LIBERAL CANDIDATE I

Representation of Northumberland County in the next House of Commons— J. B. Snowball Esq., Miramichi Advance.

The Timber Trade. The Northumberland Journal of 20th Nov. records several failures in the Liverpool timber trade.

It is gratifying however to find the following item in the Liverpool report: "The past week has been a quiet one so far as importations and sales are concerned, and though there perhaps is a little better feeling in the market it does not seem yet to have developed sufficiently to allow any marked increase in value."

It is not surprising that the importation of half-crown per standard is not to be desisted in these days of keen competition. The import of these goods continues light, and the information from New Brunswick and Nova Scotia continues to point to a restricted supply for the remainder of the season.

Wretched Mismanagement. A fisherman's letter in another column illustrates the methods of Minister Foster's department. This season's bounties have been greater than that of any preceding one, which is saying a good deal. The small-fishing industry is a very important one, on which very many of our people rely for a livelihood, and the regulations which govern it should be made as simple and possible as given the greatest publicity.

There is now a close time for lobster for the use of their families in close time, but not for sale. A delusion of the district is that the time has arrived when the lobster will be abundant.

The Lobster Question in Maine. The Lewiston (Me.) Journal says that legislation upon the lobster will give considerable work to the fisheries committee at the coming session of the legislature.

Starving the Indians. We have called attention to the attempt of the Government to meet the charges made by Mr. Cameron, of Haron, as to the shameful manner in which the Indians of the Northwest were treated.

THE SCOTT ACT. An order-in-council has been passed providing for the re-issuance of the Scott Act, in relation to the Canada Temperance Act, and providing that "All laws, penalties or forfeitures imposed or enforced under the Canada Temperance Act of 1878 and amendments thereto, within any city or county, or any incorporated town separated for municipal purposes from the county, which would otherwise belong to the Crown for the public use of Canada, be paid to the treasurer of the city or incorporated town or county, as the case may be, for the purpose of the said Act."

DESPERATE EFFORTS. The war claims commission in connection with the militia department has concluded its work. Claims amounting to four million dollars were adjusted. The total amount of the Hudson's Bay claim was \$1,725,471—reduced by \$23,000. The Canada Pacific claims amounted to \$530,000—reduced by \$114,000. It was a long fight, but the Government had to give in at last.

THE FISHERY DEPARTMENT. Some figures made up by the officials of the Government at Ottawa would seem to indicate that the impaction of a year of our fish in the United States is not very seriously affecting the fish industry of the country.
