At a meeting of the Officers and Committee of the Cathedral League held at the home of the Treasurer of the League Mrs. Howard, on Nov. 23rd, it was decided to hold a large At Home after the New Year. The hearty co-operation of all members is asked in order to make this a success.

The financial statement was very encouraging, the League having raised the sum of \$2,236.76, for the Women's Pier, which sum it is hoped will be largely increased by Easter.

The total amount of Pier money now in hand is \$3,427.50.

Mrs. Macnab, with her most enjoyable Kettle-drum, has opened the season for League entertainments, and it is expected that others will follow, as Teas, Musicals, etc., bring the people together socially, as well as enabling the members to raise their obligations.
