LANGEVIN'S REPORT ON ITS CEPTATE AND CHARACTERISTICS.

Hon. Mr. Langevin has submitted a report of his visit to British Columbia, whither he had gone at the express desire of the Privy Comeil, with a view of acquiring a knowledge of the new Trovince in relation to the Pacific R. R. and its wosterly terminus, and study the requirement of that country. The report opens with an elaborate description of the climate and territorial characteristics of British Columbia, its advantages for settlements, extent of its forest land and timber which are described as being very rich. The report then goes on to give a description of autorious regions, and the cause of their tardy developement. The first requisite in that region, he says, is a goological survey. That survey, is now being made, and gives promise of the appiest results. In the meantime, it is established that from the United States frontier to the 53rd degree north latitude, and from the width of from 100 to 200 miles, gold is found nearly everywhere, exports in gold dust in 1899 being nearly three million and a half dollars. The report, which is interesting all through, gives valuable information on almost every subject in connection with that country.
