MR. G. H. BERTRAM, M.P., CENTRE TORONTO, DIES A VICTIM OF CANCER

The Operation Performed by Specialists in New York Was of No Avail—Passes Away After Being Unconscious for Several Days—His Career in Business and in Politics.

Mr. George H. Bertram, M.P. for Centre Toronto, and President of the Bertram Engine Works Company, died at his residence, 220 Beverley-street, a little before 6 o'clock last night.

His death was not unexpected, for Mr. Bertram had been ill for over four months and sank rapidly during the past two weeks.

A Victim of Cancer. Mr. Bertram suffered from cancer of the left arm, and the disease developed so rapidly after its appearance that it soon confined him to his bed.



WHITE IS IN AFRICA. A Michigan General of That Name Went Away Quietly Without Telling People. Grand Rapids, Mich., March 20.—The mystery concerning the whereabouts of Gen. White, fugitive quartermaster-general of Michigan State troops, was solved today. An intimate friend of the missing man received a letter from him, written in Cape Town, South Africa, dated Feb. 19. Gen. White says he is sorry he did not remain in Michigan and fight his troubles. He went to Chicago from Grand Rapids, Dec. 10, and to Cape Town, South Africa, Dec. 21, to join the British army in South Africa, and sailed for Cape Town Jan. 8. He arrived in Cape Town, Feb. 10, and is now in the service of the British army.

UNCLE SAM'S PACIFIC CABLE. The Purpose is to Have It Laid Now to Honolulu and Afterward Extended to Japan. Washington, March 20.—The Senate Committee on Naval Affairs today agreed to report the bill for Pacific cable, which Senator Hale was authorized to draft at the last session of the Senate. The bill provides for a preliminary cable to Honolulu, but the main purpose is to extend it to Japan and the Philippines.

A MILKMAN FATALLY HURT. Harman MacPherson of Orkney in a Dying Condition at His Home. Dundas, Ont., March 20.—Harman MacPherson of Orkney, son of E. MacPherson of that place, who is in the milk business, left his home as usual this morning, driving thru West Flamboro, and while coming down the road to the Still mills, was thrown out and rendered unconscious. It is supposed that the horse slipped, causing the rig to overturn, for, when picked up, the driver was found to be unconscious. The doctors say he is suffering from severe concussion of the brain, and that his case is hopeless.
