed and a titled [Name and Number of Lodge,] Independent Order of 0d Fellows, holding a legal and unreclaimed charter, granted or suctioned by the Grand Lodge of the Independent Order of Odd Fellow of the Province of British Columbia. It cannot voluntarily surrected its charter, or dissolve, so long as five brothers in good starting object thereto.

ARTICLE II.

OF MEMBERSHIP.

SECTION 1. All candidates for initiation must be free white males, of the age of twenty-one years and upwards, of sound health of good moral character and industrious habits, having some respectable known means of support, and believe in the existence of a supposed in the lodge nearest his residence, except that lodge grant permission for his joining another lodge; Provided, that application is membership may be made to any lodge nearest the residence of the applicant, in the same district. A person may be admitted to a lodge in the city or village in which he resides; but all candidate for initiation must reside in this jurisdiction, except such candidates may apply from any other Provinces, States or Territories, what there is no Grand Lodge or District Deputy Grand Sire located.

SEC. 2. All candidates for membership by deposit of card certificates of dismissal, or as Ancient Odd Fellows, whose cards

No suspended or expelled member of the Order can be smitted to membership in this lodge, except on a dismissal certificate or on being reinstated, and receiving a withdrawal card from the ble which suspended or expelled him, or from the Grand Secrety, as prescribed by law, and this lodge shall not admit to member-tip any member of an expelled or extinct lodge without permission of the Grand Lodge of British Columbia.

sec. 4. A non-affiliated Odd Fellow who has been regularly intelled in the Order, and has retained membership therein for at least enconsecutive years, and who at the time of making application of reinstatement or membership shall be over fifty years of age, may realmitted to membership in the lodge a non-beneficial member, poil such terms as the By-laws may prescribe, by presenting a petion as required under Section 1, Article III, for proposals for membership by initiation, which shall be disposed of according to said retion.

SEC. 5. When an application for membership is received from a eson residing nearer to another lodge than to the one to which the polication is made, the lodge receiving such application shall comunicate the fact to the lodge nearest the residence of such applicant, adshall enquire whether such person is a fit and proper person to be dmitted into our Order, and if in the same district, shall also ask beconsent of such lodge to receive and act upon such application; whit shall take no further action upon such application until an Iswer is received to such communication. The lodge receiving such mmunication shall appoint a committee of three to investigate the baracter, standing and health of the petitioner, in the same manner sifthe application were made directly to such lodge. Such comtittee shall report at the next regular meeting of the lodge, and a ctified copy of the report, together with a certified copy of the minteshowing the action of the lodge upon the request for consent to wive and act upon the application (if such consent was necessary) hall be forthwith forwarded to the lodge in which such application filed, and said last-named lodge may then proceed upon such ap-leation as in other cases, except that, if it be a case where the conat of the other lodge is necessary, and that consent be refused, the attioner's money (if any has been paid) shall be returned, and no rther action shall be had in the premises.

SEC. 4. No proposition can be withdrawn after being referred a committee, unless by consent of two-thirds of the members product a regular meeting, and before the report of the committee hasher read to the lodge.

ARTICLE IV.

OF FEES, DUES AND BENEFITS.

SECTION 1. The fees and dues of this lodge shall not be less than tendollars for initiation; five dollars for admission by eard; ten dollars for an Ancient Odd Fellow; three dollars each for first and second degree, and four dollars for the third degree to the Lodge Fund, and such amount of dues to the Lodge Fund as shall be determined by the By-laws; in addition to which the lodge may, by its By-laws, provide for a Widows', Orphans' and Education Fund, and Nurse and Funeral Tax, and for extraordinary assessments for lodge purposes.

SEC. 2. Every member qualified, as required by the By-laws of his hodge shall in ease of being disabled by sickness or bodily accident from following any occupation, or otherwise earning a livelihood, be entitled to and may receive such weekly benefits as may be fixed by By-law, from the funds of the lodge: Provided always, that such benefits shall not exceed the rate of ten dollars per week for each dollar of monthly contribution, and provided always, that no lodge shall continue to pay the above rate of benefits for a longer period than six months continuous sickness, after which time it shall not exceed the sum of seven dollars and fifty cents for each dollar of monthly contribution, and further that after the expiration of twelve months contimous sickness no lodge shall pay greater benefits than at the rate of five dollars per week for each dollar of monthly contribution. For members not having the Scarlet Degree the benefits shall not exceed the rate of six dollars per week for the first six months, four dollars and fifty cents per week for the next six months, and after which three dollars per week during term of sickness, for each dollar of monthly contribution.

In all cases where a sick member has received benefits and by reason of the recovery of his health ceased to be entitled to benefits, if he fall sick again within six months from the date of his ceasing to receive benefits, such sickness shall be considered as a continuation of his previous sickness and he shall be placed in the same position as when he ceased to receive benefits, but if six months shall have clapsed from the date of his restoration and he fall sick he shall be entitled to receive full benefits.

SEC. 3. All fines and assessments of any nature shall, at the end of each term, (June 30th and December 31st respectively), be charged as dues against a Brother.

Sec. 4. When any member's account shows an indebtedness of three month's dues, the brother shall not be entitled to benefits and the Secretary shall notify the brother of the fact without delay.

ıny lodge upon 11 be expelled by the By-laws of his lodge, there shall be allowed from the lodge not less than thirty dollars to defray the expenses of the burial, to be paid by the N. G. on account of the funeral. In the absence of competent relations, the N. G. shall take charge of the funeral, and render an account of the disbursements.

Sec. 6. The funeral expenses and sick benefits shall be regulated by the By-laws of the lodge, and all orders drawn for the above shall be by vote of the lodge.

ARTICLE V.

OF DEGREES.

SECTION 1. A member who has been in membership one month may make application for election to any or all of the three subordinate Degrees, which application shall be accompanied with the amount required therefor and be presented to the lodge when open in that order of business. The lodge may ballot for the three degrees at one time and may confer the three degrees on a member at the same meeting when open under that order of business or under the order of New Business. Each lodge shall confer the Degrees on its members except in case of absence from the city, in which case the brother shall be furnished with a certificate under seal, signed by the X. 6, and attested by the Secretary, authorizing another lodge to confer the same, providing the same is done without charge.

SEC. 2. All business other than conferring the degrees shall be conducted in the Third Degree. Lodges may, by by-law, conferal the degrees without charge upon any brother of the Initiatory be gree with a view of enabling him to assist in the working of the lodge, but he shall not participate in any of the benefits of the order beyond what he may be entitled to receive under the Initiatory Degree.

ARTICLE VI.

OF OFFICERS.

SECTION 1. The elective officers of this lodge shall consist of a N. G., V. G., Secretary and Treasurer, who shall serve a regular term each, and the lodge may elect a Permanent Secretary for the same time; or for one year, to take charge of the accounts between the Lodge and its members.

SEC. 2. The appointed officers shall consist of a W., Conductor O.G., I.G., R.S. to N.G., L.S. to N.G., R.S. to V.G., L.S. to V.G. and R. and L.S.S., who shall each serve a regular term; and the lodge may also appoint a Chaplain for a regular term.

- SEC. 4. All elective officers, Warden, Outside Guardian and Inside Guardian, shall be clear of all pecuniary charges on the books, and have attained the Third Degree previous to installation, and all elective officers shall be eligible for re-election.
- SEC. 5. Nominations for elective officers shall be made only on the two meetings immediately preceding that of the regular election except when the nominees for an office all decline.
- SEC. 6. Officers shall be elected at the last regular meeting in each term, and be installed at the first regular meeting in the new term: Provided, the installing officer be present; if absent, the lodge may, by vote, defer it for one week, or call a special meeting for the purpose, at the request of the District Deputy Grand Master. Yo member shall be elected to fill more than one elective office at the same time, except the Recording Secretary who may also act as Permanent Secretary.
- SEC. 7. Any officer absenting himself from the lodge for three successive meetings, except in case of sickness, or any officer, for misconduct or neglect as such, may be removed by a vote of two-thirds of the members voting at the next meeting, after a resolution therefor las been offered in the lodge.
- SEC. 8. Vacancies in any elective office may be filled by the bolge, by nomination and election, at the next regular meeting after nominating; and until so filled the N. G. shall appoint a member to the office pro tem.
- Sec. 9. The duties of the various officers shall be laid down in the charges of office, as specified by this Constitution and the by-laws of the lodge.
- Sec. 10. The N. G., or officer acting as such, shall appoint the majority, and the V. G., or officer acting as such, the minority of all committees on candidates or charges.
- Sec. 11. The lodge, at the second regular meeting in January, in each year, shall elect five representatives to the Grand Lodge for its charter and one for its members of fifteen or under; also one representative for every fifteen members over and above first said num-

ber of fifteen, and one for every fraction exceeding ten members in good standing, as shown by its report on the 31st day of December of the previous year.

ARTICLE VII.

OF PENALTIES AND TRIALS.

Section 1—Clause 1. Any member neglecting or refusing to make payment of his dues or demands against him to the Lodge, according to its by-laws, for the space of eleven months, shall be notified by the Lodge in writing of the state of his account; and if after one month his account still remains unsettled, he shall be suspended from membership; Provided that no person shall be so suspended until after the fact of his dues being in arrears and unpaid for twelve months shall have been announced in open lodge, at two regular meetings; and provided further that no person shall cease to be a member, under this section, whilst charges are pending against him Provided that in the case of absence of a brother at a distance of fifty miles from his lodge, two months additional time shall be allowed him to pay his indebtedness.

CLAUSE 2. Any member suspended from membership for non-payment of dues, may be reinstated in the lodge from which he was suspended within one year thereafter, by paying the amount of one year's dues and by receiving a vote of two-thirds of the members present—a motion to that effect having been laid over one week; but after one year he may be reinstated upon the payment of the fer charged for an initiate of the same age, as provided by the By-laws, or such lesser sums as may be fixed by the By-laws of the lodge to which such application is made; Provided, such sum be not less than the amount of one year's dues of said lodge; and he shall petition the lodge in writing to be reinstated, which shall be disposed of, in all respects, as provided for in Article III, Section 1, for petitions for membership by initiation.

CLAUSE 3. A member suspended from membership for non-payment of dues, and who makes application for reinstatement and fora Withdrawal Card for the purpose of uniting with another lodge in this jurisdiction, may be reinstated and granted a final eard at any time within five years from the date of suspension, upon the payment of one years dues, and the usual price of a card.

CLAUSE 4. A member after being suspended in this jurisdiction for non-payment of dues for the space of five years, wishing to joint lodge in this jurisdiction, shall be entitled to receive, and the lodge shall grant him, upon proper application, a dismissal certificate, upon the receipt of one dollar.

(LAUSE 6. In all cases when a member has been suspended for non-payment of dues, and his lodge has refused to reinstate him, he shall, upon a proper application, be entitled to receive, and the lodge shall grant a dismissal certificate, upon the receipt therefor of one dollar.

CLAUSE 7. Dismissal certificates may be received from the holders thereof on application for membership in Subordinate Lodges, in the same manner, and with the same effect as Withdrawal Cards; and applications made on such certificates shall be received and acted on in like manner as upon Withdrawal Cards; but the holders of such certificates shall in no case be allowed to visit thereon.

'CLAUSE 8. The certificates named in this section shall be only these provided by the Grand Secretary of the Sovereign Grand Lodge.

SEC. 2. Any member who shall violate any of the principles of the Order, or offend against the Constitution, By-laws, or Rules of Order of this lodge, shall be fined, reprimanded, suspended, or expelled, as the By-laws may direct, or the lodge determine.

SEC. 3. No officer shall preside when his trial is taking place in the lodge.

SEC. 4. All suspensions (as a means of punishment) must be for idefinite period, not exceeding one year. At the end of the term of punishment, the brother shall return to his rank in the lodge without bother action. A brother who has been legally expelled, shall not again admitted to membership without the consent of the Grand laster.

SEC. 5. All trials arising under the provisions of this Article hall be conducted substantially according to the following

CODE OF PROCEDURE.

SECTION I.

Rule 1.—All charges against members of the Order in this jurisletion made pursuant to the provisions of Article VII of this Constiution, shall be drawn in the manner prescribed in Form 1, Section
of this Code, and be signed by a member in good standing. The
eneral charge shall be an averment of "Conduct unbecoming an Odd
ellow," followed by a specification or specifications stating the time,
lace and circumstances of the offense; and each offense shall be the
abject of a separate specification.

Rule 2.—The charges and specifications shall be presented and read to the lodge at a regular session, when open in the Order of "New Business," and shall be entered in full on the records.

Rule 3.—The lodge shall, immediately after the reading of the charge, if the accused brother be present, proceed to the choice, by ballot, of a Committee of Trial, consisting of five, who must, if how sible, have the same or a higher degree than that attained by the accused. Any member nominated as one of the Committee of Trial may be challenged for cause by the accuser, accused, or any member of the lodge, in which case the lodge shall proceed to the election of the members against whom no challenge has been made. The grounds of challenge or challenges shall then be stated, when the vota shall be taken, and if two-thirds of those voting shall vote in favor the challenged brother, he shall be declared elected. Should such brother fail to be elected new nominations must be made and proceedings had until the committee is filled. Should the accused brother be absent the choice of the committee shall be postponed for two weeks, and the Secretary of the lodge shall notify the absent brothe of the fact that charges have been preferred against him, and of the time when the committee is to be appointed; and should the brother fail to appear at the time aforesaid, he shall be deemed to have waived his right of challenge, and the lodge shall proceed to the choice of the committee as herein provided.

Rule 4.—The Secretary shall make a copy of the charge and specifications, affix thereto the seal of the Lodge, and certify a substantially according to Form 2, Section V of the Code, and serve, or cause the same to be served upon the accused. He shall also certify, under seal, the original charge and specifications, and deliver the same to the first named member of the committee, according to Form 3, Section V of the Code, and shall notify each member thereof of his appointment, according to Form 4, Section V.

Rule 5.—The first named member of said committee shall, within one week after receiving notice of his appointment, call a meeting of the committee for organization, when a chairman and secretary shall be elected, and a suitable time and place be appointed for an adjourned meeting, which shall not be held in less than two weeks, at which the accuser and accused shall be notified to appear and proceed with the trial. The notice shall be in accordance with Form 5, 800 tion V of this Code, and must be served upon the parties personally if they can be found, otherwise by leaving the same at their last known place of residence, if in the town or city where the lodge is located, at least one week prior to the time of the trial. notified shall not appear at the time specified, or offer satisfactory reasons therefor, the committee shall proceed as if he were present, or they may report by resolution, to expel the member so refusing to appear for contempt of the lodge.

Rule 6.—At the time specified for the trial, the accuser and accused being present and answering, the charge and specifications shall be read, and the accused be required to make answer to each specification contained in the charge. Should the accused object to a specification on the ground of indefiniteness, the accuser shall have have to amend, provided such amendment be made immediately. The accused may then plead to each specification either of the following answers:

- 1. That the alleged offense is not within the legal jurisdiction of the lodge
- 2. That the complaint contained in the specification is frivolous.
- 3. Admit the facts stated and justify the alleged offense.
- 4. Guilty.
- 5. Not guilty.

Rule 7.—The report of the committee shall state the findings on each specification and on the charge, according to Form 6, Section V of the Code, and shall be accompanied by an accurate record of their proceedings, rulings and decisions, together with the evidence taken during the trial, and a resolution or resolutions for adoption by the bodge, which shall be submitted to the lodge within one month after the case has been submitted to them. Should there be a minority report, it shall be drawn and presented in a similar manner.

Rule 8.—The report of the committee shall be received and entered in full in the records, without discussion, and laid over for action at the second regular session thereafter. The Secretary shall immediately transmit to the accuser and the accused a copy of the report or reports, and also notify them of the time when the same will be acted upon, in the manner prescribed in Rule 5. At the time fixed upon to consider the report the lodge may proceed to consider and determine the matter, whether the accused brother be present or not, and in all cases involving the suspension or expulsion of a member, it shall require a vote of two-thirds of the members present to adopt the resolution, and the lodge shall be fully competent, while such motion is under consideration, to vary the penalty from the original motion. Either party may object to any of the rulings and decisions of the committee, when the lodge shall take up the report for sonsideration.

Rule 9.—At the regular meeting of the lodge two weeks after the eport of the committee, the case shall be taken up; the findings, rul-

ings and resolutions of the committee read and considered, and all testimony, if any, bearing thereon; and the lodge shall, by $vote_i$ adopt or reject the resolutions which may be submitted by the committee, subject to the provisions of Rule 8.

Rule 10.—When the lodge shall have taken final action as afore said, the Secretary shall at once give notice thereof, under seal, to the party against whom the decision is rendered, by delivering the same to him personally, or by leaving it at his last known place of residence, or forwarding to him by mail, from which decision he may appeal 'the Grand Lodge of British Columbia within two weeks after the service of such notice, by filing with the Secretary a written notice of such appeal and the grounds thereof, according to Form 7, Section V of the Code, and also by serving a notice of appeal upon the Grand Secretary, according to Form 8, Section V.

SECTION II.—RULES GOVERNING COMMITTEES.

Rule 1.—Three members of a Committee of Trial shall constitute a quorum and be competent to proceed with the preliminary trial. All questions requiring a decision of the committee shall be determined by a majority of those present.

Rule 2.—When the accuser or accused shall notify the chairman of the Committee of Trial in writing that he requires the presence of a member of the Order as a witness, the chairman shall endorse such notice, stating the time and place of meeting, and transmit it to the Noble Grand of the lodge of which such witness is a member, who shall immediately cause the member (or members) named, to be summoned to attend as a witness according to Form 9, Section V of the Code.

Rule 3.—The committee shall keep correct minutes of the proceedings which must show:

- 1. The date and place of each meeting, and the parties present.
- 2. The charges and specifications and answers or pleas of the accused.
 - 3. All points raised and the decisions thereon.
 - 4. The exceptions taken by either party.
 - 5. Parol evidence in full, subscribed by the witnesses.
 - 6. Documentary evidence distinctly marked.
 - 7. Decisions of the committee upon each specification and charge

SECTION III.—EVIDENCE AND WITNESSES.

Rule 1.—The evidence competent to be admitted before the Compittee of Trial shall be: 1, Testimony of witnesses, who shall appear before the committee; 2, Depositions; 3, Records of Lodge; 4, Documentary evidence, etc. The committee shall determine the admissibility of the evidence, subject to exceptions by either party; the exceptions so taken shall be entered by the committee upon its minutes.

Rule 2.—After the direct and cross examination of a witness has been concluded, the witness shall not be further examined or recalled except to explain evidence given on his original examination, or by consent of the opposing party.

Rule 3.—Extracts from the records of a lodge shall be authenticated by the Secretary, under seal. No lodge shall be allowed to shallenge its records, or extracts taken therefrom, when duly authenticated.

Rule 4.—Members of the Order shall qualify under their obligations as Odd Fellows, according to Form 12, Section V of the Code; witnesses, not members, shall be qualified by some civil officer authorized to administer oaths.

Rule 5.—Depositions of absent witnesses shall be procured in the manner prescribed by the Sovereign Grand Lodge of the I. O. O. F., Jarnal of 1857, pp. 2738, 2774; Journal of 1858, pp. 2909, 2926.

Rule 6.—The attendance of a person as a witness who is not a member of the Order, must be procured by the party desiring him.

Rule 7.—After the evidence for the accused shall have been put in the prosecution may introduce testimony in rebuttal of the witlesses for the defence, but for no other purpose.

SECTION IV.—APPEALS.

Rule 1.—All appeals by Subordinate Lodges, or their members, hall be presented within twenty days from the action of the lodge appealed from, to Grand Master for transmission to the Grand Secretary of the Grand Lodge of British Columbia; and no appeal will be omsidered unless such course is taken.

Rule 2.—The lodge shall, within twenty days after the reception of a notice of appeal to the Grand Lodge, through its Secretary, leliver to the Grand Secretary, under seal, a certified copy of the charge, minutes of the Committee of Trial, and also of the records of the lodge relating to the subject matter of the appeal; and the original testimony taken at the trial, according to Form 10, Section V of the Code.

Rule 3.—Should the lodge fail to make the above return, the Grand Secretary shall notify the lodge of such fallure, and direct the return to be made within ten days from the receipt of the notice according to Form 11, Section V of the Code, and if default be made, he shall report the lodge to the Grand Master as insubordinate.

Rule 4.—The Grand Secretary shall, at the time required by law, present the appeal, together with all the papers in the case received by him, to the Chairman of the Committee on Appeals of the Grand Lodge.

1. O. O. F.

NAME AND OBJECTS.

This Association shall be called the "Auxiliary Endowner Benefit Association of the Grand Lodge of the Province of Brit Columbia, Independent Order of Odd Fellows," and its objects as to collect monies from such members of Subordinate Lodge its jurisdiction as may choose to participate in its advantages, for purpose of paying the same to the widow, children, or legatee of a member at his decease as he may direct, and in accordance with the Rules.

MEMBERSHIP.

All members in good standing belonging to Lodges of the in pendent Order of Odd Fellows shall be eligible to become member of this Association, provided they make application on the Formla in provided and furnish the Executive Committee with a satisfact certificate from the N. G. of the Lodge nearest their residence, of D. D. G. M. of the District, on the form herein provided, that is are in sound health, and pay such fees, assessments and disease be legally demanded of them in accordance with these rules. I member of this Association ceases from any cause whatever to be membership in a subordinate Lodge of Oddfellows he shall at same time forfeit all claims upon the funds of this Associations cease to be a member thereof.

MANAGEMENT.

The management of this Association shall be vested in an incentive Committee consisting of the Grand Muster, Deputy in Master, Grand Warden, Grand Secretary and Grand Treasure the time being, of the Grand Lodge of the Province of British

A) must l ambia, who shall be responsible to the said Grand Lodge for the due and faithful performance of their respective duties, and shall furnish it with a full report of their proceedings at each of its Annual Communications. Before entering upon their respective duties in connection with this Association the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer shall each enter into a separate bond to the Grand Master and Deputy frand Master, with two approved securities, in such sum as the family bodge may decide, for the faithful performance of their respective duties.

DUTTES OF OFFICERS.

The Grand Master shall have a general supervision of the working of this Association, preside at all meetings of the Executive Conmittee when present, and in case of the votes being equal shall give the casting vote, sign all orders on the Treasurer for the payment of monles, and see that the bonds of the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer are properly executed and placed in safe custody.

The Deputy Grand Master shall preside at all meetings of the Executive Committee in the absence of the Grand Master.

The Grand Secretary shall convene meetings of the Excentive Committee when directed to do so by the Grand Master, at which three members shall form a quorum, keep accurate minutes thereof, write all communications, keep correct accounts of all monies rerejeed and disbursed in the number prescribed by these rules, and fumish the Grand-Lodge at its annual session with a statement of the same. He shall hand over to the Treasurer all monles received by him as soon as possible after their receipt, taking his receipt for the same. He shall prepare and issue certificates of membership on the form provided, to all members immediately on their admission to membership. He shall keep a Register of all certificates issued, and shall mark such certificates suspended or renewed when necessary. On receipt of information of the death of a member of this Association he shall without delay call a meeting of the Executive Committee, and prepare and disputch notices to members calling for the payment of another assessment. He shall notify members in arrears for dues, and promptly inform them of their suspension from benefit or membership from any eause. He shall receive for his services such sum as the Grand Lodge may, from time to time, decide.

The Trensurer shall have charge of the funds of the Association, and deposit all monies belonging to the Endowment Fund in the Dominion Government Savings Bank, as hereinafter directed as soon as practicable after his receipt of the same. He shall pay all orders drawn on him in proper form; and furnish the Grand Lodge at its annual session with a statement of his receipts and disbursements on account of each fund.

It shall be the duty of the Finance Committee of the Grand bedge to examine and report to the Grand Lodge, at its annual session, on the accounts of the Grand Secretary and Grand Treasurer with respect to this Association.

FEES, DUES AND ASSESSMENTS.

Applications for admission to membership in this Association must be accompanied by the sum of One Dollar as an entrance fee,

Assessments to be paid in advance and at the rate laid down in the accompanying seale for the age of the member at the time of his admission to membership in this Association. They must be paid within twenty-one days from the date of their being levied otherwise the delinquent will be suspended from benefit. Each member shall pay as dues the sum of One Dollar and Fifty Cents per annum, payable in advance half yearly. Any member owing twelve months' dues and failing to pay the same within one month thereafter shall be suspended from benefit. A member suspended from benefit for non-payment of assess. ments or dues may be re-instated within one month from the date of suspension by the payment of all assessments and dues that were owing by him at the time of his suspension. After the expiration of one month from the date of suspension from benefit the brother shall be suspended from membership in this Association, and cannot again be admitted to membership except in the same manner and by the payment of the same rate of assessments as a new applicant of the same age. Members shall not be liable for assessments of deaths which occurred anterior to the date of their joining this Association.

A separate account shall be kept of all assessments received which shall be called the Endowment Fund and from it shall be paid the benefits at the death of a member. The entrance fees and dues shall form the Management Fund from which shall be paid the necessary expenses of management. The Treasurer shall deposit from time to time, all monies received by him belonging to the Endowment Fund in the Dominion Government Savings Bank in the names of the Grand Master and Grand Treasurer, and no monies shall be withdrawn therefrom except by an order signed by these two officers, all interest arising from such deposit shall be withdrawn and added to the Management Fund.

CIFITS.

On the death of a Brown to was at the time a contributing member of this Association, in good standing, a certificate must be forwarded to the Grand Secretary giving such proof as shall be satisfactory to the Executive Committee stating the date and cause of death; this certificate must be countersigned by the Secretary of the Lodge of which the deceased was a member certifying that the Brother was at the time of his death a member of that Lodge. Thirty days after the receipt of the above certificate by the Grand Secretary, an order shall be drawn on the Grand Treasurer for the total amount of the Endowment Fund collected on the last assessment levied prior to the receipt of the death notice, which shall be paid to the person or persons nominated by the deceased member to receive the same.

NOMINATIONS.

Members must nominate on their application form the person or persons to whom they desire the amount of the Endowment shall be paid at their decease, and may at any subsequent time revoke or alter the said nomination by a written notice to that effect delivered to the Grand Secretary; providing that where the member has a family it shall be discretionary with the Executive Committee to refuse to accept a nomination or revocation in favor of any person other than a member of the said family. The Grand Secretary shall keep a record of all such nominations and revocations.

REGISTRATION.

These rules shall as soon as practicable after their adoption be legistered under the laws governing similar institutions in the Province of British Columbia.

ALTERATIONS.

These rules shall not be altered, added to, or annulled, except in the manner provided for the alteration, etc., of the Constitution of the Grand Lodge of the Province of British Columbia, I. O. O. F.
