any regular diplomatic representative in that quarter and may not deem it advisable to send one thither for the special purpose mentioned by her Britannic Majesty's Government. No objection, how-ever, was entertained to directing, as would be done by the Consul of the United States at Zanzibar, to intimate to the sovereign of that country that we would be glad to see that provision of the Barley, perh treaty between him and Great Britain terminated, which reserved the right of transportation by sea between certain limits of his own territory of domestic slaves, as there was reason to believe that right, reserved under that treaty, was

of Her Majesty.

Some action to that end should be adopted by Spain, as the ceaseless watchfulness on the part of our Gov-ernment has been carried to the verge of exhausted patience.
