

PLANETS.

MERCURY will be the *Morning* Star until June 26. It will then be the *Evening* Star until March 16. Then *Morning* Star until May 23. It will then be *Evening* Star until July 23. Then *Morning* Star to Sept. 4. Then *Evening* Star to Nov. 10—thence *Morning* Star to the close of the year.

VENUS will be the *Morning* Star until May 15. It will then be the *Evening* Star to the close of the year.

MARS will be *Evening* Star to Aug. 29. It will then be the *Morning* Star to the close of the year.

JUPITER will be the *Morning* Star to Feb. 14. Then the *Evening* Star to Aug. 30.—thence *Morning* Star to the close of the year.

SATURN will be the *Morning* Star till Feb. 28. It will then be the *Evening* Star to Sep. 9—after which it will be the *Morning* Star.

There will be a transit of Mercury Nov. 12, invisible in North America.

ECLIPSES.

There will be Four Eclipses this year—*three* of the Sun, and *one* of the Moon.

I. Thursday, January 10. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in America, Europe, Asia, and Africa; but will be central and total in Australia and the Pacific Ocean.

II. Sunday, July 7. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, invisible in America, Europe and Africa; but will be central and visible in the Southern part of Africa and the Pacific Ocean as follows:—

And ending July 8th, 0h. 47m. M. } Halifax.

III. Tuesday, December 17. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, visible in all parts of America as follows:—

A small portion only of the Moon will be obscured—about two digits.

Only a small portion of the Sun's Southern limb will be obscured—about three digits. This Eclipse will commence before sunrise.

Eclipsés take place every half year, and at each period there may be one, two, or three; if only one, it must be an Eclipse of the Sun; if two, there will be one of each luminary; and if three, there will be two of the Sun, with one of the Moon between them. Eclipses of the Sun are caused by the interposition of the body of the Moon between our eyes and the Sun; and eclipses of the Moon by a real deprivation of light from the Moon occasioned by the shadow of the earth

“The Almanack for the last year died without a groan. He seemed as vigorous only the day before as the first day of his life, and held his own to the last moment. Were it not that another child of the same family, bearing the same general features, and apparently of the same temper is ready to take his place, we should be inconsolable. For no other friend have we to whom we can go for advice as we could to him. He spoke mostly in figures. His knowledge in various things was not small, and was exceedingly practical. He held converse with the stars, and seemed to know what was going on among all the planets. He was fond of looking after the tides; he kept a calendar of various events and days. We seldom took in hand an important matter without consulting him, and never found his judgment of events wrong.”

EASTER DAY, on which the rest of the Moveable Feasts and Holy-days depend, is always the first *Sunday* after the full moon which happens the next after the twenty-first day of *March*; and if the full moon happens upon a *Sunday*, *Easter-Day* is the *Sunday* after.

ADVENT SUNDAY is always the nearest *Sunday* to the feast of *Saint Andrew*, whether before or after.

DIRECTIONS FOR FINDING THE TRUE TIME.—The sun is on the meridian at 12 o'clock on four days only in the year. It is sometimes as much as 15 minutes before or after 12 when its shadow strikes the noon mark on the sun dial. On each calendar page of this Almanack is shewn the exact time at which the sun reaches the meridian; and in order to set a clock or watch correctly, it must, when it is noon by the sun dial, be set at the time indicated in the Almanack. The practice of setting time-pieces by the rising or setting of the sun or moon is not strictly correct, as the unevenness of the earth's surface and intervening objects, such as hills and forests, near the points of rising and setting, occasion a deviation, in every place, from the time expressed in the Almanacks, which time is adapted to a smooth level horizon. The only means of keeping correct time is by the use of a noon mark or a meridian line.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

Column

LEFT HAND PAGE.

- 1 and 2—Days of the Month and of the Week.
 3 “ 4—The rising and setting in *mean time* of the highest point, or of the *upper limb* of the Sun, corrected for refraction.
 5—The Sun's declination for the same as the Equation, 6th column.
 6—Equation of time, (or quantity by which the Sun is *slow* or *fast* of the clock at noon, apparent, not mean, time at Greenwich, or a quarter before eight o'clock in the morning at Halifax.) Equation of time is the difference between *mean* and *apparent* time; and there are only four periods of the year when this difference is nothing; namely, about April 15, June 15, September 1, and December 24, as may be seen by referring to this column.
 7—Days' length in hours and minutes.
 8—The rising of the Moon.
 9—The setting of the Moon.
 10—The time of the Moon's southing, or passing the meridian. This column also gives the time of High Water at Parrsboro', Horton, Cornwallis, Hantsport, Windsor, Newport, Truro, &c.
 11—The symbols in this column indicate the Moon's place in the Signs or Constellations of the Zodiac.

The top of the columns of each month gives the Moon's Phases, or times of New and Full Moon, and of the First and Last Quarters, or quadratures of the Sun.

The FARMER'S CALENDAR is placed at the foot of the columns of each month.

RIGHT HAND PAGE.

- [1—Contains the days of the month.
 2—Sundays, Weather, Anniversaries, &c.
 3—The time of High Water at Halifax, N. S.
 4— “ “ Pictou, N.S. and Cape Tormentine, N.B.
 5— “ “ Annapolis, N. S., St. John N. B., and Portland, Maine.
 6— “ “ St. Johns, Newfoundland, of that tide which immediately precedes the southing of the Moon. These four columns are computed on the supposition that the time of High Water on the days of the New and Full Moon—*L'establisement du port*—is at Halifax, 7h. 30m.; at Annapolis, St. John, N. B., and Portland, 11h. 14m; at Pictou and Cape Tormentine, 10h., and at St. Johns, Newfoundland, 6h. 30m.

All the calculations are made to mean *solar* time.

THE EPIHEMERIS OF THE PRINCIPAL PLANETS.—The hour of *meridian passage*, *right ascension* and *declination* of each of the principal planets is given for the 1st and 15th of each month. For any other day than the 1st and 15th of the month, apply a correction at the rate of 3m. 55.91s. per day, reckoned from the nearest given day—to be added for an earlier day—subtracted if for a later day.

EVERY farmer *may effectually* be his own banker if he chooses; he has the right, he has the power, he has the means at his own command, and by the exercise of this right, this power, and these means, he can be benefited far more than by any investment of capital in the banks now in use. The bank alluded to is the farmer's bank of manure, the location in his barnyard. This is a bank that can never fail, can never be insolvent. He subjects himself to no protests, he lives in no fear of a suspension of payment, he needs no bolts, bars or locks, to secure him from the midnight robber, there is no cashier to tell when he presents himself to this bank for means to carry on his farming operations that a discount is required to grant him a favour, or to tell him his endorser is not good or sufficient. He is not confined to a limited number of days, with a *little grace* beyond it; and when he draws his check he has no fear of being told that there is not any funds placed to his credit.

The improvement of farm stock can hardly be too frequently brought before the mind of the farmer, and of all who feel any interest in the prosperity of the country. No individual of any observation, whose attention has been drawn to the subject, and who has had an opportunity of examining the quality and character of the stock reared by a vast majority of farmers, can fail to be forcibly impressed with its importance as a permanent, certain, and reliable means of largely increasing the aggregate wealth and resources of the whole country. This is no ordinary subject; and there can scarcely be any just reason why it should not deeply interest the farmers and arouse them to action. Each farmer should put the question directly to himself.

—“Have I in my possession neat cattle which possess the greatest combination of excellence, which are the most profitable for the dairy, which will mature early, and when no longer wanted for dairy and working purposes, will put on flesh with the least expense in feeding for the butcher? Have I the best sheep for fleece and carcass,—the best breed of swine,—those of quick growth and approved fattening qualities?” And if, on investigation, he becomes satisfied he is deficient in one or all of this description of animals, he should spare no pains to procure such at reasonable additional expense.

The beginning of this month is the proper time to commence work in the garden. Let every border and flower-bed be dug and neatly raked. This month is peculiarly suitable for propagating by cuttings, and also for planting out evergreens, but shrubs of all kinds and herbaceous plants may be transplanted in all this month. Give Dahlias a gentle heat in the hot-bed, or bring them forward in pots or boxes in the house, to induce the breaking and shooting of the buds, each of which, cut off with a portion of the tuber, will become a plant. All plants or shrubs in pots should have fresh mould added to the surface; remove dead twigs and leaves, and give moderate waterings occasionally. Grafting may still be performed. If you would save your cucumber-vines and cabbage plants against the attacks of bugs and worms, go early in the morning, while the worms are sluggish, and dampness prevents the bugs from flying, and kill them all. It is easy to see in the morning, where a plant has been cut off by a worm the night before, and he will generally be found at that time in his burrow near the stump of the cut plant.

Draining land fully and completely, is one of the greatest improvements of modern agriculture, and few things better display the advantages of a combination of science with art, than a well conducted system of draining. The necessity of draining land arises from several causes, all of which have more or less influence on the productiveness of the soil, or the value of the crop. The necessity of relieving soils of their surplus water has long been understood, and open drains to remove it from the surface have long been used, but thorough draining, by cutting numerous deep drains, making a water-course at the bottom of these, and covering them in such a way as to form no obstruction to culture, is of comparatively recent invention and adoption, and has effected a complete revolution on soils of this class. The depths of drains should not be less than 30 or 36 inches, and in some cases it may be advisable to go deeper.

The chief or primary object in hoeing crops is to increase the quantity and improve the quality of the produce. To this end various means are adopted. A point of the first consequence, is the eradication of weeds and all plants excepting those which it is wished to cultivate. The necessity of destroying weeds arises from several causes. Their growth interferes with and injures the crop in various ways. They exhaust the soil, more or less, of the elements which constitute the food of cultivated plants; they especially abstract the moisture of the soil, making a constant drain upon it in this respect, from the first moment of their existence. The brush of a hoe or the scratch of a light harrow, will effectually kill a weed at the time it appears above ground, whereas the growth of a few weeks would give it such a hold on the soil that it would withstand considerable force. Stirring the ground, to a certain extent, is beneficial to crops, aside from the effect of keeping down the weeds, as by keeping the soil loose the roots of plants more readily extend themselves.



"Lucerne," or French Clover, says Nicholson, "makes the sweetest and most fattening food for cattle," and Downing says, "it is undoubtedly the most productive, and that which comes sooner into use (in the spring) than any other of the artificial grasses. From three to five tons of excellent hay can be cut to the acre; and with the best cultivation and plentiful manuring, nine tons per acre have been had in a season. It is supposed our dry warm summers are more favorable to its growth than the cold and moist ones of Great Britain." "The soil for Lucerne," says London, "must be dry, friable, and inclining to sand, with a sub-soil not inferior, and unless the soil be good and deep, it is in vain to attempt to cultivate it." Lucerne requires two or more years before it attains its full growth, and therefore it is ill adapted to enter into general rotations. For soiling however it is admirably adapted, as it may be cut at least four times in a season, and one acre is sufficient for five or six cows. Farmers might try an acre or half acre of it.

In making composts where lime was used, it was formerly the practice to mix it in the pile merely slaked, but it was sometimes where used in this way found to produce little effect, and it is now recommended that it be prepared by dissolving one bushel of salt in water, and with this slaking a cask of lime, the mixture to lie some 8 or 10 days when it is to be incorporated with the muck; the above quantity furnishes the alkali required to convert 3 cords of peat or muck to a first rate compost. This if shovelled over a few times to allow full action and combination may be applied at once to the crop or soil. If barn yard manure is used in making the compost, there should be alternate layers of muck, barn yard manure, ashes or lime, until the requisite quantity is prepared. The time required to fit this for use will depend on the rapidity of the fermentation, temperature of the atmosphere, &c. If convenient compost heaps will be the better for being prepared the year beforehand, if they can be kept from the weather.

The relative advantages and utility of fall or spring ploughing, is a subject of vast practical importance to the farmer. Each system has its advocates, but like every disputed question, the truth belongs to neither extreme. Either plan, under peculiar circumstances, or modification of soil, condition and situation, may be best adapted or most desirable. Clay and other soils of a heavy and firm texture, should be ploughed in the fall, because they require the powerful and nearly indispensable agency of frost to disintegrate the earthy matter, and to decompose the vegetable substances they contain. A long period is also requisite for the operations of frost, water, and heat, by which alone these soils are effectually pulverised.



WHATEVER may be the method of feeding animals, it is indispensable for their comfort or thrift that they should be provided with comfortable, well ventilated, but not hot stables. The man who thinks to keep an animal of any kind in good condition, exposed to the cold and storms of our winters, must have paid little attention to some of the first principles of animal economy, and must have provided himself with an extra supply of fodder, as it will surely be needed. A little attention to keeping up the animal heat by comfortable stables, would save much food that is now required for that purpose, and which is far more costly than providing stables. There are many advantages in cutting hay, straw, and cornstalks, when used for fodder, or the food of animals.





LIGHT HOUSES.

On the Coast of Nova Scotia; the Coast of New Brunswick in the Bay of Fundy; Cape Race, N.J.L.; Gulf and River St. Lawrence; and Strait of Belle-Isle.

MEAGHER'S BEACH—East side Halifax Harbor. *A fixed light.*

SAMBRO ISLAND—Western entrance Halifax harbour. *A fixed light.*

DEVIL'S ISLAND—An *Octagonal Light Beacon* on the S. W. point of the Devil's Island, at the entrance of the Eastern passage to Halifax harbour, and exhibits a *red light* on the seaward sides, to distinguish it from Sambro and Meagher's Beach lights; stands 45 feet above high water mark; rise and fall, 6 feet. The Tower painted dark brown, with a white belt between the Balcony and Lantern, to distinguish it in day time.

CROSS ISLAND—Entrance to Lunenburg harbour. Two lights—*flash light above; fixed light below.*

LIVERPOOL—South end of Coffin's Island. *A plain, revolving light.*

FORT POINT harbour light, at the head of Liverpool harbour, southern entrance. *A bright, fixed light*, visible from all points of approach, and must be left on the larboard hand, when entering the harbour.

PORT MEDWAY—Beacon Light on Admiralty Head, west side of the entrance to the port. Building square, painted *white with black square* in the centre of the seaward sides, *plain white light*, 44 feet above sea level, and stands within 30 fathoms of the shore.

SHELburne—McNutt's Island. *Two fixed lights*—one above the other.

BARRINGTON—Baccaro Point, east side of the entrance to Barrington Bay. *A flash light*, of fifteen seconds.

CAPE FORCHU LIGHT—On Cape Forchu, western side of the entrance to Yarmouth harbor—*A plain revolving light*, visible one minute and a quarter, and invisible half a minute. Building painted *white*, and is elevated 135 feet above the level of the sea.

CAPE SABLE, SEAL ISLAND—The first light on approaching the Bay of Fundy, is on the South point of Seal Island. *A plain, white light*, elevated about eighty feet above high water mark, and may be seen, on approaching the Island, from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called Blonde Rock, lies about three and one-third miles S. by W., by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

BRIER ISLAND—*A plain, white light*, situate about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point of the Island.

WESTPORT—Peter's Island, at the south entrance of the east side of the Bay of Fundy. *Two white lights*, placed horizontally, to distinguish it from Brier Island Light, at an elevation of forty feet above high water mark.

DIGBY GUT LIGHT—On the west side of Digby Gut, from Brier Island north eastward. This light is chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin. *A fixed, white light.*

PORT WILLEAMS (late Marshall's Cove) **BEACON LIGHT**.—Building square and painted *white*,—exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles a *white light*, and on nearer approach a *green light*. Port Williams is distant from Digby light-house, E. 25 miles, and from Black Rock light-house, W. 27 miles.

MARGARETVILLE BEACON LIGHT.—Building square and painted *white*,—exhibits at a distance of about 5 miles a *white light*, and on nearer approach a *red light*. Margaretville is distant, E. 37 miles from Digby light-house, and W. 15 miles from Black Rock light-house.

These lights in the above beacon lights distinguishes them from other lights in their vicinity.

BLACK ROCK LIGHT.—On the south shore of the Bay of Funday. *A fixed, white light*.

HORTON BLUFF LIGHT.—In the Basin of Mines, 95 feet above sea level, high-water; rise and fall forty to forty-five feet. Building square, painted *white*; stands sixty feet from the Bluff, and shows a *white light*, which may be seen, in clear weather, over the greatest part of the Basin of Mines, (after passing Cape Blowmedon), and above the Five Islands, and up Windsor River, until intercepted by the continuation of the Bluff to the southward of it.

APPLE RIVER LIGHT.—North side of the entrance to Apple River, in Chignecto, or Cumberland Bay. *Two fixed lights*, placed horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND RIVER.—An Octagonal Light Beacon, on the west side of the entrance to Partridge Island River, Parrsboro', on the north side of the Basin of Mines, and exhibits a *plain, white light*, at an elevation of thirty feet above high-water; rise and fall about forty-five feet; the Tower is *white*, and stands close to high-water mark on the beach.—Vessels can only enter the harbor at high-water, and must lie aground on soft bottom when the tide is low.

BURN'T COAT HEAD LIGHT.—Basin of Minas. The lantern is erected on a square tower attached to the main building, and shews a *plain white light*, about 75 feet above high-water level, and visible from all points of approach. Tower and buildings painted *white*. Bearings and distances: Cape Blowmedon, N. 70, W. 26 5, 10 miles; Brick Kiln Ledges, N. 52, W. 7, 5, 10 miles; Economy Point, N. 36, W. 3 9, 10 miles.

IRON-BOUND-ISLAND LIGHT.—Off the entrance to La Have River. *A bright, flash light*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of thirty seconds. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, on the southern side of the Island, and is visible from all points of approach. Elevation seventy feet above sea level.

RAGGED ISLAND HARBOR LIGHT.—On Gull Rock, off the entrance of the harbor. Building square and painted *white*, exhibiting a *clear, fixed light*, at an elevation of fifty-one feet above the sea level, and is situated in Lat. 43° 39' N., and Long. 64° 66' W.

PUBNICO HARBOR LIGHT.—A Beacon Light on the S. E. side of the entrance to Pubnico Harbour, situated on the E. side of the entrance to the Bay of Fundy, about thirteen miles northerly of Cape Sable. Building square, painted *white*. *A fixed red light*, on the seaward side, twenty-eight feet above high-water level, (rise and fall twelve feet), and stands fifty fathoms from low-water mark. The point of beach is bold.

A Fog BELL has been erected on the E. Cape of Yarmouth harbor, a

few feet to the southward of the Light House, and about one and one-quarter miles from the extreme outer point of the Cape. Strikes *seven* times per minute.

WHITE HEAD ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. W. point of White Head Island. The tower is square, painted *white*, standing seventy-five fathoms from the water's edge, with an Octagonal Iron Lantern, sixty feet above sea level at high-water; rise and fall, six feet. The light is distinguished by *bright flashes*, of ten seconds duration, followed by eclipses of ten seconds, displaying alternately three flashes and three eclipses in a minute. The light will not be totally obscured during the eclipse.

EASTERN BEAVER OR WILLIAM'S ISLAND—*A revolving light.*

CANSEAU, CRANBERRY ISLAND—*Two fixed lights*, one above the other.

WEST SIDE OF THE GUT OF CANSEAU—*A fixed light.*

EDDY, OR SAND POINT LIGHT—On Eddy, or Sand Point, on the west side of the south entrance to the strait of Canseau, distinguished by *two white lights*, placed horizontally, 25 feet above the sea level. Building square, painted *white*, with a *black diamond* on the seaward side.

GRYSBOROUGH HARBOR BEACON—On the west side of the entrance to the harbour, head of Chedabucto Bay. *A fixed light.*

PICTOU LIGHT—On the south-east side of the entrance of the harbor. *A fixed light.*

PICTOU ISLAND LIGHT—On the S. E. point of the Island. Building square and painted *white*. *A fixed light*, fifty-two feet above high-water mark.

ARICHAU BEACON—A Light on Point Marichi, on the east side of the southern entrance to the harbour. Building square, painted *white*. *A white light*, thirty-four feet above the sea-level.

LOUISBURG—On the east side of the entrance to the harbour. *A fixed light.*

LOW POINT LIGHT—East side of Sydney, Cape Breton, harbor. *A fixed light.*

SEA-WOLF, OR MARGERIE ISLAND LIGHT—Situated on the N. W. side of the Island of Cape Breton, nearly mid-way between Port Hood and Cheticamp harbors, and distant from Cape Breton two and a-half miles. *A plain, white light*. The lantern is placed on a square, wooden tower, painted *white*, near the centre and summit of the Island. The lantern is 298 feet above the sea level—visible from all points of approach. To vessels in proximity to the Island, the light may become observed by the abrupt cliffs or sides of the Island, which may serve as a guide to tack or anchor by, as hundreds of vessels find anchorage on the south-east side. The chief landing is near the S. W. end, in shore, where a few fishing stages and boats are kept in use during the fishing season.

PORT HOOD LIGHT—Changed from *white* to *red*, when seen from the northern entrance, to distinguish it from the Margerie and North Canso lights.

FLINT ISLAND LIGHT. On Flint Island, off the eastern coast of Cape Breton. Lat. 40 degrees, 11 5 N., and Long. 59 degrees, 45 to 50 W., and exhibits a *bright, flash light*, every fifteen seconds, visible from all points of the compass. The light is sixty-five feet above sea level, and can be seen at the distance of twelve miles.

ST. PAUL'S ISLAND. *A fixed light* on the north-east end, and a *flash light* on the south-west end.

SCATTARIE ISLAND. *A revolving light*, on the east end of the Island.

GANNET ROCK LIGHT. This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. *A white flash light*, twenty seconds dark, and forty seconds light, in each minute. Building painted in stripes, vertical, black and white. Between the northernmost and the southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and extend westward from the Light House about four miles. From this range further westerly, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker called the Bull, this may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

MACHIAS SEAL ISLAND LIGHTS. *Two fixed white lights*, upon the Machias Seal Islands, forty-five feet above high-water, and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 200 feet, by which circumstance, of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast, (British or American). Both buildings painted *white*. Vessels standing to the northward between these lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these lights into one, as will be, then, not more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than five miles to the E. of the lights.

HEAD HARBOR LIGHT. Next in order after passing Grand Manan and the plain *white light* (American) on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbor Light, placed on the N. E. extremity of Campo Bello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles, Moose Island, and the Inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels, also, at all times to enter Head Harbor. *A fixed, white light*. Building painted *white* with a *red cross* on it.

POINT LE PREAU LIGHTS. Upon this projecting headland, two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant twenty-eight feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass where they may be useful; both are *fixed* and *white*. Building painted *red* and *white*, in stripes, five feet broad each, horizontally.

PARTRIDGE ISLAND LIGHT. At the entrance of the river and harbor of St. John, N. B. *A fixed, white light*. The building painted *red* and *white*, in vertical stripes.

BEACON LIGHT. Within Partridge Island, and upon a spit or bar which extends about half a mile S. S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. *A fixed, white light*. Building painted *white* and *black*, in stripes, vertically.

QUACO LIGHT. *A revolving, white light*, placed on a small rock, off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. The light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. Building painted *white* and *red*, in horizontal stripes.

CAPE ENRAGE LIGHT. On the point of that name in Westmoreland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbor, N. S. Building painted *white*, about 120 feet above the tide mark. *A plain, white light*.

WEST QUODDY LIGHT. This is an American light, placed on the west side of the entrance into the St. Croix, by Lubec and Eastport.

A LIGHT HOUSE has been erected upon CAPE RACE, Newfoundland, a fixed, white light from sunset to sunrise. The light is visible to seaward from N. E. by E. round by the S. E. and S. to W., and is elevated 180 feet above mean water level of the sea, and may be seen in clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The tower is striped red and white vertically. It stands close to the old beacon, which has been cut down. The Light House is Lat. 46 degrees 39 minutes 19 seconds N., Long. 53 degrees 2 minutes 38 seconds W. Bearings magnetic. Var. 24 degrees W.

In the River and Gulf of St. Lawrence and Strait of Belle-Isle :

BELLE-ISLE LIGHT. An island at the eastern entrance of the Strait of Belle-Isle, separating Labrador from Newfoundland, situated at the extreme south west point of the island. A single fixed white light. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour. Lat N. 51° 53' 00"; Long. W. 55° 26' 00". Whole horizon lighted, and seen in fair weather 28½ nautical or 32½ statute miles.

POINT AMOUR LIGHT, Labrador Coast, Strait of Belle-Isle, at the south east point of Forteau Bay, Lat. N. 57° 27' 30"; Long. W. 56° 53' 40". A single fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 18½ nautical or 21½ statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

ANTICOSTI LIGHT, at the extreme point west end of the island of Anticosti—Lat. N. 49° 52' 30", Long. W. 64° 35' 00". A single fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 15 nautical or 18 statute miles. Building—a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

CAPE ROZIER LIGHT. East Coast of Gaspé, at the extreme point of the Cape. Lat. N. 48° 51' 00", Long. W. 64° 15' 00". A single fixed white light—two-thirds of the horizon illuminated, and seen in fair weather 16½ nautical or 19½ statute miles. Building a circular stone tower, faced externally with fire brick of a light colour.

Signals will be given at or near each of the above 4 light houses by means of an air or fog whistle, sounded at short intervals during foggy weather and snow storms, or by a nine-pounder gun, fired every hour, in case of the whistle being out of order.

No letters received on board the Steamer, except by the Officer in charge of the Mails, who alone is authorized to receive them. The Mail Steamers leave Boston for Halifax and Liverpool, G. B., every alternate *Wednesday*, arrive at Halifax *Thursday* evening or very early on Friday morning, and leave immediately after receiving the Mails. Letters to and from the United Kingdom 12½ cents per ¼ oz. Newspapers 2 cents. All letters and newspapers *must be pre-paid by Stamps*. Letters un-

paid will be forwarded to the writers, with a fine of 7½d. each. Letters to the Imperial Public Departments are exempt from the regulation requiring pre-payment. Registered Letters 12½ cents; to Australia, &c., Foreign Countries, and other places, passing through the United Kingdom, 25 cents—in addition to the postage.

The Postage on Books, Pamphlets, Maps, Printed or Lithographed Letters, &c., from the United Kingdom to Nova Scotia and *vice-versa*, is for a packet not exceeding 4 oz., 7 cents; above 4 oz. and not exceeding ½ lb., 12½ cents; and so on, increasing 12½ cents for every additional ½ lb., or fraction of a ½ lb. No package must exceed 2 feet in length, width, or depth. The postage must be *prepaid* by stamps.

Closed Mails for the United Kingdom *via* United States are made up to meet the Steamers leaving New York for Liverpool. Letters to be specially addressed "*via New York.*" Letters 20 cents, newspapers 2 cents, must be *prepaid* by stamps.

A Mail for the United Kingdom, during the summer season, is made up to go by the Canadian Ocean Mail Ships *via* Picton, closing at 8 o'clock, P. M. on the Saturday following the despatch of Cunard Steamers. Postage ½ oz., 12½ cents; newspapers 2 cents. Books may also be sent by this route at the ordinary packet book rate. The postage in all cases must be prepaid by stamps. All letters which may be in the Office when these mails are made up will be despatched by this channel, unless specially directed otherwise. A *Provincial* Mail for Canada is also made up at the same time. Postage 12½ cents the ½ oz.

The Mails for the United States by Mail Steamers to Boston are made up on *Tuesday evening* of the week the Steamer from Liverpool is due, at 8 o'clock. Should the Steamer not arrive by 6 o'clock the following morning, *Supplementary Mails* will be made up. Should the Steamer arrive *previous* to Tuesday evening, the Mails will then close *immediately* upon her arrival. Letters 9 cents; Newspapers 2 cents.

Closed Mails for Canada are made up and forwarded at the same time. Letters to be specially addressed "*Closed Mail for Canada.*" Letters 12½ cents—*pre-payment optional*.

The Mails for Bermuda and the West Indies are made up *finally* on the *Thursday evening* of the week the Steamer is due from Boston, at 8 o'clock. Letters 13 cents; Newspapers 2 cents. Letters are forwarded *via* Bermuda, for Chagres, the Pacific, Chili and Peru; Postage 1s. 8d., 3d. additional when posted in the interior; papers 2½d; and for Cuba, Honduras, Laguyra, Mexico, Venezuela, and the British and Foreign West India Islands. Postage 9 cents, 5 cents additional when posted in the interior. Newspapers 2 cents—to be *prepaid* by stamps.

The Mails for Newfoundland are made up *once a month* in December, January, February and March; and *fortnightly* in the other months, including Cape Breton, closing *finally* on the *Thursday evening* of the week the Mail Steamer is due from Boston. Letters 9 cents—when posted in the interior 5 cents additional. Newspapers 2 cents—to be *prepaid* by stamp.

The Mails for St. Pierre and Miquelon are forwarded to Sydney, C. B. during the Summer months, from whence they are despatched by French Packet—and in the Winter months direct from Halifax. Letters 9 cents; when posted in the interior 5 cents additional. Newspapers 2 cents; to be prepaid by stamps.

Printed Circulars, Prices Current, or other printed matter of a like description, when unconnected with any manuscript or written communication whatever, passing between any Office in Nova Scotia and any place in British North America, or the United States, will be 2 cents per oz. or fraction of an oz.

Pamphlets, Magazines, Periodicals or Books, passing as above, are charged 1 cent per oz. each, up to 48 ounces.

Parliamentary Papers, *free*, throughout Nova Scotia. If by Packet, 2 cents for every 4 ounces.

British re-prints of copyright Works from the United States, by *land mail* or *Steamer*, are charged letter postage.

Letters posted in any town in Nova Scotia for delivery in the same town, are charged 2 cents.

☞ All letters posted in Nova Scotia, addressed to any place in the Province, the other B. N. American provinces, and the United States, as well as to the United Kingdom, must now be prepaid by stamp, or otherwise they will be charged *double postage*.

No person is obliged to send pamphlets, printed books, or newspapers, by the Mail.

PARCEL POST.

The charge for parcels, by mail, *which must be pre-paid by stamp*, sent through a Post or Way Office to any part of Nova Scotia, is for a parcel not weighing more than 1 lb., 25 cents; more than 1 lb. and not exceeding 2 lbs., 50 cents; more than 2 lbs. and not exceeding 3 lbs., (beyond which weight they cannot be sent, nor should the size exceed one foot in length or breadth, or 6 inches in thickness,) 75 cents. The parcel may be registered on payment (also by stamp), of a fee of 10 cents, in addition to the above rates.

POST OFFICE MONEY ORDERS are given for any amount, but no one order to exceed \$20. Charge 10 cents for each order, to be paid by the applicant for the order. The following Offices only issue and pay Money Orders. Amherst, Antigonish, Annapolis, Arichat, Baddeck, Digby, Guysborough, Halifax, Kentville, Lunenburg, Liverpool, Pictou, Port Hood, Shelburne, Sydney, Truro, Windsor and Yarmouth.

☞ When the Mails arrive from Liverpool, G. B., before 9 P. M., they are delivered the same evening. After that hour, at 7 the next morning.

☞ All other Mails arriving before 7 P. M., are delivered the same evening. After that hour and before 8, at 6 o'clock; and if after 8, at 7 o'clock the following morning.

☞ Masters of Vessels arriving in the Province are entitled to for each letter they may deliver to the Postmaster at the first Office they touch or arrive at, or with which they may communicate when inward bound, 3 cents.

The Postmaster General has the exclusive privilege of conveying letters within the Province. Persons receiving and conveying letters incur a penalty of \$1, for every letter so conveyed, except—1. Letters sent to be mailed in the nearest Post or Way Office. 2. Letters to a place out of the Province, and sent by sea, and by a private vessel, not being a

Packet. 3. Letters sent by a Messenger purposely, on the private affairs of the sender or receiver. 4. Letters lawful: brought into the Province and immediately posted in the nearest Office. 5. Letters of Merchants, Ship Owners, or of cargo sent by Merchant vessels, and delivered to the party to whom addressed without charge or fee.

The Postmaster General is not liable for the loss of any letter or packet, unless such loss should arise from his own default.




