DELTA MUNICIPALITY. Delta Municipal Revenue By-Law, 1895.

Whereas it is expedient to make provision for the collection of a municipal revenue in the Corporation of Delta for 1885;

Be it therefore enacted by the Reeve and Council of the Corporation of Delta as follows: From and after the passing of this By-law the general municipal revenue of the Corporation of Delta shall be raised, levied and collected for the use of the corporation from such sources as are hereinafter provided.

1. There shall be raised, levied and collected for the year 1895 upon all real estate menioned in the Assessment roll for the time being in force in the municipality an equal tax of six (6) mills in the dollar in the amount assessed, as it shall appear in the said assessment roll.

2. There shall be raised, levied and collected for the year 1895 upon all improvements upon real property as mentioned in the assessment roll of the time being in force in the municipality an equal rate of five (6) mills in the dollar on the sasessment roll.

3. The aforesaid taxes shall be due and payable by the person or persons llable for the first (1st) day of August, 1895.

The aforesaid taxes aff paid on or before the first (1st) day of December, 1895, the person or persons paying the same shall be entitled to a rebate of one-sixth (1-6) of the amount thereof.

This by-law may be cited for all purposes as the Delta Municipal Revenue by-law, 1895.



# ABSOLUTELY PURE

STEAMSHIP CASUALTIES.

San Francisco, Aug. 31.—Australian advices brought by the ss. Monowaii are to the effect that on the 8th inst. the steamer Gattherthun struck on Seal Rocks, off Sydney, at 2:30 a. m., and sank in 15 minutes. Boats which landed at Foster contained 16 of the crew, three Chinese and four white men, among whom was Capt. Frazier, the pilot. The other boats containing the captain of the steamer and other officers are missing. The steamer had 81 on board , all told. Accounts are conflicting as to the number saved which is variously stated at 22 or 25, but the latter is certainly the limit. There was 10,800 pounds in specie on board, 5,000 pounds shipped to Adelaide and the remainder belonged to Chinese passengers. STEAMSHIP CASUALTIES.

DISASTROUS ADMINISTRATION. Montreal, Aug. 30.—The public accounts of the Province for the fiscal year 1894-5 will not be published till the session of the Legislature opens. It is learned from a good source, however, that they will show a larger deficit than ever. In 1893-4 Taillen's disastrous administration showed a deficit of \$230,000. This year it will be \$330,000. Diminished revenue and largely increased expenditure are the cause.

RECORDS LOWERED.

Kansas City, Mo., Aug. 31.—Three thousand people witnessed the L. A. W. races at Fairmont Park yesterday. The feature was the breaking of the mile record for standing start on the quartermile track L. D. Cabanne, of St. Louis paced by a tandem, made the distance in 2:02 2-5. The previous record, 2:03, was held by Tyler. In the mile, open, class B, Titus broke the track record of 2:15, goin in 2:10.

FOURTEEN PERISHED.

Central City, Colo., Aug. 30.—Twentynine men were working in Sleepy Hollow and the Americus mines when last
night's disaster occurred. All who escaped were engaged at points above the
line of break. All 14 below at the time
were almost instantly submerged and
their bodies must lie there for weeks.

ON HER TRIAL.

Poughkeepsie, N. Y., Aug. 30.—Miss Amelia E.
