OF PERSONAL ESTATE.

I give and bequeath to The Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario (or the Most Reverend Lord Archbishop of the Diocese of Ontario, and his successors,) the sum of [or shares of stock in the standing in my name in the books of the said (or, if debentures, briefly describe them)] upon trust to be by The Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario (or the Most Reverend Lord Archbishop of the Diocese of Ontario, and his successors) aforesaid, applied to [State the Trust.]

Upon trust to hold the same for ever hereafter as a site for a Parsonage House for the use of the Clergyman of the Church of England in Canada doing duty at.....

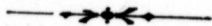

THIRTY-SECOND SESSION.

KINGSTON, June 18th, 1894.

The Thirty-second Session of the Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario opened this day.

The Sermon was preached by the Rev. Arthur Jarvis, M.A., Rector of Napanee, from Ezra v, 11: "We are the servants of the God of heaven and earth, and build the house that was builded these many years ago."

Constitution and Acts of this General Synod, so that they
may be on record on the Journal of each Diocesan Synod ;
and that it be an instruction to the Committee on the Con-
stitution and Canons to prepare a Canon providing a form
for the promulgation of the Acts of this General Synod."

solution, I must content myself with reading from the print-
ed copy of the *Journal of the General Synod*, as follows ;

SOLEMN DECLARATION.

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost. Amen.

We, the Bishops, together with the Delegates from the Clergy and Laity of the Church of England in the Dominion of Canada, now assembled in the first General Synod, hereby make the following Solemn Declaration:—

We declare this Church to be, and desire that it shall continue, in full communion with the Church of England throughout the world, as an integral portion of the One Body of Christ composed of Churches which, united under the One Divine Head and in the fellowship of the One Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, hold the One Faith revealed in Holy Writ, and defined in the Creeds as maintained by the undivided Primitive Church in the undisputed Œcumenical Councils; receive the same Canonical Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, as containing all things necessary to salvation; teach the same Word of God; partake of the same Divinely ordained Sacraments, through the ministry of the same Apostolic Orders, and worship One God and Father through the same Lord Jesus Christ, by the same Holy and Divine Spirit Who is given to them that believe to guide them into all truth.

And we are determined by the help of God to hold and maintain the Doctrine, Sacraments, and Discipline of Christ as the Lord hath commanded in His Holy Word, and as the Church of England hath received and set forth the same in "The Book of Common Prayer and Administration of the Sacraments and other Rites and Ceremonies of the Church, according to the use of the Church of England; together with the Psalter or Psalms of David, pointed as they are to be sung or said in Churches; and the Form and Manner of Making, Ordaining, and Consecrating of Bishops, Priests, and Deacons;" and in the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion; and to transmit the same unimpaired to our posterity.

FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES.

We declare that the General Synod when formed does not intend to, and shall not, take away from or interfere with any rights, powers, or jurisdiction of any Diocesan Synod within its own territorial limits as now held or exercised by such Diocesan Synod.

We declare that the Constitution of a General Synod in-

volves no change in the existing system of Provincial Synods, but the retention or abolition of the Provincial Synods is left to be dealt with according to the requirements of the various Provinces as to such Provinces and the Dioceses therein may seem proper.

BASIS OF CONSTITUTION.

1. (a) The General Synod shall consist of the Bishops of the Church of England in the Dominion of Canada and of Delegates chosen from the Clergy and the Laity.

(b) The Delegates shall be chosen by the several Diocesan Synods according to such rules as they may adopt, or, in a Diocese which has no Synodical organization, may be appointed by the Bishop, such Delegates to be in all cases resident in the Diocese from which they are elected or appointed; provided that, until circumstances permit of its being otherwise ordered by the General Synod, the Bishops of the Dioceses of Moosonee, Selkirk, Mackenzie River, Athabasca, and Caledonia, and such other Dioceses as may be formed out of them, be permitted to elect or appoint non-resident Delegates to the General Synod, provided only that the said Delegates be resident within the bounds of the Ecclesiastical Province of Rupert's Land or the Civil Province of British Columbia respectively. Provided further that until 1896 these Dioceses may elect their Delegates from any Dioceses whatever.

(c) The representation shall be as follows:—Dioceses having fewer than twenty-five licensed Clergymen, one Delegate from each order; Dioceses having twenty-five and fewer than fifty licensed Clergymen, two of each order; Dioceses having fifty and fewer than one hundred, three of each order; Dioceses having one hundred licensed Clergymen and upwards, four of each order.

2. (a) The Synod shall consist of two Houses; the Bishops constituting the Upper, and the Clergy and Laity together the Lower House. The two Houses shall sit separately except by the consent of both Houses.

(b) The Clergy and Laity shall vote by orders if required; and if the proposition be carried in the negative it shall be conclusive: but if in the affirmative any six Delegates (two from each of three different Dioceses) may then demand a vote by Dioceses, when, if the proposition be carried in the negative, it shall be conclusive, the vote of each Diocese being determined by the majority of the Delegates of that

(a) The President of the General Synod (who shall be styled the Primate of All Canada, and Metropolitan of his own Province, and Archbishop of the See over which he presides,) shall be elected by the House of Bishops from among the Metropolitans or Bishops of Dioceses not in any Ecclesiastical Province.

(b) The Primate shall hold office for life, or so long as he is Bishop of any Diocese of the General Synod; nevertheless he may resign at any time.

4. The General Synod shall have the power to deal with all matters affecting in any way the general interests and well-being of the Church within its jurisdiction. Provided, that no Canons or resolutions of a coercive character, or involving penalties or disabilities, shall be operative in any Ecclesiastical Province, or in any Diocese not included in an Ecclesiastical Province, until accepted by the Synod of such Province or Diocese, and that the jurisdiction of the General Synod shall not withdraw from a Provincial Synod the right of passing upon any subject falling within its jurisdiction at the time of the formation of the General Synod.

5. The following, or such like objects, are declared to be within the jurisdiction of the General Synod:

- (a) Matters of doctrine, worship, and discipline.
- (b) All agencies employed in the carrying on of the general work of the Church.
- (c) The general missionary and educational work of the Church.
- (d) The adjustment, with consent of the Dioceses, or of the Province (in the case of the Province of Rupert's Land), of the relations between Dioceses in respect of Clergy Widows and Orphans' and Superannuation Funds.
- (e) Regulations affecting the transfer of Clergy from one Diocese to another.
- (f) Education and training of Candidates for Holy Orders.
- (g) Constitution and Powers of an Appellate Tribunal.
- (h) The erection, division, or re-arrangement of Provinces, with the consent of any existing Provinces

affected ; but the erection, division, or re-arrangement of Dioceses, and the appointment and consecration of Bishops, within a Province, shall be dealt with by the Synod of that Province.

6. Nothing in this constitution shall affect any Canons or enactments of any Provincial or Diocesan Synods now in force.

7. For the expenses of the Synod, including the necessary travelling expenses of the members, there shall be an annual assessment of the Dioceses proportionate to the number of licensed Clergymen in them (Dioceses having less than ten Clergymen being exempt) ; provided, however, that the expenses of any member of the Synod not attending during the whole Session of the Synod shall be paid *pro rata*, and such proportionate part thereof as his attendance bears to the whole time the Synod is in Session ; and that a Standing Committee be appointed who shall fix and determine the amount at any time to be paid hereunder ; such Committee, however, to have a discretionary power to allow a greater proportion in case of absence from illness or any other good cause arising during the sitting of the Synod.

8. All Canons dealing with matters of doctrine, worship, and discipline shall require to be passed at two successive meetings of the General Synod before coming into force.

9. The words "Ecclesiastical Province" shall mean any group of Dioceses under the jurisdiction of a Provincial Synod.

Given in the City of Toronto in the month of September in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and ninety three.

[N.B.—No change in the Basis of Constitution shall be considered unless a majority of each order is present, and no change shall take place unless unanimously adopted by both Houses or until affirmed by a two-thirds majority of the Upper House and a two-thirds majority of each order of the House of Delegates, and in the latter case it shall stand over for confirmation till the next meeting of Synod, when it must be affirmed by similar majorities.—See Journal of General Synod, pp. 46 and 49.]

DECEASED MEMBERS OF SYNOD.

His Honour Judge McDonald presented and read the Report of the Committee on the Deceased Members of Synod, which was on motion adopted, as follows :

The Standing Committee appointed to report in reference to members of the Synod who have died since the last meeting beg to report as follows :

The Reverend Richard Langford Stephenson, M.A., for 36 years Rector of Perth, died at that town on Sunday morning, 6th August, 1893. He was born in Perthshire, Scotland, on the 17th December, 1826, and came to Canada

in 1849. He was made Deacon at Lennoxville on the 24th February, 1850, by the Bishop of Quebec, and was ordered Priest by the Bishop of Montreal at Christ Church Cathedral in that City on 15th March, 1851. He was then appointed to the Mission of Buckingham, where he remained for 3 years. He subsequently labored at Pakenham and Hawkesbury, and on 8th October, 1857, was appointed by Bishop Strachan to the Rectory of Perth.

The Reverend J. A. Morris was made Deacon on 29th June, 1852, in All Saints Church, Dunham, Diocese of Montreal, by Bishop Fulford. He was ordered Priest by the same Bishop on 17th April, 1853. On 29th June, 1852, he became assistant at Christ Church Cathedral, Montreal. On the 30th October, 1854, he was licensed to Fitzroy and Pakenham, subsequently for a time was at North Augusta, and on the 26th August, 1879, was licensed to a part of Ameliasburg. Mr. Morris was superannuated on 1st May, 1892, and died at Trenton, Ontario, on 10th September, 1893.

The Reverend Joseph Wyatt Plant was made Deacon by the Lord Bishop of Niagara at St. Peter's Church, Brockville, on 24th January, 1892, and was ordered Priest on the 21st December, 1892. He was licensed to Clarendon, and died at Mattawa on 20th April, 1894. Speaking of the deceased the *Ompah* correspondent of a Kingston newspaper says: A great loss has been sustained by the very sudden death of Rev. J. W. Plant. He went last week to Mattawa to take part in a mission there, and the news of his death was telegraphed to Dr. Elkington. Frequent comment has been made in the *News* on the exceptionally earnest and self-denying manner in which Rev. Mr. Plant attended to his duties, and there can be little doubt that the very long, tedious, and bitterly cold drives which he had to take in discharging these, weakened him and rendered him less able to resist any serious attack of illness. No labor was too great for him, if he thought it would be the means of showing a single soul how peace can be attained. He never murmured at the distances he had to travel but only regretted that he could not get over the ground more quickly. His thoughts were always how best to extend the influence of the Anglican Church, and he gladly welcomed to his services everyone of whatever denomination, endearing himself to all by the genuine interest he always showed in the welfare of each member of his congregation. His loss is keenly felt, and on every side the sincerest sympathy is expressed with his family, who lose so suddenly one so young, so promising, and so earnest, at the beginning of his career.

We have to record the decease of two laymen, viz: Col. John Sumner of Carleton Place for nine years past a member of this Synod and of the Provincial Synod, and Major John Stewart, a lay delegate from St. John's Church, Ottawa. Col. Sumner was regular in his attendance and faithful in the discharge of his duties.

That the principle of the division of the Episcopal Endowment Fund as adopted by this Synod (see page 215 of Journal of 23rd Session, 1885), "That the present Episcopal Fund of the Diocese of Ontario be divided in the following proportions, viz.: two-thirds to remain with the Diocese of Ontario, as hereafter to be constituted, and one-third to go to the proposed Diocese of Ottawa," be accepted and affirmed.

2. When the new Diocese of Ottawa is duly organized, or as soon after as possible, the several Funds mentioned in Clause 2 above shall be actually divided as above set out, and such part as is due to the new Diocese of Ottawa shall be handed over to the proper authorities of such Diocese to receive and manage the same.

Hutcheson and Fisher, Barristers, of Brockville, asking the Synod as owner of a part of Lot 36, in the 4th Concession of the Township of Augusta, to sign a petition to the Municipal Council of said Township, asking that certain land, including that owned by the Synod, may be drained by means of deep-

ening, straightening, widening, clearing of obstructions, or otherwise improving those portions of Nation River and Hillis Creek, between certain points named in the said petition, beg to report as follows :

That the said application of Messrs. Hutcheson and Fisher and an engineer's report submitted therewith state that $5\frac{1}{2}$ acres of lot 36 in the 4th Concession of Augusta, owned by the Synod, will be drained and converted from swamp into good land, and that the Synod's share of the assessment for the expense of said work has been fixed at \$15.50.

Your Committee has not had an opportunity of investigating the facts of the case, and respectfully recommend that the application be referred to the Chancellor for consideration, and that upon his reporting that it will be in the interest of the Synod to have the said work done His Grace the Archbishop or the Chancellor be authorized on behalf of the Synod to sign said petition to the said Municipal Council.

DEAR SIR—We are asked by our client, the Township of Augusta, to write you concerning the proposed scheme of drainage through a portion of the Township, by deepening and widening a part of Nation River and Hillis Creek. This drainage scheme was projected some time ago but the Township not having taken advice as to the proper preliminary steps, the work hitherto done had to be abandoned.

We are now making a fresh start under Chapter 56 of the Ontario Statute of last session. The Township engineer had previously made a report to the Council as to the proposed scheme and as to the cost of carrying it out. We beg to enclose you a copy of it. It shows that $5\frac{1}{2}$ acres of Lot 36 in the 4th Concession of Augusta, which you own, will be drained and converted from swamp into good land. Your share of the assessment is fixed at \$15.50. We are trying to get a petition signed by a majority in number of the owners of the lands to be benefited as required by Section 3 of the Act, and are desirous of having the Synod sign the petition as one of the owners. We have already spoken to Judge McDonald about this matter. He is going up on Monday and will take the petition with him. Will you kindly bring this matter before the Synod and have the petition signed by the proper officials.

II.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON WORKINGMEN'S MEMORIAL.

The Committee on the Workingmen's Memorial has met and organized, and has considered, so far as the time at its disposal has permitted, the Memorial sent in upon behalf of a meeting composed chiefly of working men assembling in Kingston and known as the Workingmen's Meeting; that it has been deeply impressed with the importance of the subjects dealt with in said Memorial, as well as with the prudent and reasonable manner in which the views of the memorialists have been put forward; that the Church's duty as to some if not all of these subjects is clear and undeniable, although it is a question how far this Synod may have power to declare in regard to them; that it is desirable that not only the members of the Synod but the Church people of the Diocese as a whole should be afforded an opportunity of considering the whole question, and that for the purpose of enabling this to be done it is desirable that the Memorial should be published in the JOURNAL OF SYNOD, and that this Committee should be given further time to consider the matter set forth in the Memorial, and kindred subjects, and to report as soon as possible. We further recommend that the Clerical Secretary be instructed to send a copy of this report to the memorialists.

MEMORIAL

To His Grace the Archbishop of Ontario and Metropolitan of Canada, and the Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario :

The undersigned who were appointed a Committee to draft a Memorial to your Grace and your Synod by a meeting composed chiefly of workingmen, assembling in this city, and known as the Workingmen's Meeting, respectfully submit :

1. That the fact of a man's birth into this world must necessarily carry with it the right to live, and to the use of those means of maintaining life which are the free gift of a bountiful Creator to mankind at large.
2. That the land being in the last analysis the only source whence the means of maintaining life can be obtained, the monopoly of it, or any part of it, by a privileged class is as unjust and contrary to the law of God as a monopoly of the air or the water would be.

3. That if the present system of land ownership be just in principle, it will only be a matter of time till the whole surface of the globe is thus monopolized, leaving a large portion of the human race without access to the only source of the maintenance of life.

4. That in effect this is already the case, difficulties of transportation and other causes effectually cutting off the majority from access to the unoccupied land. The question therefore is not one of mere academic interest, but of immediate practical importance.

5. That the disproportion between the wealth of some and the penury of others, greater perhaps now than at any previous period known to history, is largely, if not altogether, due to the neglect of the principles of land tenure revealed to us by God through Moses, by which the land was regarded as belonging to God as sole landlord by right of creation, and was forbidden to be sold in perpetuity.

6. We recognize the righteousness of the precept of St. Paul, "If any would not work, neither should he eat," and we ask your aid in devising some means of escape from a position in which, while thousands are willing and anxious to work that they may eat, and are denied the opportunity, scores are fed to repletion without any necessity to work, maintained in whole or in part by the rent of land which grows in value without any effort on their part.

7. We will not presume in approaching your Grace and the reverend body over which you preside to do more than allude to the Scriptures which, it appears to us, bear upon this problem, but recognising that in past centuries the Christian Church has borne a foremost part in maintaining the rights and liberties of the people, we respectfully ask that a Committee be appointed by competent authority to consider the subject of this Memorial and the ethics of the present system of land ownership, and to give to us, and the community in general, the benefit of your deliberations and conclusions.

8. We indicate no particular remedy, though many have been proposed; for we desire from you not the maintenance of any theory but the declaration of principles which, if true, must in time win acceptance in the legislative bodies whose duty it is to apply the principles which the Church enunciates.

And your memorialists will ever pray for the welfare of your Grace and your honourable Synod.

Part of this money will be spent in publishing a manual on "County Prisoners and County Paupers" for wide distribution throughout the Province

During the year a large number of Church organisations, temperance societies, as well as municipal councils, have endorsed a Memorial, addressed to the Dominion Government, with regard to the establishment of a Reformatory for young men, first offenders, and with regard to the inauguration of the indeterminate sentence and parole system. This Memorial was endorsed by both Houses of the General Synod of the Church of England in Canada. Now, we think it would be well if the separate Synods would endorse this as well. It is true that it might be said that the greater ought to include the less, but the moral effect of endorsement by the individual Synods would be an advantage, and, moreover, the more these questions are discussed in the different Church Courts, the better the people understand them.

I enclose a blank form of Memorial to the Dominion Government which I would ask you to kindly introduce at the approaching meeting of your Synod.

A portion of this grant from the Ontario Government will be devoted to pushing the prison reform movement in the different Counties of the Province, with the view of bringing to bear the proper influence upon the County and Municipal Councillors. We may also send out a deputation to address public meetings in some of the Counties during the year. In this movement, I trust we may count upon the cordial support of the members of your Synod.

We are very much indebted to the Church of England for important help in the prison reform movement, and we trust this co-operation and sympathy will be extended to our Association until we attain the reforms we are seeking. I may mention in this connection, that a bill was passed in the Senate recently with regard to better provision for keeping youthful offenders separate from older offenders both during and after trial, and for making separate provision for their incarceration after trial. For this bill we are indebted to the Hon. G. W. Allan, Member of the Prison Reform Committee of the Diocese of Toronto.

PRISON REFORM RESOLUTIONS.

(Suggested for approval of the Synod.)

WHEREAS the Prison Reform Commission in their Report in 1891, recommended *inter alia*

1. That the Dominion Government establish a Reformatory for Young Men where first offenders may be sent instead of to the penitentiaries of the Dominion, and where they may have every opportunity for, and every incentive to, reformation;
2. That the Ontario Government (a) establish in the Province one or more reformatories for inebriates, and (b) reorganize the Provincial Reformatory for Boys and the Refuge for Girls;
3. And that the County Councils of the Province establish poor houses where necessary, and make more efficient provision for the better classification and employment of prisoners in the County Gaols;

AND WHEREAS, these carefully considered recommendations have been endorsed and re-endorsed by this Synod and by many other public bodies, as well as by prison wardens and other prison experts;

AND WHEREAS, more than three years have passed since these recommendations were made public without practical effect being given to the same;

THEREFORE RESOLVED, 1. That we desire again to place on record our emphatic endorsement of these important Prison Reform recommendations.

2. That we also place on record our regret and disappointment that our legislators, both Dominion and Provincial, instead of taking the initiative in the introduction of necessary legislation in the direction of moral reform, seem to wait until so impelled by force of public sentiment.

3. That one copy of the above resolutions be forwarded to the Governor-General of Canada, and one copy to the Lieutenant-Governor of Ontario.

4. That the members of the Church throughout the Diocese are hereby urged to use their influence both with our legislators and with members of the County Municipal Councils in behalf of municipal reform.

MEMORIAL

THE DOMINION GOVERNMENT AND PRISON REFORM.

From the Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario :

Whereas the Ontario Prison Reform Commissioners in their Report to the Lieutenant-Governor in April, 1891, recommended *inter alia*,

- (a) The establishment by the Dominion Government of a Reformatory for Young Men—first offenders—between the ages of sixteen and thirty;
- (b) The inauguration of the indeterminate sentence and parole system;
- (c) Conferring upon the Provincial Governments all necessary authority to deal absolutely with all youthful offenders without reference to Dominion authority;
- (d) Providing for the separate trial and separate custody of all children under arrest;

And whereas, at an interview with a deputation from the Prison Reform Conference in Toronto, in January, 1893, the Premier of Canada was pleased to signify his approval of these Prison Reform recommendations;

And whereas one Session of Parliament has passed since the interview referred to without practical effect being given to the same;

Therefore, *Resolved*, that this Synod desires to signify its approval of the recommendations referred to, and its regret that as yet practical effect has not been given to the same.

And whereas the Prisoners' Aid Association of Canada is desirous of extending the Prison Reform movement, but is without adequate means at its disposal for so doing;

Therefore, *Resolved*, That in the opinion of this Synod a small grant of public money to aid in this movement would be a wise appropriation.

Resolved, further, that a duly signed copy of these resolutions be either forwarded to Sir John S. D. Thompson, Premier, or His Excellency the Governor-General of Canada.

Your Committee beg leave to report :—

3—REPORT OF THE MISSION BOARD.

The Mission Board begs leave to submit to the Synod the annual report of its proceedings for the year ending April 30th, 1894.

The meetings were as usual regularly held at the stated times in November and May, and were well attended by the members, who, I am bound to say, conscientiously try to apportion the funds placed at their disposal with the greatest care and economy.

The receipts for the past year were as follows:—

(1) From voluntary sources, Sunday offerings, meetings and collections, \$11,448 80, being an increase over the previous year of \$552.49, and that year had given the best contribution since the formation of the Diocese; (2) the interest of the Sustentation Fund, \$1,452.57; (3) the Watkins bequest, \$190.00; (4) the Gainford trust, \$329.74, making a total income from all sources of \$13,421.11.

Two years ago it was stated in the report that there was an overdrawn balance against this fund of \$3,988.77, caused by a too sanguine venture, made by the Board, to meet urgent appeals for increased missionary operations. In not realizing its expectation of increased support the Board was much disappointed, and resolved to curtail its operations and reduce grants or withdraw them, until this indebtedness should be wiped out. The Archbishop was asked to issue an appeal, before the missionary meetings, which

resulted in a response that enabled the Board to meet all its demands for that year, and reduce the debt by nearly \$500.

It was again suggested that another appeal should be made to the communicants of the Church in the Diocese for a thank-offering of 25c. each, and computing them at 16,000, it was hoped the whole debt would be cleared off.

A most earnest and touching appeal was sent to the clergy and communicants, a copy of which—with an envelope for the offering—was printed and generously given by that earnest layman, Mr. Pense, for each communicant.

Only one half of the parishes responded by giving \$1,799.10. The other half took little or no notice of the appeal.

The action of the first was the means of reducing the debt to \$1,098.93. And here the painful fact comes in—that if these latter had done their part in all probability the entire indebtedness would have been cancelled. On them must rest the grave responsibility of having neglected to help in this pressing necessity, and of having debarred their communicants from sharing in an offering which concerned the most sacred part of their religious life. This neglect is all the more extraordinary when it is considered that the appeal contained the following words:—"This appeal, cordially commended by our Bishop and the Synod, is made confidently to our Christ-loving brethren, lay and clerical, old and young, rich and poor."

The subject of this appeal having been brought before the Board at its meeting in May last, the following letter was ordered to be sent to all the defaulting parishes:

just as well that so few have responded because, if these are a fair sample of those who have not replied, it reveals a most unsatisfactory state of affairs. The clergy who have condescended to reply have given a variety of reasons for not taking up the collection which are not creditable. They display a spirit of indifference, neglect, harsh criticism of the Mission Board, and altogether a disregard of constituted authority, which the Board, it is believed, is safe in saying will not be found in any other religious body. It is no uncommon thing to find authorized collections ignored, thus hindering the work of the Diocese. Some of the clergy, when they receive ordination, seem to imagine that they are ordained to be their own masters, under no rule but their own; and, when appointed to parishes, think they may do as they please, and so there is too often heard absurd speeches—such as—“*I don't approve of this collection or that.*” “*I won't take up this collection or that.*” “*I think we have too many collections anyhow.*” While this style of speech is indulged in by the clergy, is it any wonder that the laity catch the dissatisfaction and are influenced accordingly? It is quite time that this state of things was remedied by a more stringent episcopal authority, for no work can ever prosper where such a want of obedience and united action prevails.

It is time, too, that the attention of the Archbishop and the Synod was drawn to this matter, so that it may be seen what difficulties are thrown in the way of the Board in the efforts it recommends in order to carry on the mission work of the Diocese efficiently.

In all other respects the work assigned to the Board has gone on steadily for the past year. Nearly all the organized missions in the Diocese are now filled with clergymen, and no new missions have been formed during the year.

The missions assisted by the Board number 48, and special grants were made to five others, to be used at the Bishop's discretion.

It was also resolved that a sum of \$50 be placed in the hands of the Archbishop to increase the grant to the mission of Marysburgh should His Grace deem the same necessary.

4.—REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN MISSIONS.

In submitting their report, your Committee believe that the Synod will be interested in having presented to its notice a few general facts in connection with the special subject of Domestic and Foreign Missions.

The latest statement of the General Board showed that for the ten years during which the society has been in operation the offerings for missionary work outside the organized Dioceses has trebled in amount. In 1884 the grand total contributed from the nine Dioceses was \$14,339.73. In 1893 it was \$42,858.23. Considering the pressing local claims on our self-supporting Church everywhere, this betokens the growth of a missionary spirit that is highly gratifying. It is however a matter of no little regret that our own Diocese has apparently not maintained the position held some years ago. Out of the \$42,858.23 Toronto gave no less than \$20,436.17; then comes Huron with \$5,315.53; Quebec, third with \$3,929.73; Niagara, fourth with \$3,651.56; and Ontario, fifth, contributing \$3,641.83. And this is a falling off from last year's \$3,954.00, of \$313.00.

But here it is right to state that had the Diocese been credited with all the sums collected by emissaries from the North West, Ontario would exhibit a considerable increase instead of an apparent diminution. Information has been received that in some places large amounts were thus obtained, and of these no vouchers, not even a memorandum, was given to our Treasurer. This of course places the Diocese in a false and unfavourable light before the Church in the Province. Your Committee would respectfully ask the Archbishop to call the serious attention of the clergy to the requirements of Canon XXXVII, and would also represent to His Grace the expediency of renewing annually any sanction given in previous years to clergymen or other emissaries visiting the Diocese and appealing for money. Our clergy should take a pride in placing their Diocese as advantageously as possible before the Church public; while, with the many and incessant claims on the benevolence of our people, they should also, we feel, exercise great caution in the permission granted to strangers for indiscriminate appeals which cannot but lessen the ability to meet the imperative requirements of the Church within as well as without the Diocese.

In justice to the Woman's Auxiliary the Committee is most happy to record an increase in the money raised by them for our D. & F. Missions, in addition to the assistance rendered to all Diocesan objects. To the ladies we are indebted for \$1,447.73 out of \$3,641.83.

A little word of remonstrance is here necessary.

The designation of money by Parishes, or W. A. Branches, to special Dioceses, objects, or individuals, has caused, and is still causing, so great inconvenience that it may be well to quote the following clause of the General Board's Annual Report, adopted at its recent meeting. Your Committee would respectfully ask their reverend brethren to bring it to the notice of their local organizations:

"The Board of Management respectfully submit that its usefulness and efficiency would be largely increased if contributors would send their money unappropriated. The greatest care is taken by the Board to find out the

 "it must be evident that an unequal distribution of funds must be made.
 "Some will get much, others but little."

The consolidation of the Church of England in the Dominion, amalgamating all the (so called) "Missionary Dioceses" of the North and West with the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada, hastened to create a deeper interest in the affairs of the former to whom we are now happily united in one corporate body. It was therefore believed that information of the spiritual and financial position of those Dioceses outside our Ecclesiastical Province, and constantly appealing to us for assistance, would be interesting and useful in enabling the Church to form a just estimate of their respective claims. A tabulated statement lately gathered from official sources shows the magnificent liberality of our English brethren to this vast mission field. Irrespective of Algoma, the eleven Dioceses of Athabasca, Caledonia, Columbia, Calgary, Saskatchewan, Mackenzie River, Moosonee, New Westminster, Qu'Appelle, Rupert's Land, and Selkirk, received from four English societies for the year 1892-3 the sum of \$162,893.00, and from Eastern Canada \$14,176.00, or in all, \$177,069.00. Of this sum no less than \$103,678.00 were contributed by the Church Missionary Society, the balance coming from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and the Colonial Church Society. The number of the clergy in these eleven Dioceses in 1893 was 201, of whom 166 were exclusively missionaries, and they were assisted by 66 Lay Readers. In the interests of our own Missionary Diocese of Algoma it seems but fair to let the Synod know that (in connection with the Dioceses of Qu'Appelle and New Westminster), it received no assistance whatever from the C. M. S., and had only \$6,930.00 from the other societies. Algoma therefore has a righteously claim on the first consideration of those who through their representatives in the Synod were responsible for its existence, and we are as morally bound to assist it liberally as to provide the sum pledged for the stipend of its Bishop.

The parishes which have made no returns whatever to the appeals for D. & F. Missions number 14; but many of these are of the poorest character. It is however strange, to say the least, that these should include *Amherst Island, Madoc, Gananoque, and Arnprior*. Twenty parishes sent in responses to only one of the Appeals, among them are *Christ Ch., Belleville, Bell's Corners, Almonte, Hawkesbury, Cornwall, Finch, and Osnabruck*. It may be that in some, if not all, of these parishes, the clergyman has read and commended the Appeal made with the express sanction of the House of Bishops, and that the offerings of our loyal Church-people have been duly collected (as we may presume was done). If so, it is for the Synod to say how the responsible officers can be induced promptly to send in the money confided to them in trust, and unduly, if not unlawfully, retained, and so have the stigma for its neglect or failure of duty removed from their parish. For such a state of things some remedy should be found.

Herewith is appended a detailed statement of the receipts and expenditure for the year ended April 30, 1894.

construction of the Canon on the Clergy Trust Fund in connection with the provisions of the sixth clause have the honour to report :

That in their opinion the word income used in the section should cover only money which has actually been paid in and not money which is due but has not been paid.

It is impossible to determine how much of the arrears of interest may be lost or never paid and it would therefore be unsafe to class these arrears as income.

Your Committee are of opinion that the over-drawing of the Clergy Trust account can not be justified, and that steps should be taken to cancel this debt as soon as possible. It is quite clear that even though a clergyman might possibly have what might be called a vested interest in the income, he cannot be paid until the money comes in, and it would therefore be wise under any circumstances to adopt and follow the construction placed by your Committee on the Canon and expressed above.

10.—REPORT OF THE RECTORY LANDS FUND COMMITTEE.

The Rectory Lands Fund Committee beg to report :—

That the Secretary presented the audited report for the year which showed that the amount received from the Consolidated Fund was \$10,379.65, being some \$550 less than last year.

Your Committee regrets that the net yield to the Rectors for the past half-year was only 2½ per cent., making 4½ per cent. for the whole year.

11.—REPORT OF THE KINGSTON RECTORY COMMITTEE.

The Committee of the Kingston Rectory have the honour to report to the Synod as follows :—

The sum derived from investments under the control of the Synod belonging to the Kingston Rectory for the year ending April 30th last amounted to \$3,044.01.

The income from rents was \$2,826.12, from which the following expenses were paid: Insurance, \$96.45; repairs, \$313.15; printing and advertising, \$134.45; taxes, \$84.68; legal expenses and commission, \$154.14, leaving a balance of \$2,044.25, which with the \$3,044.01 from the Synod investments made a total of \$5,088.26, which aggregate income was paid in accordance with the statute and resolution of Synod.

The Committee have been for some time embarrassed in dealing with the Rectory property in consequence of the restrictions placed by law upon the powers of the Rector in connection with leases. He could lease for 21 years at a rack rent, but he could not give any covenant or create any obligation which could entitle a tenant to payment for any buildings he might put upon the leased property; nor could he give a covenant for renewal which would bind his successor. There was neither a fund for the erection of buildings

nor the power to pay a tenant for his expenditure should he put up a building. The result was that tenants erected only a poor class of buildings from which they could extract the value during the continuance of the lease. After advising with the Chancellor and the Solicitor for the Rectory, it was resolved to apply for an Act of Parliament which would alter the tenure of the property and enable the Committee through the Rector to grant building leases with covenants of renewal or payment for buildings and to deal with the property otherwise to advantage, subject to the control of the Executive Committee of Synod. Accordingly an Act was procured last session, from the Legislature of the Province, a copy of which is annexed to this report.

The Committee have already taken advantage of the provisions of this Act and have begun the erection of a fine building at the corner of King and Clarence streets; and they have also leased for 21 years another portion of the property in the market square under building lease at an annual ground rental of \$540.00.

AN ACT RESPECTING ST. GEORGE'S CHURCH, KINGSTON.

PREAMBLE.

Whereas, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the late Province of Upper Canada, dated the 19th day of January, 1824, Her Majesty gave and granted unto the Venerable George O'Kill Stuart, George H. Markland and John Macaulay, their heirs and assigns, that portion of land in the then town (now the city) of Kingston denominated Block G, to have and to hold the same upon trust to ratify and perform the then subsisting leases and to demise and lease the residue together, or in parcels, for any term not exceeding twenty-one years, and to renew or grant fresh leases from time to time, as to the said grantees or any future trustees should seem fit, and to receive the rents and apply the same, in the first place in liquidation of the sum that might be borrowed for erecting a new church, after that in trust to pay the rents to the clergyman for the time being, who should be resident and doing duty in the church then about to be erected (and now known as St. George's Cathedral) for the use of the parishioners of the town of Kingston (now the city of Kingston) according to the rites and ceremonies of the Church of England, with a proviso for appointment of new trustees, and that when a parsonage or rectory should be erected in Kingston aforesaid and an in-

Incumbent or minister of the Church of England presented thereto, the said grantees and any succeeding trustees should as is therein provided transfer and convey the said land to such incumbent or minister so appointed and his successors forever as a sole corporation, to and for the uses and upon the trusts as aforesaid; and whereas by Letters Patent, dated 21st January, 1836, a parsonage or rectory in the said town of Kingston was erected, designated as the first parsonage or rectory within the township of Kingston; and whereas the said G. O. Stuart was duly inducted into the said parsonage or rectory; and whereas by deed poll, dated 10th May, 1837, the said George H. Markland and John Macaulay, in fulfilment of the powers and duties of the trusts, granted, transferred, assigned and set over to the said George O. Stuart as rector and incumbent of St. George's Church, in Kingston, the said land, to have and to hold to the said George O. Stuart and his successors forever, subject and under the uses and trusts set forth in the said Letters Patent, firstly mentioned, and by a deed poll of the same date the said George O. Stuart consented and agreed to the said assignment and acknowledged that he took and held the same as rector and incumbent of Kingston and not otherwise; and whereas the Very Reverend Buxton B. Smith, Dean of Ontario, having been duly presented and inducted into the said rectory, is now the rector and incumbent of St. George's Church or Cathedral aforesaid; and whereas in pursuance of certain statutes of the late Province of Canada and of the Legislature of Ontario, and of certain canons of the Diocese of Ontario within which the said rectory or parsonage is situate certain portions of the said land have been sold; and whereas under the said statutes the surplus revenue from the said rectory beyond the sum of \$3,000 reserved for the rector is divisible amongst the other incumbents of churches belonging to the Church of England in the city and township of Kingston in such proportions as the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario may from time to time order and direct; and whereas in pursuance of said statutes and canons and with the consent of the said Very Reverend Buxton B. Smith, the temporalities of the said rectory or parsonage are now managed by a committee, known as the Kingston Rectory Committee, appointed by the said Synod and composed of members thereof and of the incumbents from time to time of the said

churches; and whereas it is necessary for the proper and advantageous management of the said trust, and the said rector and other incumbents interested in the said trust and the said committee have by their petition prayed that there should be conferred upon the said rector and his successors in office, for the purposes of the said trust, the powers hereinafter mentioned; and whereas it is expedient to grant the prayer of the said petition;

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:—

RECTOR TO BE TRUSTEE OF PROPERTY OF RECTORY.

1. The Rector of St. George's Church in the City of Kingston for the time being shall be and continue to be the trustee for the management of the said trust, in accordance with such resolutions as may from time to time be adopted by the said Rectory Committee or such other committee as may from time to time be appointed for the purpose by the canons of the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario or the Diocese in which the said Rectory shall be situated; and the said trust property is hereby declared to be vested in the said rector as such trustee as aforesaid in fee simple.

TRUSTS TO DEVOLVE UPON RECTOR'S SUCCESSORS IN OFFICE.

2. As often as the said trustee shall be changed by the appointment of a new rector of the said St. George's Church, the said trust property shall, without any conveyance thereof, become and be vested in the new trustee for the purpose of the said trust in fee simple.

PURCHASE OF ADJOINING LANDS.

3. For the purposes of the said trust, or incidental to the management of the said trust property, the said trustee shall have the power and he is hereby authorized with the consent of the said Committee and of the Executive Committee of the Synod of the said Diocese to purchase any part of the land adjoining the said trust premises, should they deem it expedient so to do for the better management of the said trust, and with the consent of the said Executive Committee any of the invested funds belonging to the said rectory and held by the Synod of the said Diocese in trust therefor may

LEASING POWERS.

4. The said trustee shall have the power and he is hereby authorized with the consent of the said Rectory Committee to lease any portion of the said trust premises for such term as may be agreed upon, not exceeding ninety-nine years, to enter into covenants for a renewal of such lease, or for payment for the buildings which may be erected by any lessee upon the said premises, which covenants shall be binding upon their successors in the said trust.

BUILDING POWERS.

5. The said trustee shall have the power and he is hereby authorized, with the consent of the said Rectory Committee, to erect any buildings or structures upon the said trust premises, and to enter into any necessary contracts for that purpose, and to raise money for that purpose or for the purpose of paying for buildings already erected, or for the purchase of adjoining land, or generally for any purpose connected with the improvement of the said trust property, by creating any mortgages or incumbrances upon the said trust property, containing such covenants and conditions as to the said trustee may seem just and reasonable, and the said trustee shall have the power to convey the said premises to any mortgagee for the purposes aforesaid.

LEASES TO BE APPROVED BY SYNOD.

6. No contract or agreement made or entered into in exercise of the powers contained in the two next preceding sections, except leases at a usual or ordinary rental not exceeding twenty-one years, and containing no covenants for renewal or payment for buildings or other improvements shall be valid until the same has been sanctioned and approved of by the said Executive Committee of the said Synod.

INVESTMENT OF TRUST MONEY.

7. The said Incorporated Synod is hereby authorized to invest any portion of the said trust moneys in its hands belonging to the said Kingston Rectory in and upon any mort-

gage in the lands belonging to the said Rectory and vested in the said trustee, and which the said trustee is empowered to create by the provisions of this Act.

APPLICATION OF UNINVESTED RECTORY FUNDS.

8. The said Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario may with the consent of the Executive Committee thereof on the application of the said Kingston Rectory Committee apply any of the uninvested funds belonging to the said Rectory and held by the said Synod in trust therefor in payment of the cost of erecting any buildings or structures on the said premises, and after such application the said Synod shall be discharged from all trusts in connection with the money so applied.

MEETINGS OF RECTORY COMMITTEE.

9. All meetings of the said Rectory Committee for considering and determining upon any of the matters authorized to be done by this Act shall be held upon notice in writing to the members posted two clear days at least before the holding of the meeting and specifying the business to be considered, and all resolutions authorizing the exercise of any of the powers conferred or created by this Act, except the leasing of any property for a period not exceeding three years, without building covenants, must be sanctioned by two-thirds of all the members of the said Committee, who may be present at the meeting called to consider the matter to be sanctioned. All resolutions respecting or involving the exercise of any powers conferred by this Act shall be in writing, and shall be duly entered and preserved in a book to be kept by the said Committee, or the Secretary thereof, and a copy of any resolutions certified by the Chairman and Secretary of the said Rectory Committee may be registered in the registry office of the county in which the said trust lands are situate, without further proof for registration than such certificate.

13.—REPORT OF THE CHURCH BOOK DEPOSITORY COMMITTEE.

The Church Book Depository Committee beg leave to report:—

That the year just closed has been most satisfactory, the Cash receipts having risen from \$216 71 in 1893 to \$355.28 in 1894, an increase of no less than 64 per cent. This increase would have been even greater but for the intense reluctance displayed by a few of the Clergy to make prompt remittances. The accounts outstanding amount to \$139.44, and though the greater part of this has only been due a short time, and is owing by men who usually pay monthly, other accounts have been owing for more than two years by men holding good positions in the Diocese. Some \$50 is thus owing by five or six debtors, and the need of this money sorely hampers the Committee in their work. The Depository has practically no capital. It lives on the credit given by the S.P.C.R., and until the business is put upon a cash basis as regards sales it will be impossible to carry in stock many books often asked for, and needed by candidates for ordination and others.

It is much to be wished that a small capital could be formed by subscription, especially at this time, when the projected visit of the Chairman to England would afford an excellent opportunity of buying many of these books at low rates and saving a large portion of freight expenses, if only the money necessary could be obtained. Even \$100 would go a long way towards this, though \$200 or even more could be well expended.

The Committee wishes to express its appreciation of the work done by Miss Carey, who has been the actual manager under Mr. John Reyner. Although entirely unacquainted with the business at first she has endeavoured with considerable success to learn its details, and to further in every way the work of your Committee. The income she derives therefrom is so small that we feel that our thanks are due for her hearty co-operation. A statement of accounts is subjoined and shows the Depository to be in a fairly satisfactory financial position, though it emphasizes the fact that it supplies the Diocese with books practically without any profit.

16.—REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

The Committee on Sunday Schools begs to report that during the past year little if any progress has been made in the Sunday Schools of the Diocese, and it is doubtful whether sufficient interest is taken in Sunday Schools, considering that they are the chief and almost only public method by which religious instruction is given to the rising generation, upon whose knowledge depends the complexion of the Church people of the future.

The Committee would urge upon all Schools the advantage and necessity of encouraging the teachers and senior pupils of the various Sunday Schools to enter for the yearly examinations conducted by the Interprovincial Sunday School Committee, believing that the preparation for and mental exercise in such examination would be highly beneficial to those who take part in it. The next examination will be held about Advent. Information can be obtained from the Secretary, Rev. Rural Dean Pollard, Ottawa.

The Provincial Committee have decided to adopt the *Five Years Course* of the Church of England S. S. Institute and will issue next Advent the scheme for the first year of that course. There is a probability that the S. S. Committee of the P. E. Church of the U. S. will also fall into line and also the Sunday Schools in the other British Colonies, so that before many years are over, a federation of Sunday Schools may be effected, embracing only the whole Church of England, but the sister Church in the United States.

from every occupied Parish or Mission, except the Parish of Christ Church, Belleville. The considerable number of Clerical changes which have taken place during the year, and even within the last few weeks, have made it impossible for the removing Clergy to furnish complete returns of either the Parish they have left or of that to which they have gone. But in these cases as well as in the case of vacant missions and of the one defaulting parish, those columns which are least liable to serious variation have been filled from the returns of last year. Circumstances which perpetually recur will always render absolute accuracy unattainable, but we have certainly long passed the incubate stage in this matter and are every year approaching nearer the actual truth.

Incidentally your Committee were last year made aware of the fact that varying methods of computation prevailed among the clergy in reckoning the number of their communicants. This is not surprising considering the wide variations which exist in the communions by which we are surrounded. In the Church of Rome, for instance, it is customary for baptized persons to make their first communion between the ages of nine and eleven years, and ecclesiastical authorities estimate that those under this age, that is the non-communicants, constitute about 15 per cent of the population of the Church. The Roman Church, therefore, if asked for the number of its communicants, would return 85 out of every 100 of its total population. Thus in the United States, where the entire number of individuals in the Roman Communion is estimated at about eight millions, that Church claims 6½ million communicants. The modern religious bodies on the other hand claim as communicants a little more or a little less than one-third of their professed adherents, and a measure of mercy is shown to such as having once been admitted to their sacraments afterwards discontinue attendance upon them. So far as your Committee can learn, however, the period of forbearance seldom extends over two years, and in some cases names are removed from the rolls if the bearers of them are absent for twelve months without sufficient reason from the Celebrations of the Holy Rite. Without affirming any principle upon this matter, then, your Committee conceived that they were acting within the lines of the Church's rubrics when this year in order to secure uniformity they asked incumbents to return those only who had actually communicated at least once during the year. We have since learned that a system very closely resembling this prevails in the Dioceses of Toronto and Montreal. The result has been in a few instances a very serious diminution, but in the great majority of cases, it has rather proved the severe faithfulness with which during all the past the clergy in general have estimated the spiritual forces of their congregations. Contrary to the early fears of the Committee, we are able to report an actual increase of nearly 200 communicants for the year just closed. This increase is mostly in the Archdeaconry of Ottawa and in the large and important Deanery of Carleton where the numbers of this year exceed those of 1893 by no less than 470. In other sections of the Diocese there have been losses, but the net result is, as we have said, a gain. Surprise is sometimes expressed that although our confirmations annually exceed 1000 souls, our

communicants should only increase by two or three hundred. A little examination, however, will make it plain that our gains are nearly balanced by our losses through deaths and removals. In the Diocese of Montreal, where this matter is tabulated, it appeared that last year out of seven Deaneries only two reported a net gain, one of these being the Deanery of Montreal. Your Committee would suggest to Clergymen beginning their work the propriety of at once forming a roll of all persons actually communicating, and retaining afterwards even the careless and neglectful, that they or their successors may from time to time lovingly strive to recal them to duty; but that they should reckon in their reports only those who have actually communicated at least once during the year.

An increase appears in the number of households and individuals reported; the gain, which amounts to 710 in the total population, being in this case in favor of the Archdeaconry of Kingston. This increase is probably owing to the request of the Committee that all should be enumerated in the second column who make even the slightest profession of Churchmanship, they hoping by this suggestion to bring the Clerical returns into closer correspondence with the figures of the public census. The discrepancy however seems to be hopeless. A slight attempt at reconciliation was made in this City a few weeks since. A house to house visitation was made extending to most of the outlying and narrower streets, one of the questions asked having reference to the congregation with which that particular household was connected. 1200 visits were made and among all these not one household was discovered which did not report itself to be already associated with some one of the existing religious organizations of the City. The scheme, therefore, though apparently hopeful did not relieve our perplexity one whit, and we felt ourselves as far off as ever from any knowledge of what are usually called the "lapsed masses", our 2000 unknown members of the Church. It is proposed however to make a more thorough canvass when the heated term is over, the work to be undertaken mainly by members of the Brotherhood of St. Andrew. Your Committee would suggest as a useful work a similar attempt in every town or village where a branch of the Brotherhood or a few earnest lay workers exist.

The number of services reported seems to imply a gratifying enlargement in our work. The mid-day celebrations have increased by 177, the early by 65. The number of confirmed is about 350 in excess of last year's report, and our Sunday School work is marked by growth in every particular. Five new schools are reported with an increase of 360 pupils, and of 18 male and 12 female teachers. The frequent complaint reaches us that it is next to impossible to secure efficient teachers especially in the rural districts, and that the clergymen already overworked cannot be pastor, catechist, and precentor combined. The present condition of the religious world however, and the extraordinary means which are being put forth by the Communion about us to make their Sunday School system attractive and efficient, demand incessant vigilance on our part, and the admirable manuals now within reach of all, in addition to

the careful training of a Bible Class, ought, we think, to avail for the creation of at least a few reasonably capable instructors in all our parishes.

The amount contributed for Clerical stipends is apparently \$960.00 less than last year; but this decrease is only apparent, for while but eight parishes failed to report in 1893, thirteen defaulted this year. But while it is certain that there has been an enlargement of liberality in this particular, the deplorable fact remains that over forty missions contribute less than \$400 per annum to the stipend of their clergymen. This state of things ought surely to cause great searchings of heart.

Nine new churches are reported and two have been improved at large expense. The total value of church property is \$32,450.00 in excess of last year's report.

We have striven to do our work, dear brethren, in our various fields of labor during the past twelve months; not without much anxiety we know, not without some earnestness we trust; with what measure of success it is not for us to answer while we are yet among the toilers. But if sometimes we are constrained to feel that failure rather than success describes the result of our work, we have but to repeat the words of faith spoken long since by the obedient disciple: "Master, we have toiled all the night and have taken nothing; nevertheless at Thy word I will again let down the net."

The Board of Rural Deans in presenting to the Synod this their fourth annual report must express at the outset the pleasure they feel at being able, they think, to show that on the whole there is much encouragement to be derived from a review of the work done in the Diocese during the past year and from the consequent present condition of the Church. Midst many drawbacks, notably the extreme stringency of the times, under God's blessing the year's record is one of steady if not rapid progress all along the line, which will, we think, be made quite apparent by the following summary of the reports of the Rural Deans, which in all space permits us to give but which contains in each case everything it is material to mention.

ARCHDEACONRY OF KINGSTON.

I.—FRONTENAC DEANERY—REV. W. B. CAREY, M.A., RURAL DEAN.

The Rural Dean reported verbally to the Board.

2.—GRENVILLE DEANERY—REV. R. LEWIS, M.A., RURAL DEAN.

No report.

3.—HASTINGS DEANERY—REV. T. STANTON, B.A., RURAL DEAN.

Dungannon mission has now a young active Priest and also a Lay Reader who are working successfully and supplying the needs of many Townships, but the vacancy of Millbridge is a cause of perplexity. A new church is being built to supply a pressing need in the latter mission at Moneymore.

4.—LEEDS DEANERY—REV. G. W. G. GROUT, M.A., RURAL DEAN.

Much progress is reported both of a spiritual and temporal character throughout the Deanery. Financially Gananoque, New Dublin, Lansdowne Front, Westport, Trinity and St. Peter's, Brockville have flourished, particularly the latter, in which during the year the large sum of \$3,449.37 was raised for Parochial and extra parochial purposes. Much spiritual benefit was derived from the parishioners of St. Paul's, Brockville, through an eight day's mission conducted by the Rev. Osborne Troop in September last. In Lansdowne Front, Lansdowne Rear, and Leeds Rear many great improvements have been accomplished. The Rev. C. J. Young of the first named mission has opened a new and promising station at Rockport, and the Rev. Mr. Moore of the last named, is overworked and should have the assistance of a Lay Reader. At Lyn a handsome font has been placed in the Church chiefly by Mr. Grout's exertions, and a costly east window by the Rowsom family. The venture of faith made by the Mission Board in the case of Westport, the infant mission of Leeds, has been fully justified by the satisfactory progress of the Church in that district. Newboro Parish have been well served in the past and interest in all Church matters fully sustained.

5.—LENNOX AND ADDINGTON DEANERY—REV. E. H. M. BAKER, RURAL DEAN.

The Missionary Clergy have not been paid the full amount of stipend promised. In Selby the deficit is large. Deaths and removals partly, but by no means fully, account for this state of things. The funds of the Parish of Napanee are in a healthy condition and much good work has been done. An eight days' mission was preached in St. Andrew's Chapel by the Rev. F. D. Woodcock during Advent, and it appeared to leave a deep impression. With the assistance of the local Chapter of St. Andrew's Brotherhood services are kept up regularly in the Chapel every Sunday. A Parochial Association, styled the "Parish Sisterhood," has been set on foot to work amongst young women on the same lines as the Brotherhood of St. Andrew does amongst young men.

Tamworth holds its own as a thriving Parish. Over \$950.00 was raised during the year for various purposes. A second handsome stained glass memorial window has been presented to Christ Church.

new drive shed has been built there. The services are well attended both in the Churches and at the two out-stations of Clairview and Enterprise.

Camden East will call for sub-division as soon as the Mission Board is in a position to make a grant to the part set off. With the assistance of Brotherhood men Sunday services are regularly held in the three Churches and three other centres, Hinch, Centreville, and Napanee Mills. The latter is a place of growing importance and needs a Church.

At Selby the Church debt has been reduced one-third, the parsonage property and the Kingsford Church and surroundings have been considerably improved.

The prospects of the Mission of Ernestown (Odessa), as given in the language of the missionary, are distinctly encouraging. The Church pulse is beating in a more healthy way all through the Mission. The Mission Priest expects to present thirty adults for Confirmation next autumn.

In Bath the Church seems to hold its own despite the losses continually occurring through deaths and removals. Over \$700 was raised within the year for Church purposes. At the adjourned Easter Vestry a resolution was passed guaranteeing to pay the Rector in charge \$200.00 per annum.

The Church in Adolphustown under the able management of its laborious Rector increasingly prospers. Among many improvements a neat woven wire fence has been placed around the burial ground and a valuable stained glass window in the Church by Mrs. George Downey in memory of her father, the late Rector Harding.

In Gosport Church prospects appear to be brightening. The Methodist Chapel has been taken down and removed a couple of miles to the east.

On the question of income Mr. Forneri's parishioners have recently, with great unanimity, taken such action that henceforth he will suffer no anxiety on that score. The Deanery Chapter have requested the Revs. Messrs. Serson and Woodcock to visit North Addington and report its condition to the Rural Dean.

6.—PRINCE EDWARD DEANERY—REV. E. LOUCKS, RURAL DEAN.

The various Parishes in the Deanery are being efficiently served, but owing to deaths and removals the stipends paid to the Incumbents are lamentably inadequate. The Rev. Mr. Rollin in Hillier does not receive a living income. Consecon under Mr. Foster's supervision deserves commendation.

ARCHDEACONRY OF OTTAWA.

1.—CARLETON DEANERY—REV. J. J. BOGERT, M.A., RURAL DEAN.

The state of the Church in almost every Parish is satisfactory, especially in Ottawa, Bell's Corners, Huntley, and Richmond. In the country only

March and Richmond pay to the Clergy, the amount of income specified by resolution of Synod, viz.: \$800 and a house, while Fitzroy Harbor paid last year only the miserable pittance of \$340.80. The large sum of \$15,000 has been subscribed in the Deanery during the past year for the Ottawa Episcopal Endowment Fund. A new mission station, the "Quarries" has been opened in connection with St. Bartholomew's Church, distant about three miles from the City.

2.—LANARK DEANERY—REV. A. C. NESBITT, RURAL DEAN.

There is on all sides evidence of life and progress in this Deanery. The County of Lanark receives \$450.00 from the Mission Board, and sent up this year to the Secretary \$1,192.48. The Deanery has to deplore the death of the Rev. R. L. Stephenson, M.A., the energetic and successful Rector of Perth. A new church has been built at Smith's Falls at a cost of \$15,000.

3.—PRESCOTT AND RUSSELL DEANERY—REV. H. POLLARD, RURAL DEAN.

The Church is losing a great many members in this Deanery for want of services and supervision in parts beyond the reach of our missionaries. Two additional Clergymen are urgently needed at once, one at Rockland and another at Point Fortune and parts adjacent through which a railway is being built. These missions would each require a grant of \$300. At first perhaps it would do to work the latter district from Hawkesbury with a Deacon aided by a grant of \$250.00. The Mission of Plantagenet is not in a satisfactory state.

A suggestion was made at a Rural Deanery meeting held not long ago at Bearbrook, that an Inspector should be appointed to inspect and report on the condition of Church property throughout the Diocese.

4.—RENFREW DEANERY—REV. C. V. FORSTER BLISS, RURAL DEAN.

The Parish of Arnprior is in a satisfactory condition in every point of view. The Church has recently been enriched by the presentation of a handsome stained glass window, a brass altar desk, and a set of brass altar vases. In Cobden steady advance is being made financially and otherwise. A little in arrears on stipend. Combermere's successful Mission Priest should be relieved by the appointment of a missionary in the Townships beyond his mission which he frequently visits in response to the call of distress.

Eganville is now in charge of the Rural Dean. During the Rev. Mr. Orr's brief pastorate a very neat Church was built at Lake Doré, the expense of erecting which has almost all been paid. The mission is capable of better things than have yet been reported of it. It is discreditable to the Churchmanship of such fairly well-to-do people that they should be the recipients of any aid from the Mission Fund. It is hoped that another year may see a change in this respect.

The debt on the Mattawa property is \$2,300, with cash \$300 on hand to credit of principal and year's interest. Some improvement in stipend over that of the past year, which was \$236.02. The offertories have increased 50

p.c. Services are better attended and Sunday Schools larger than ever. The running expenses for the employment of Lay Readers and travelling by train are very heavy, and it is impossible for the Mission Priest to meet them out of his income, therefore the Rural Dean sees little hope for the Mission being maintained unless the Mission Board makes some provision for the support of a Lay Reader. The Incumbent is doubtful if the debt can be paid.

General prosperity characterises the work of the Church in Pembroke. The Parish raised for all Church purposes last year upwards of \$2,000, \$400 of which was for external objects. There has been a steady and marked advance in contributions to the Mission Fund.

In Petawawa Mission the services are being conducted at present by Lay Readers. There are six centres and with one exception all necessary churches have been provided, and for the latter, which is partly erected, sufficient funds are promised to finish it. The employment of one or more Lay Readers is absolutely necessary. The cost of their maintenance heretofore had become so burdensome, that it with other causes led to the resignation of Mr. Bliss.

Of Renfrew the report is very favorable. The Church has been entirely renovated at considerable expense and a handsome oaken pulpit placed therein. The Sunday School is flourishing.

Stafford Mission which so recently assumed the responsibility of a self-supporting Parish is thriving. The congregation of St. Patrick's Church has contributed liberally towards the erection of a new and handsome stone Church.

5.—STORMONT DEANERY—REV. R. L. M. HOUSTON, M.A., RURAL DEAN.

This Deanery evidently is one of the most prosperous in the Diocese, though the Church works in only two out of the three counties of which it is composed. There is not a single congregation in Glengarry. As speedily as possible there should be a mission organized in that county, having its centre at Alexandria or Lancaster. One clergyman cannot work successfully the unwieldy Parish of Crysler and Newington, they should form once more two centres of Church life. The Church population of the Deanery is 4512 of whom 1572, or one-third of the whole number, are communicants. The total amount contributed for all parochial purposes for the past year, exclusive of Clerical stipend was \$16,390. The people contribute to Clerical stipend about \$1.20 per head, about \$5.38 per family. The banner bearing Parish in this respect in the Deanery and perhaps in the Diocese is Winchester, which contributes to Clerical stipend \$350 per annum, *i.e.* over \$19.00 for each one of its eighteen families. For all Parish purposes including Clerical stipend this Deanery raised during the past year the sum of \$21,654.74, which represents \$22.00 per family. Three Churches have been built, St. James', Morrisburg, the Church of the Good Shepherd, Cornwall East, and St. Paul's,

Matilda. The first of these three which cost \$12,000 reflects the greatest credit and honor on the parishioners of Morrisburg and their worthy Rector. That in Matilda has supplied a pressing want and is full to overflowing at every service; while the Church of Cornwall East stands as a monument to the Rev. Dr. Mountain's liberality and as a memorial of a family well-known throughout the whole Church for faith, love, and good works. Dr. Mountain has also presented a parsonage to the Parish of Cornwall East, of the value of \$2,200.

Such in substance, your Grace and Clerical and Lay Members of the Synod, is the report we have to make regarding the progress of the Church during the past year. Cheering and encouraging as it is for the most part, you will observe that we have not by any means overtaken our work. "There remains much land yet to be possessed" and countless are the wants that continue unsupplied.

It is often said that if our missionary deputations would but plainly lay the actual needs of the Diocese before the people their response to our appeals for help would be found much more prompt and liberal than they generally are. As there may be something in the statement, just permit us to recapitulate, before closing our report, those wants, which in our opinion require attention without a day's unnecessary delay that all may realize that they do exist and thus, perhaps, be animated by the Holy Spirit to assist each according to his means in applying a remedy. They are as follows:

Renfrew Deanery sorely wants a missionary for the Townships adjoining Combermere Mission—provision for a Lay Reader at Mattawa and one or more at Petawawa.

Hastings Deanery asks provision for the Millbridge vacancy, and an additional missionary at North Hastings.

Stormont Deanery pleads for two additional missionaries—so does Prescott and Russell Deanery, and Leeds Deanery for a Lay Reader in Leeds rear.

Prince Edward Deanery complains of the utter inadequacy of the stipend of its missionaries, while the Deanery of Lennox and Addington deplores the continued total neglect of North Addington, where there is more than enough employment in its seven destitute Townships for two active missionaries. The Mission Fund debt having been so largely reduced chiefly through the operation of the scheme suggested by the Synod's Treasurer, Mr. Pense, let us hope that by renewed energy and increased liberality on the part of Church people, as many as possible of these distressed wants may be soon supplied.

This year, His Grace consenting, each Rural Dean is to be responsible for the holding of the Annual Missionary Meetings within his own Deanery in order that expenses may be diminished.

While the capital produced two years since 5½ per cent. gross and last year 5 2-5 per cent., this year it returns just 5 per cent, from which expenses have to be deducted, making the net income to beneficiaries barely 4½ per cent. As may be judged by the unusual amount of cash on hand the demand for loans is at the lowest ebb in the experience of the Investment Committee; not only is the rate of interest declining but also the opportunities for and choice of investments is being narrowed. Preference has been given to mortgage investments for several years because debentures have been more difficult to secure and because the interest derivable rarely exceeds 4½ per cent. This rate would cause a serious drop in the revenue that has been secured hitherto

The Widows and Orphans' Fund has since April been in receipt of \$400 from the Diocesan Woman's Auxiliary, contributed during the past year. This timely gift removes the overdrawn balance.

The Mission Fund return includes \$1,799, part of the communicants' special offering to reduce the debt.

At the close of the financial year (April 30th) there was due the permanent funds in delayed interest \$12,227, an increase of \$3,093 over the arrears one year since, which were considerably reduced, however, from the still preceding year. Strenuous efforts at collection have been made where such pressure could be judiciously exercised, and the \$12,227 of arrears reported by the auditors have, within the past month, been reduced to \$10,844, which will be still further reduced by \$1,000 being transferred from interest to capital on a much improved Addington investment.

Synod holds 175 mortgages as compared with 169 one year ago; then 117 were without arrears of interest; now 103 mortgages, representing \$219,018, are free from arrears. A list of the 72 mortgages represented in the overdue

balance of \$10,844 is appended in order that members of Synod may have the fullest information, and be able to judge for themselves of the value of rumors heard from time to time regarding the integrity of Synod investments. Insurances and valuations are conducted under the thorough system inaugurated in 1892.

While nearly all financial incorporations, in addition to nursing loans as your Investment Committee has done to prevent abandonment of properties, have had to write off large amounts of interest, the absolute loss to the funds of this Diocese in default of interest has not exceeded in five years \$1,200, exclusive of the Chauncey Seeley mortgage of \$2,000 and interest, set aside as a doubtful asset pending legal enquiry as to careless valuation.

As an offset to the credit on interest account of \$12,227 on April 30th there were then due these overdrafts on permanent funds: Clergy Trust, \$5,693.20; Rectory Lands, \$1,836.32; Episcopal, \$1,159.12; total, \$8,688.64. The overdrawn balance of the Mission Fund had at that time been reduced to \$1,098.93.

That Messrs. F. R. Sargent and J. S. R. McCann, the official Auditors, have made a full and complete examination of all the accounts up to and inclusive of the 30th April, 1894, and their report is herewith submitted.

Your Committee, assisted by the Treasurer, have made a careful examination of all the securities, and compared the same with the statements submitted to them by the Accountants and found the same correct.

Your Committee would further report that on the mortgages belonging to the Consolidated Fund there are arrears of interest amounting to \$10,938.34, being an increase of \$2,817.24 over that of last year, and including the Episcopal Fund the amount of arrears are \$12,227.00. Municipal debentures to the amount of \$88,000.00 have fallen in during the year.

The amount invested in mortgages is \$380,576.50, being an increase of \$42,600 over that of last year. All of which is respectfully submitted.
