THE MASON'S STRIKE.

This strike, which so far has cost the men about two hundred thousand dollars, seems likely to end in their favour, a large number of the men on strike having been taken on by the masters at the increased wages demanded, viz., 10d. an hour.

PERMITS OF IMPORTATION.

At a recent meeting at Liverpool, Mr. William Hainthorn, M.P., one of the most prominent and respected social and temperance reformers of the day, took part in a discussion on importation, and remarked that he was convinced that the mere arbitrary limitation of the number of public-houses had the effect of converting the old-fashioned and quiet taverns into gin palaces, and thus increasing the temptations to drunkenness. THE DETECTIVE POLICE COMMISSION.

IMPORTANT TRAFFIC UNION CASE.

An important judgment has been given in the Glasgow Sheriff Court in a case arising out of a traffic union. An action was brought by Messrs. Cooper & Sons against the Secretary of the Glasgow Flint Cutters' Union, claiming damages on account of the union's refusal to allow the plaintiff to work on the premises. The union combined with other persons to intimidate and send away from the plaintiff's employees workmen who were engaged by the plaintiff to replace the men on strike. The Sheriff found that one of the objects of the Association was to close the plaintiff's works; that that purpose was an unlawful one; that every member of the Society was responsible for its action in carrying the purpose out; and that the defendant was therefore liable for the damage sustained in this instance, which his Lordship assessed at £50.
